Archive Moment

In July, the Deadwood Historic Preservation office sent 1,600 digital photographs to Dr. Margie Akin, an Asian coin expert from Riverside, California. These photographs are detailed images of 168 Asian coins unearthed during the 2001-2004 Deadwood Chinatown archaeological excavations along lower Main Street. Last year, these Chinese coins were sent to the Maryland Archaeological Conservation Laboratory (MAC) in St. Leonard, MD. Conservation Staff at MAC cleaned and stabilized the coins. Upon arrival in California, Dr. Akin briefly informed city staff some of the coins were Vietnamese in origin from the reign of Kang Xi (1662 -1722). This fall, Dr. Akin will perform a detailed examination of the coins to determine age, dynasty, and minting location on coins. Upon completion of the project, a second Historic Preservation Video will be developed on the results of this project. PUBLIC NOTICE: Hwy 85 Reconstruction Progress

For the duration of 75th Sturgis Rally starting July 29-August 9, there will be no active construction unless issues arise due to weather. Also, with exception of August 4, the Hwy 85 Reconstruction weekly public meetings will continue to be held at Deadwood City Hall every Tuesday at 11am unless otherwise noted. Being open to the public, all are welcome and encouraged to attend.

Sturgis Motorcycle Rally

All lanes will be open to unimpeded traffic from **July 29, 2015 to August 9, 2015** for the Sturgis Motorcycle Rally. However, portions of the roadway may be millings instead of pavement.

Crews will resume work on Monday, August 10. For the remainder of August, the project team's goals are to continue installing utilities and paving sections of the road as utilities are completed.

The Harrison St./Hwy 85 intersection continues to be closed to both vehicles/pedestrians. To access Hwy 85/Sherman St, motorists/pedestrians should use Van Buren St. and Cemetery St.

REMINDER TO MOTORISTS: It is a violation to block access to residential/commercial driveways. Flaggers are stationed throughout project to ensure driveway access is maintained during heavy traffic.

Special Note: The Project Team appreciates the Deadwood business owners and residents for their efforts in communicating openly with the team; input from the community has helped resolve traffic issues and mitigated many of the side effects often occurring throughout the reconstruction activities. Thank you for your patience!



Some residents may leave town, others may stick around; nevertheless, motorcyclists are more vulnerable than other drivers, but it's up to everyone to be motorcycle aware on the roads. Let's all join together and follow these tips to keep yourself and others safe:

Driving a vehicle?

- Use Caution when pulling in front of a motorcyclist;
- Back off to allow quick stops due to weather or road debris;
- Double-check those blind spots and use your turn signals.
- Allow motorcycles plenty of lane space.

Driving a motorcycle?

- Dress to be seen and protected;
- Avoid center of lane when traffic is slow;
- Target open spaces and stay out of blind spots;
- NEVER cross over to an off-ramp at the last second.

After several months of discussions, brainstorming and overhauling the Historic Preservation (HP) programs, it is with great excitement and delight by the Historic Preservation Commission to announce the implementation of the new Grant Programs. These programs have been reviewed and adopted to assist necessary projects needed to help preserve and protect Deadwood’s uniquely beautiful historic resources. Whether it is painting, repairing/replacing siding or windows/doors, fixing retaining walls, addressing life safety issues or restoring vacant residential property, check out Deadwood’s new HP Programs below to find one that may suit your needs:
