





CITY OF DEADWOOD AND SUPER G INVESTMENT CORPORATION LAND EXCHANGE AGREEMENT

- 1. PARTIES: The parties to this Land Exchange Agreement ("Agreement") are CITY OF DEADWOOD, a South Dakota municipality which address is 102 Sherman Street, Deadwood, SD 57732 ("City"), and SUPER G INVESTMENT CORPORATION, whose address is 708 Main Street, Deadwood, SD 57732 (hereinafter "Super G").
- 2. <u>PURPOSE</u>: The purpose of this agreement is to set forth the terms and conditions under which the parties agree to an exchange with each other certain interests in the real property described in Paragraph 3 of this Agreement, in the manner stated herein. The exchange was approved by the Deadwood City Commission on July 2, 2018.

3. PROPERTY:

A. The South Dakota real property owned by the City which is subject to the terms and conditions of this Agreement is legally described below:

Lot A of Block 24 and 27' Public Access and Utility Easement, Original Townsite of Deadwood, Lawrence County, South Dakota

B. The South Dakota real property owned by Super G which is subject to the terms and conditions of this Agreement is legally described below:

Lot 4A, Block 20, Formerly Lot 4 and a Portion of Lot A, Block 20, all Located in the SE 1/4 of Section 22, T5N, R3E, B.H.M. and Lot 3, Block 20, City of Deadwood, Lawrence County, South Dakota

Super G shall be permitted to re-plat the property set forth in this paragraph to remove a portion of the property near Whitewood Creek.

- **4.** <u>CONTINGENCIES:</u> The exchange of land between the City and Super G is contingent upon the following:
 - A. The exchange is contingent upon the property being conveyed to City being developed as a public recreation space.
 - B. The exchange is contingent upon the raising of Two Million and 00/100 Dollars (\$2,000,000.00) in matching funds other than additional City Funds. The exchange shall occur after October 1, 2018.

- C. Super G shall honor the existing lease between the City of Deadwood and the Lead/Deadwood School District attached hereto as **Exhibit A**.
- D.E. Super G shall have thirty (30) days after the date of closing to remove all personal property from property described in section 3(B) above.
- F. Super G shall be permitted to park at the property location described in section 3(A) above immediately following closing.

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- 5. <u>CONSIDERATION AND EXCHANGE</u>: After the contingencies set forth in paragraph 4 are met, in consideration of the mutual promises and obligations herein contained, the parties agree as follows:
 - A. The City shall execute and deliver a Deed conveying to Super G, all of their interest in the property described in paragraph 3A above, subject only to the easements, covenants, rights-of-way, restrictions and reservations of record.
 - B. Super G shall execute and deliver a Warranty Deed conveying to the City, all of its interest in the property described in paragraph 3B above, subject only to the easements, covenants, rights-of-way, restrictions and reservations of record.
 - C. The parties agree that the no real property exchanged is of equal value and that no monies will be are exchanged. Because the value of the property owned by Super G set forth in paragraph 3(B) exceeds the value of the City property set forth in paragraph 3(A), the excess value of the exchanged properties in the amount of \$333,000.00 shall be considered a donation by Super G to the City.

There are no items of personal property in this exchange.

- 6. TITLE: The parties warrant and represent to each other, both now and at the time of Closing, that they have good and merchantable title to the property described herein, free and clear of all liens, mortgages, and encumbrances.
- 7. <u>TITLE INSURANCE</u>: Super G agrees to deliver to City a title insurance policy showing good and merchantable title to the real property hereinbefore described. City shall have 30 days in which to object to the title commitment.

City agrees to deliver to Super G a title insurance policy showing good and merchantable title to the real property hereinbefore described. Super G shall have 30 days in which to object to the title commitment.

- 8. <u>CLOSING</u>: Closing shall take place at Lawrence County Title as soon as possible after the contingencies set forth in paragraph 4 are met as the parties agree in writing. At closing, the parties shall:
 - A. Execute and deliver the Warranty Deeds as required herein and in such form as is necessary to convey the interests in the property in accordance with the requirements of this Agreement; and
 - B. Execute any necessary closing documents.
- 9. REAL PROPERTY TAXES: The parties agree that all taxes for property described in paragraph 3 A for 2017 payable in 2018 shall be the responsibility of City and all taxes for 2018, payable in 2019, shall be prorated to the date of sale. Further, tThe parties agree that all taxes for property described in paragraph 3B for 2017 payable in 2018 shall be the responsibility of Super G and all taxes for 2018 payable in 2019 shall be prorated to the date of sale.
- 10. <u>COSTS</u>: The following costs shall be paid at Closing:
 - (1) The City shall pay for deed preparation for both parties.
 - (2) The parties shall each pay the recording fees for their respective conveyances
 - (3) Attorney's fees shall be paid by the party incurring them.
 - (4) The parties shall each pay any applicable transfer fees.
- 11. <u>AS IS</u>: The parties agree they are accepting the exchanged real property in its existing condition. The parties further agree that no representations or warranties have been made other than those contained in this Agreement.
- 12. <u>DEFAULT:</u> The parties agree that if either party defaults under the terms and conditions of this Agreement, the breached party shall have all remedies available to them under the laws of the state of South Dakota including the right to specific performance and reasonable attorney fees and costs for the prevailing party.
- 13. <u>TIME OF THE ESSENCE</u>: The parties agree that time is of the essence in this Agreement.
- 14. <u>ENTIRETY:</u> The parties agree that this writing constitutes the entire agreement between them regarding the exchange of interests in the real property described herein, and that there are no other oral agreements or other agreements or understandings of any kind or character except those contained herein.
- 15. <u>BINDING EFFECT</u>: This Agreement shall extend to and be binding upon the heirs, administrators, executors, successors, and assigns of the parties hereto.

- 16. <u>APPLICABLE LAW</u>: This Agreement shall be governed by, construed, and enforced in accordance with the laws of Lawrence County, state of South Dakota.
- 17. <u>COUNSEL</u>: The parties acknowledge and represent that the Attorney for the City prepared this Agreement on behalf of and in the course of its representation of the City of Deadwood. Both parties participated in the drafting of this Agreement and the language herein shall not be construed in favor of either party.

Parking Agreement

THIS AGREEMENT effective the 5th day of 10000, 2018, by and between the Lead-Deadwood School District #40-1, hereinafter referred to as the SCHOOL and the City of Deadwood, hereinafter referred to as the CITY.

WHEREAS the SCHOOL and the CITY are desirous of entering into an agreement where the SCHOOL shall be permitted the exclusive use of parking spaces located in the Pavilion Parking Lot at 767 Main Street, Deadwood, SD 57732 owned by the CITY, now therefore, it is mutually understood by and between parties hereto as follows:

SECTION 1

The CITY agrees to permit the SCHOOL the exclusive use of 50 parking spaces during the hours of 7:00 am until 5:00 pm on student contact days and staff in-service days; the exclusive use commences two days before the start of the school year and ends two days after the last day of the school year.

SECTION 2

The CITY agrees to maintain the Pavilion Parking Lot in a safe and usable condition. It is agreed between the parties that in the event the complex should become unsafe, inaccessible, unusable, or inoperable, through no fault of the CITY, the CITY will not be in breach. If vehicles, trailers, trucks, or busses occupy the exclusive parking spaces, the CITY shall coordinate removal of the vehicles.

SECTION 3

The SCHOOL agrees to indemnify and hold the CITY harmless from all liabilities, claims, demands, actions or causes of action in any way arising out of the SCHOOL'S use of Pavilion Parking Lot. The SCHOOL agrees to list the CITY as an additional insured party with the SCHOOL'S insurance carrier. The SCHOOL also agrees to provide the CITY with a certificate of said insurance showing the CITY as additional insured in the amount not less than one million dollars (\$1,000,000). This certificate shall be provided to the CITY before the SCHOOL'S use shall commence.

SECTION 5

The SCHOOL agrees to pay the CITY a one-time fee of \$50,000 no later than August 1, 2018 to help with the razing of the Pavilion and the construction of a parking lot in exchange for exclusive use of said parking spaces. The CITY agrees that there will be no compensation owed for the exclusive parking for the SCHOOL for a period of twenty years, at which time the CITY and the SCHOOL may renegotiate the agreement.

SECTION 6

The CITY is responsible for repairs, upkeep, and maintenance of parking lot as well as trash clean up, removal, and dumpster service. The SCHOOL agrees to be in charge of snow removal.

I would like to suggest that the City Ordinance &08.010 be amended to read:

"No person may sell. Cause to be sold, discharge, or cause to be discharged any pyrotechnics of any description whatever within the City limits. However, a person or organization may request a public display of fireworks provided the individual or organization has first **completed City Application** and obtain permission of the City Commission. Nothing is this chapter shall be construed as applying to toy caps containing not more than twenty-five hundredths of a grain of explosive composition per cap, nor shall it apply to sales or use of blank cartridges for ceremonial, theatrical or athletic events."

This will allow all parties to be on the same page as to what needs to be done and the guidelines that will be followed.

Also attached is a copy of the proposed application and check list to be completed. I will also include copies of related material used to put this together.

In light of the increased request for fireworks displays within the city limits, I have reviewed the City ordinances and found that we have not been following our own ordinance.

Presently when a fireworks display is requested on the special event list the Fire dept will issue a permit application then review the exhibitor plans to see if they are following NFPA 1123 or 1126 then Fire Dept. makes a decision to sign or not sign the permit. The FD was signing the permit violating city ordinance. The permit that Fire Department is using is an old permit application the was used by the State Fire Marshall office, which they discontinued so long ago the Fire Marshall can't remember when that happened.

I have developed a permit application that better reflects the requirements found in NFPA 1123 and 1126 for pyrotechnics. I have also included a checklist to see if all the requirements have been met, this should help the Commissioners in making their decision to approve /disapprove the Firework display. The application also has a spot for the City Fire Department, City Building Department, and the City Safety Officer to comment on the application.

Enclosed you will find the following copies; 1. City ordinance 8.08.010 Exceptions, 2. Present fireworks permit. 3.Proposed change in ordinance 8.08.010 and, 4. Draft of the pyrotechnics Display permit with checklist attached.

Enclosed are e-mails from the City attorney review of the permit application and comment on contents, I have a question as to proper wording for comment by City Officials (comments, recommendations or remarks.) I also question if we need to change the Ordinance or should the permit be left as a procedure/policy.

No person may sell, cause to be sold, discharge or cause to be discharged any pyrotechnics of any description whatever within the city. However, a person or organization may present a public display of fireworks provided the individual or organization has first obtained the permission of the city commission. Nothing in this chapter shall be construed as applying to toy paper caps containing not more than twenty-five hundredths of a grain of explosive composition per cap, nor shall it apply to the sale or use of signals necessary for the safe operation of public or private transportation, nor does this apply to the sale or use of blank cartridges for ceremonial, theatrical or athletic events.

8.08.020 Use of fire grates.

It is unlawful to burn wood and other solid fuel (not including charcoal briquettes) unless such materials are burned in a USDA (Forest Service) approved fire grate.

38.08.030 Adoption of South Dakota Department of Agriculture Guidelines and Recommendations.

The city of Deadwood hereby adopts the South Dakota Department of Agriculture Guidelines for minimum acceptable safety requirements for outdoor fireplaces. The City of Deadwood also hereby adopts the South Dakota Department of Agriculture Outdoor Fire Recommendations in campgrounds and camping areas for safety requirements. It is unlawful to burn any materials in a manner that violates these Guidelines and Recommendations within city of Deadwood city limits.

8.08.040 Grills.

It is unlawful to burn charcoal briquettes unless such materials are burned in devices designed specifically for cooking food by heat generated from burning charcoal (charcoal grills). It is lawful to use gas grills, so long as such are being used in compliance with Section 8.08.030.

□8.08.050 Permits.

It is unlawful to burn solid fuels without a permit issued by the Deadwood volunteer fire department. It is unlawful to burn slash piles without a permit issued by the Deadwood volunteer fire department. Any valid permits issued pursuant to this section shall be automatically suspended during any burn bans instituted by resolution of the Deadwood city commission. The Deadwood volunteer fire department shall notify permit holders of such suspensions.

3.08.060 Violation—Penalty.

Failure to obtain a permit as required by this chapter or any other violations of this chapter may be punishable by the maximum fine and jail as prescribed for Class 2 misdemeanors under South Dakota law for each offense. Each day of operation without such a permit or without compliance with the terms of this chapter shall be deemed a separate offense.



Re: Main Street Master Plan - Phase I

Winter & Company was chosen as the lead consultant for the Main Street Master Plan. On their team are Chamberlain Architects and Ferber Engineering along with another consultant specializing in special event management out of Boulder, Colorado.

The next step in moving forward with the Main Street Master Plan is to begin Phase I. The purpose of this phase is to review previous planning efforts, background documentation, on-site visits and interviews which will assist in understanding current conditions, physical constraints and issues as well as provide a more in-depth grasp of what is needed and the associate work that has occurred on Main Street.

In addition, an initial cost estimate will be developed for potential work related to this planning effort which is necessary for future bonding using HP funds. This phase will also build an understanding of how events are planned and implemented on Main Street. The cost to complete Phase I will not exceed \$55,000.00.

Phase I includes three primary tasks:

- Collect and review background materials A review of existing site documentation and related information.
- Expedited cost estimates for the bond issue The team will do their best to provide these preliminary costs for the upcoming bond issue.
- Events analysis Staff, events coordinator, downtown business owners and others will work to understand how events are organized, scheduled, implemented and note some of the issues that are encountered when the event is occurring.

Staff is asking City Commission for approval entering into contract with Winter & Company in an amount not to exceed \$55,000.00 to complete Phase I of the Main Street Master Plan with costs coming from the already approved Bed & Booze fund by the Deadwood City Commission.
