Deadwood City Commission - September 17, 2018

I. Disaster Declaration Process / Response & Recovery Procedures

- a. Response & Recovery Use existing plans and resources. Cooperate with surrounding counties to write new Mutual Aid Agreements. We currently have a Lawrence County MOU (Memorandum of Understanding) between all of the LC Fire Departments, EMS, and Cities within Lawrence County and recently Emergency Management helped finalized another MOU between nine western SD Counties also known as the Region IV Mutual Aid Agreement.
- b. SD Office of Emergency Management (OEM) Situation Reporting:

Local Emergency Manager or other designated EM Personnel report using: SD OEM Duty Officer system 24/7. Report situations to be factual and accurate.

Report the following situations to your County EM - some with qualification:

- 1. Natural Hazard/Weather Related Incidents: tornado, flood, severe thunderstorm, earthquake, wind storm, road closure, winter storms, ice storms.
- 2. Hazardous Materials Incidents
- 3. Structure Fires
- 4. Wildland Fire
- 5. Mass Casualty/Fatality Incidents
- 6. Utility Mishaps/Public Infrastructure
- 7. Missing Person Searches
- 8. Aircraft Emergencies/Air Disaster
- 9. Animal Health

Report the following law enforcement situations to your County EM:

- 1. Terrorism / Homeland Security / School Security issues
- 2. Mass Casualty / Fatality Incidents (Also on EM list)
- 3. Civil Disturbance (Riots, Hostage Situations, Organized Protests)
- c. <u>Declaration Process</u> for an Emergency or Disaster Meet in regular or emergency session to discuss how unexpected expenses can be approved and by whom for a pending disaster.

Use your printed test to review as you go through the course to see if you answered the questions correctly. Use your test marked with the correct answers you found while taking the course to help you mark your final test.

THEN hit SUBMIT when you are satisfied with your answers.

If you do not pass the first time you can go back and look up correct answers for each question. Any future attempts at taking the test the questions are not in the same order but they are the same group of questions, just in a different order.

You will need to enter your Student ID (SID) when taking the test, that is why you sign up at the beginning of the course.

Keep this SID for future testing. This is your FEMA Training ID.

SECTION 1. The City of Deadwood created Tax Incremental District Number Ten by Resolution Number 2016-18, on September 21, 2016.

SECTION 2. The City of Deadwood approved the Project Plan for Tax Incremental District (TID) Number Ten by Resolution Number 2016-19, on September 21, 2016.

SECTION 3. The tax incremental base value of property located in Tax Incremental District Number Ten, as recorded by the Lawrence County Director of Equalization, has an aggregate assessed value of \$3,624,510.

SECTION 4. The Developer shall provide documentation of compliance with Chapter 5-18 upon the request of the City. In addition, the developer shall coordinate the following:

- 1. Publication of the Bid Notice and shall provide the City Finance Officer a copy of Affidavit of Publication of this notice;
- 2. The Bid Opening shall occur in City Hall with the City Finance Officer or designated official compiling the Bid Tab.
- 3. The Developer shall provide a copy of Notice of Award and Notice to Proceed to the City Finance Officer;
- 4. The Developer shall provide a copy all contract(s) and change order(s) of all construction activity authorized with the approved Project Plan.

Upon completion of the improvements specified in Section 4, the Developer shall certify to the City Finance Officer that such improvements have been completed and shall certify the amount of money disbursed therefore. It is also specifically agreed that the City has made no representation that the proceeds from such fund shall be sufficient to retire the indebtedness incurred by the Developer under Section 4 hereof. In addition, the Developer specifically agrees to hold the City harmless and indemnify the City regarding any indebtedness incurred herein.

The parties further agree that in addition to provisions of SDCL 11-9-25 defining maximum limits of the duration of positive tax increment payments to the fund created by Section 7 hereof, this Agreement further restricts the life of TID Number Ten to the earlier of the following:

- 1. The retirement of all outstanding authorized TID Number Ten debt, as specified in Section 7 of this Agreement; or
- 2. Payment of the final positive tax increment payment authorized in the Project Plan specified in Section 2 of this Agreement, with such payment defined as a portion of the total amount being assessed in the year 2031, and payable in the second one-half of the year 2032. (17 years)

Further, the parties to this Agreement recognize and acknowledge that projected tax increment revenue payments derived in the Project Plan specified in Section 2 of this Agreement utilized estimated property valuations--based upon project components and cost estimates provided by the Developer for estimating future tax payments based upon the real property tax structure and taxation rates currently existing in Lawrence County and the City of Deadwood. However, both parties acknowledge that there can be no certainty that future tax rates will be at or above the rates utilized in the Project Plan.

SECTION 11. If one or more provisions of this Agreement shall be invalid, illegal or unenforceable in any respect, it shall be given effect to the extent permitted by applicable law, and such invalidity, illegality or unenforceability shall not affect the validity of the other provisions of this Agreement.

SECTION 12. This document, along with the Project Plan for Tax Incremental District Number Ten, constitutes the entire agreement between the parties. No other promises or considerations form a part of this Agreement. All prior discussions and negotiations are merged into these documents or intentionally omitted. In the event of a conflict between the Project Plan and this Agreement, this Agreement shall be controlling.

SECTION 13. This Agreement shall be construed and the parties' actions governed by the laws of the State of South Dakota. Any dispute arising out of or related to this Agreement shall be litigated in the Seventh Judicial Circuit Court for the State of South Dakota, located in Deadwood, Lawrence County, South Dakota.

FIRST AMENDMENT TO ASSIGNMENT AND PLEDGE AGREEMENT (CADILLAC JACK'S EXPANSION, TRU HOTEL BY HILTON)

This First Amendment to Assignment and Pledge Agreement ("Amendment") is entered into October //, 2017, by and between Optima, LLC, a South Dakota limited liability company ("Optima"), with an address of 2675 Cavern Road, Rapid City, South Dakota 57702-4744 and First Interstate Bank ("Lender"), with an address of 152 Sherman Street, Post Office Box 447, Deadwood, South Dakota 57732-0447.

RECITALS

- A. The City of Deadwood created Deadwood Tax Incremental District No. 10 ("TID 10") by Resolution Number 2016-18 on September 21, 2016.
- B. The City of Deadwood approved the Project Plan for TID 10 by Resolution Number 2016-19 on September 21, 2016.
- C. Optima and the City of Deadwood (the "City") are parties to a Contract for Private Development dated September 21, 2016 (the "Development Agreement") in which the City agreed to reimburse Optima for eligible project costs not to exceed \$2,000,000. The funds for the reimbursements to be made to Optima will originate from Tax Increment Revenues (as defined in the Development Agreement).
- D. Lender and Optima are parties to a Business Loan Agreement dated December 29, 2016 (as may be amended, supplemented or modified), pursuant to which Lender made a loan to Optima in the original principal amount of \$2,000,000 to finance a portion of the development costs for the expansion of Cadillac Jack's Gaming Resort and construction of a Tru Hotel by Hilton.
- E. As a condition to providing the loan to Optima, Lender required that Optima assign, transfer and set over to Lender all right, title and interest of Optima in, to and under the Development Agreement, including without limitation, all rights to reimbursement or payment for eligible project costs to which Optima is entitled from the tax increment revenues (collectively referred to herein as the "TID 10 Reimbursements").
- F. Optima and Lender entered into an Assignment and Pledge Agreement dated December 26, 2016 (the "Assignment") pursuant to which Optima assigned its right to reimbursement and payment under the Development Agreement as security for the project financing. The City consented to the assignment and agreed to remit TID 10 Reimbursements directly to Lender.
- G. At a regular meeting of the Deadwood City Commission held on August 7, 2017, the City Commission approved Amendment #1 to the Development Agreement ("Amendment #1"). Amendment #1 increased the maximum amount of project costs which are eligible for reimbursement from \$2,000,000 to \$2,600,000.

H. Lender agreed to provide an additional \$600,000 in project financing to Optima pursuant to a Change in Terms Agreement dated September 15, 2017. The additional financing was conditioned on Optima assigning its right to reimbursement or payment under Amendment #1 to Lender.

NOW, THEREFORE, for good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are acknowledged, the parties agree as follows:

- 1. Each reference in the Assignment to the "Development Agreement" is amended to refer to the Development Agreement as modified by Amendment #1 and as may be further amended, supplemented or modified by the parties in the future).
- 2. This Amendment will not constitute a novation of the Assignment. Except as modified in this Amendment, all of the terms and conditions of the Assignment will remain in full force and effect.

AGREEMENT FOR MAIN STREET MASTER PLAN (PHASE 1) SERVICES FOR DEADWOOD, SOUTH DAKOTA

This agreement is entered into the 1st day of October 2018 ("effective date") by and between the City of Deadwood, South Dakota, hereinafter referred to as the "City" and Winter & Company, hereinafter referred to as "Consultant" as follows:

1.0 RECITALS AND PURPOSE

- 1.1 The City desires to engage the Consultant to assist in crafting a Master Plan for the Deadwood Main Street.
- 1.2 The Consultant represents that it has the special expertise and background necessary to provide the City with these services.

2.0 SCOPE OF SERVICES

The Consultant agrees to provide the City with the specific professional services as set forth in the Consultant's scope of services attached hereto as Exhibit A.

3.0 COMPENSATION

3.1 The City shall pay the Consultant for services under this agreement a total contract lump sum amount of \$55,000.00. Such fee shall be inclusive of all costs of whatsoever nature associated with the Consultant's efforts, including but not limited to salaries, benefits, overhead, administration, and profits. Reimbursable expenses for travel and technical costs are included in the lump sum budget.

Consultant will not exceed the lump sum amount of \$55,000.00 for professional fees and reimbursable expenses. The scope of services and payment for the services and expenses shall only be changed by a properly authorized amendment to this Agreement. No City employee has the authority to bind the City with regard to any payment for any services, which exceeds the amount payable under the terms of this Agreement.

3.2 The Consultant shall submit a detailed invoice to the City indicating the services performed and expenditures incurred for the specified time period. The City shall pay the invoice within thirty (30) days of receipt provided such amounts are not in dispute or the subject of disputes.

4.0 PROJECT REPRESENTATION

4.1 The City designates Kevin Kuchenbecker as the responsible City staff member to provide direction to the Consultant during the conduct of the project. The Consultant shall comply with the directions given by Kevin Kuchenbecker.

4.2 The Consultant designates Noré Winter as the Principal-in-Charge. The City may rely upon the guidance, opinions, and recommendations provided by the Consultant and its representatives.

5.0 TERM

The Consultant's services under this Agreement shall commence upon execution of this Agreement by the City and the Consultant. Consultant shall endeavor to complete the project in 6 months, from authorization to proceed, as outlined in Exhibit A.

6.0 INSURANCE

- 6.1 The Consultant shall procure and maintain the minimum insurance coverages listed below. All coverages shall be continuously maintained to cover all liability, claims, demands, and other obligations assumed by the Consultant pursuant to this Agreement. In the case of any claims-made policy, the necessary retroactive dates and extended reporting periods shall be procured by the Consultant to maintain such continuous coverage.
 - 6.1.1 Evidence of Workers' Compensation insurance or qualified self-insured status shall be provided, if requested.
 - 6.1.2 General Liability insurance with bodily injury and property damage each occurrence ONE MILLION DOLLARS (\$1,000,000) and general aggregate TWO MILLION DOLLARS (\$2,000,000).
 - 6.1.3 Comprehensive Automobile Liability insurance with maximum combined single limits for bodily injury and property damage of not more than ONE MILLION DOLLARS (\$1,000,000) in any one occurrence with respect to each of Consultant's owned, hired or non-owned vehicles assigned to or used in performance of the services.
 - 6.1.4 Professional liability insurance in the amount of ONE MILLION DOLLARS (\$1,000,000) against claims arising out of work provided for in this agreement.

7.0 INDEMNIFICATION

The Consultant agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the City and its elected and appointed officials, agents and employees, from and against liability, claims, demands, and expenses, including court costs and reasonable attorney fees, on account of any injury, loss, or damage, which arise out of or are in any manner connected with the services to be performed by Consultant, its officers and employees, under this contract. The obligations of this Section 7 shall not extend to any injury, loss, or damage, which is caused solely by the act, omission, or other fault of the City.

8.0 QUALITY OF WORK

Consultant's professional services shall be in accordance with the prevailing standard of practice normally exercised in the performance of professional services of a similar nature in the United States.

9.0 WORK PRODUCT/CONFIDENTIALITY

It is agreed that any and all information disclosed to the Consultant by the City in connection with this Agreement, as well as any ideas, concepts, know-how, or techniques developed for the City in the performance of this Agreement, will be held confidential by the Consultant and will not be disclosed to any other party without the express consent of the City.

10.0 INDEPENDENT CONSULTANT

Consultant and any persons employed by Consultant for the performance of work hereunder shall be independent contractors and not agents of the City. Any provisions in this Agreement that may appear to give the City the right to direct Consultant as to details of doing work or to exercise a measure of control over the work mean that Consultant shall follow the direction of the City as to end results of the work only. As an independent contractor, Consultant, its officers and employees, are not entitled to workers' compensation benefits except as may be provided by the Consultant nor to unemployment insurance benefits unless the independent contractor or some other entity provides unemployment compensation coverage. The Consultant is obligated to pay all federal and state income tax on any monies earned or paid pursuant to this contract relationship.

11.0 DEFAULT

Each and every term and condition hereof shall be deemed to be a material element of this Agreement. In the event either party should fail or refuse to perform according to the terms of this Agreement, such party may be declared in default.

12.0 TERMINATION

- 12.1 This Agreement may be terminated by either party for material breach or default of this Agreement by the other party, not caused by any action or omission of the terminating party. Terminating party will give the other party written notice at least fifteen (15) days in advance of the termination date.
- 12.2 In addition to the foregoing, this Agreement may be terminated by the City for its convenience and without cause of any nature by giving written notice to the Consultant at least seven (7) days in advance of the termination date. In the event of such termination, the Consultant will be paid for the reasonable value of the services rendered

to the date of termination, not to exceed the total amount of the Fee as set forth in Section 3.0 of this Agreement, and upon such payment, all obligations of the City to the Consultant under this Agreement will cease. Termination pursuant to this Subsection shall not prevent either party from exercising any other legal remedies, which may be available to it.

13.0 INSPECTION

The City and its duly authorized representatives shall have access to any books, documents, papers, and records of the Consultant that are related to this Agreement for the purpose of making audit, examination, excerpts and transcriptions.

14.0 PUBLICATION REPRODUCTION AND USE OF MATERIAL

The Consultant may include copyrighted text and illustrations, produced in work prior to the contract with the City, which the Consultant relies upon to provide a custom-tailored product at the lowest possible price. Therefore, it is agreed that all original text and drawings produced by the Consultant prior to this contract, shall be the property of the Consultant.

The City, in its sole discretion, may use elements of all reports and drawings that are produced for the City in the course of this project in additional documents that it may choose to develop and make available for use within the community, state or nation, as long as such documents are for use of furthering the purpose and understanding of the original document. This use will require no additional compensation to the Consultant.

15.0 ENFORCEMENT

The laws of the State of South Dakota shall govern the formation, interpretation, and performance of this Agreement. No lawsuit pertaining to any matter under or growing out of this Agreement shall be instituted in any state other than South Dakota.

16.0 COMPLIANCE WITH LAW

Consultant shall be solely responsible for compliance with all applicable federal, state, and local laws, including the ordinances, resolutions, rules and regulations of the City for payment of all applicable taxes, and obtaining and keeping in force all applicable permits and approvals.

17.0 NON-DISCRIMINATION

The Consultant shall administer all functions without discrimination because of race, creed, sex, national origin, age, economic status, sexual orientation, gender identify or gender expression.

18.0 INTEGRATION AND AMENDMENT

Any changes to the terms and conditions as outlined herein must be mutually agreed upon by and between the parties and shall be incorporated in written amendments hereto, executed with the same formalities as this Agreement. No amendment or modification of this Agreement shall be effective until executed by the parties.

19.0 SEVERABILITY

If any provision of this Agreement is found to be illegal or unenforceable, then such provision shall be deemed stricken and the remaining provisions shall remain in full force and effect.

20.0 ASSIGNMENT

This Agreement shall be binding upon each of the parties, their successors, executors, administrators and assigns. The Consultant shall not assign, sublet, contract, or otherwise transfer its interest, in whole or in part, in this Agreement without the express written consent of the City. None of the work or services covered by this Agreement shall be subcontracted without the prior written approval of City.




Demolition Site Plan





ORDINANCE #1280 AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 8.08.010 FIREWORKS AND BURNING

BE IT ORDAINED by the Deadwood City Commission of the City of Deadwood, that Chapter 8.08.010 be amended to read as follows:

No person may sell, cause to be sold, discharge or cause to be discharged any pyrotechnics of any description whatever within the city. However, a person or organization may present a public display of fireworks provided the individual or organization has first **completed City application** and obtained the permission of the city commission. Nothing in this chapter shall be construed as applying to toy paper caps containing not more than twenty-five hundredths of a grain of explosive composition per cap, nor shall it apply to the sale or use of signals necessary for the safe operation of public or private transportation, nor does this apply to the sale or use of blank cartridges for ceremonial, theatrical or athletic events.



FINDINGS OF FACT AND CONCLUSIONS

- 1. Staff provided public notice identifying the applicant, describing the project and its location, and giving the scheduled date of the public hearing in accordance with Section 17.76.020. Notice was placed in the designated newspaper of the City of Deadwood, ten (10) days in advance of the hearing as required by Section 17.76.060.J
- 2. An official sign was posted on the property for which the Conditional Use Permit was filed as required by Section 17.76.060.J
- 3. Property owners within three hundred (300) feet of the boundaries of the subject land were notified by first class mail as required by Section 17.76.060.J. No inquiries or opposition were voiced in regards to this request.
- 4. All application requirements were met.
- 5. The property is located within an area close to parking lots, commercial businesses, and hotels. There is a variety of commercial use in the vicinity. The land is located in a mixed use commercial district and is classified as high density residential on the adopted Land Use Map in the Deadwood Comprehensive Plan.

- 6. The subject area is zoned C1 Commercial District. The area is characterized by mixed commercial uses.
- 7. The use, as proposed may or may not result in a substantial or undue adverse effect on adjacent property or the character of the neighborhood and the use may not alter the character of the area therefore requiring a six month review of the CUP.
- 8. The granting of the conditional use permit would not increase the proliferation of non-conforming uses. The use is expressly allowed in the C1 Commercial District under certain conditions and the conditions were met.
- 9. Based on these findings, the Deadwood Planning and Zoning Commission and the Deadwood Board of Adjustment approved the request for a Tattoo Business at 79 Sherman Street, Deadwood, South Dakota.

Construction Manager at Risk

After reviewing the five proposals from the firms seeking the Construction Manager at Risk (CMAR) project the planning, design and management of the construction of the public gathering space, the selection committee narrowed the proposals down to three firms for interviews.

It is the committee's recommendation to select Scull Construction Service, Inc. to enter into negations as the CMAR firm of record for public gathering space. On their team are also Chamberlain Architects and Wyss Associates, Inc. along with other subfirms.

The first step Scull Construction Service, Inc. will take is to define the vision, mission and goals of the public gathering space project and proceed with schematic design, design development and budget development. The Scull Construction team will also coordinate and work with the Winter & Company team to ensure both the public gathering space and the Main Street Master Plan projects work well together.

The committee is recommending the City Commission direct City staff to negotiate a contract with Scull Construction Service, Inc. in an amount up to \$300,000 to prepare the final plans and ready the project up to the construction phase of a public gathering space. This method was at the recommendation and support of the Governor Dennis Daugaard. The funding will be from the already approved and committed funding from the State of South Dakota's GOED funds.

This time line and phase of the project will provide the City with the opportunity to further engage the possibility of additional financial support from the State of South Dakota and prepare for future bonding needs.

Recommended Motion: Move to approve entering into negotiations with Scull Construction Service, Inc. in an amount not to exceed the State's support to complete the final plans and prepare to move into the construction phase of a public gathering space.




