**RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF APPLICATION TO OCCUPY  
S.D. DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION HIGHWAY RIGHT-OF-WAY  
WITHIN DEADWOOD CORPORATE LIMITS**

**WHEREAS**, CITY is submitting an application to the South Dakota Department of Transportation (SDDOT) for permit to occupy right-of-way for those portions of S.D. Highways 14A and 85 within the corporate limits of CITY. The project will transform the concrete triangular median into a brick bordered median beautification project to provide an esthetic entrance for residents and visitors when entering Deadwood, to change a low visibility median into a high visibility median, and provide additional safety by helping prevent vehicles and motorcycles from crossing the median onto oncoming traffic by dense ground cover; and,

**WHEREAS**, CITY further agrees to indemnify, hold and save harmless the State of South Dakota, its Department of Transportation, its Officers and Employees, from any and all suits, actions or

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claims of any kind or nature brought because of any injuries or damage received or sustained by any person or property on account of the use or occupancy of right-of-way designated in this Resolution;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, that the City of Deadwood hereby supports the submission of the South Dakota Department of Transportation Application for Permit to Occupy Right-of-Way for the purpose described herein.

Commissioner Todd stated due to proximity of fuel tanks to proposed trolley addition, that project will not be moving forward at this time.


ADJOURNMENT

A special meeting scheduled for April 9, 2014 at 4:00 p.m. to canvass the election results was canceled due to lack of quorum.


