Safety Reminder: Snow Removal

Help keep yourself and others safe during snowy weather by taking the time to remove snow and ice. Residents and businesses are reminded to ease the impact of snowstorms by keeping public sidewalks free of snow and ice as required by City "Snow Removal" Ordinance 12.20.

Diligence in removing snow and ice from sidewalks is an important and appreciated courtesy for your fellow residents as well as contributes to everyone's safety. But remember to take precautions to protect yourself as well. Consider these winter safety tips:

- * Dress in layers that can easily be removed if you get too warm;
- * Stay warm & dry to prevent hypothermia;
- * Keep dry by using waterproof footwear & clothing;
- * Push, rather than lift, snow when possible;
- * Take smaller loads & avoid lifting heavy, wet snow;
- * Take frequent breaks & drink water to keep hydrated.

REMINDER: Hwy 85 Reconstruction Update

In late October and early November the Department of Transportation (DOT) and the City of Deadwood plan to start the excavation phase of the *Deadwood Hwy 85 Reconstruction Project*. Because of the safety concerns regarding the rock excavation sites near **Southside Auto & Twin City Hardware**, the public is asked to take precautions when driving through the construction zones. Once excavation work begins, please watch for the temporary signals or flaggers as traffic delays will occur.

When asked about the project, the City of Deadwood's Planning and Zoning Administrator, Bob Nelson Jr. stated, "Remember, this is a good thing. When all is said and done, we will all benefit from the improvements made."

Information will be provided as plans are finalized. Area hotels and employers are asked to inform their staff of any tentative plans that may need to be in place during this time. During blasting Trolley routes will only extend to Sherman Street Parking lot located near the Mickelson Trailhead from 8 AM - 3 PM. Please watch for further information as these plans may be subject to change. 
2nd Annual Community "SING ALONG"

During August and September, the City of Deadwood received four new donations to add into the City's permanent collection. These donations were as follows:

- **Donation 2014.12:** Richard Popp of Chillicothe, Illinois donated twenty-three (23) black and white prints from the 1960s focusing on Lead/Deadwood City Circle Tour, which was part of the Old West Trail system.
- **Donation 2014.13:** Don Toms of Lead, SD donated a copy of the Homestake Veterans Association yearbook. This book contains names and photographs of Homestake employees who worked for HMC for over 20 years.


