Locally cultivating and selling foods and crafts, Dahl McLean and Talli Nauman are the proprietors of Moonrise Mountain Enterprises, which we established in 2004.

We are asking for a permit for the continued use of the described city property for a seasonal Farmer's Market in recognition of Deadwood's origins, which were reliant on the local supply of food from milk producers at the dairy of the historic Anderson Ranch adjacent to our place and on fruits, vegetables, grains and meat grown in our part of Lawrence County.

We would need the permission to set up and operate with our canopies, tables, and on-site signs every Friday from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. from June through October in 2016. The specific dates are: June 10, 17, 24; July 1, 8, 15, 22, and 29; Aug. 5, 12, 19, and 26; Sept. 2, 9, 16, 23, and 30; Oct. 7, 14, 16, 21 and 28. We agree with Chamber of Commerce Executive Director Lee Harstad to refrain from operation any time it would create a conflict with scheduled events at the premises leased to that entity.

We have operated a Farmers Market in Deadwood since 2011, with last year being our first season on city property. Two other producers with tables and canopies occasionally join us, each of us providing proof of our liability insurance to the City of Deadwood as warranted.

Farmers unload vehicles at the location at 9 a.m. and remove them to designated parking areas for the duration of the market, from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. Then we reload vehicles and clean the area by 2 p.m.

While this is a very low-impact activity, we are responsible for and commit to maintaining the area we use to avoid any degradation of the property as it now exists and to safeguard its attractiveness. Tasks we perform to assure this include: sweeping, gathering litter, washing spills, and off-site disposal of trash in designated receptacles. We have a valid South Dakota sales tax license.



TROLLEY CLEANING CONTRACT

This Agreement, made and entered into on this 16th day of May, 2016, is between Black Hills Special Services and the City of Deadwood. The purpose of this Agreement is to set forth the terms and conditions under which BHSSC will provide trolley cleaning services. It is agreed that the City of Deadwood will compensate at a rate of \$30.00 per trolley, and \$16.00 per car, SUV, or pickup, to be billed separate, for services as outlined below.

The following duties will start no later than 8:00 a.m. daily from Memorial Day weekend of each year to Columbus Day weekend of each year. From Columbus Day weekend of each year to Memorial Day weekend of each year, duties will start no later than 8:00 a.m. on Friday, Saturday, Sunday, and Tuesday of every week. The schedule may be subject to change at direction of trolley manager with 24 hours notice.

- Sweep, vacuum, mop, wash, dust and polish inside of each trolley, car, SUV or pickup.
- Wash wheels and wheel covers
- Wash outside of each trolley, car, SUV or pickup
- Wash windows
- Fill each trolley with gas

In addition, twice a year (in the spring and fall of each year), the following duties will be completed:

- Wax five trolleys
- Shampoo upholstery for six trolleys

Work will be performed as an independent contractor and not as an agent, employee or partner of the City of Deadwood. Also, contractors hired by cleaner to perform any of the work described about shall also be independent contractors and shall comply with all of the terms and conditions of this agreement, which compliance shall be the responsibility of cleaner.

The cleaner shall not commence work until they have obtained all the insurance required and insurance has been approved by the Owner, nor shall the cleaner allow any Subcontractors to commence work on this contract until the insurance required of the Subcontractor has been obtained and approved. Certification of Insurance shall be submitted to the City Finance Office.

<u>Worker's Compensation Insurance</u>: The Contractor shall procure and maintain during the life of this contract, Workman's Compensation Insurance as required by applicable state laws for all its employees to be engaged in work at the site of the project under this contract, and in case of any work done by subcontractors similarly to provide Workman's Compensation Insurance for all employees to be engaged in work unless such employees are covered by the protections afforded by the Contractor's Workman's Compensation Insurance.

Contractor's Public Liability and Property Damage Insurance: The contractor shall procure and shall maintain during the life of this contact, Contractor's Public Liability Insurance in an amount of not less than \$1,000,000 for injuries, including accidental death, to any one person, and subject to the same for each person, in an amount of not less than \$1,000,000 on an account of one accident, and Contractor's Property Damage Insurance in an amount of not less than \$1,000,000 and subject to the same limit for aggregate, in an amount of not less than \$1,000,000.

The cleaner agrees to indemnify and save harmless the City of Deadwood and any and all of its officers, agents and employees from any and all liabilities, actions, claims or executions of any character including attorney fees, or any sums which the City may have to pay to any person on account of any personal or bodily injury, death or property damage which results from any negligent act, error or omission of the cleaner in connection with this agreement or services performed or materials provided pursuant to this agreement.

The City may suspend or terminate any or all services covered under this agreement at any time upon thirty days written notice to cleaner upon payment of all services rendered and expenses prior to the effective date of such suspension or termination, and may immediately suspend or terminate this agreement upon a violation or breach of any of the terms and conditions by the cleaner.

CONTRACT BETWEEN CITY OF DEADWOOD AND SUZANNE JULIN, INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR

This Agreement is between the CITY OF DEADWOOD, a municipal corporation with its principal place of business located at 108 Sherman Street, Deadwood, South Dakota 57732, on behalf of its Archives department (hereinafter referred to as "CITY") and Suzanne Julin of Missoula, Montana (hereinafter referred to as "JULIN").

The purpose of this Contract is to set forth the terms and conditions of the agreement between CITY and JULIN for services related to the production of oral histories, focusing on the development of limited gaming or other subjects related to the history of Deadwood, Lawrence County, South Dakota.

The parties desire to enter into an agreement whereby JULIN agrees to create and provide to CITY ten (10) oral histories; and

JULIN has the experience and expertise to produce the oral histories.

Based upon the representations and understanding of each party, CITY and JULIN agree as follows:

- 2. The parties agree it is JULIN'S responsibility to comply with all local and state laws relating to workmen's compensation, register, report, and pay all necessary taxes and insurance including, but not limited to Social Security, FICA, Unemployment Insurance, and comply with the Equal Employment Opportunities Act.
- 3. JULIN shall provide her own office space, equipment and materials to meet the requirements of this agreement.
- 4. JULIN shall create and provide CITY with ten (10) completed oral histories and one (1) copy of the transcribed interview, interview tapes and an oral history release form by December 31, 2016.
- 5. Upon completion of each oral history, JULIN shall provide CITY one copy of the transcribed interview, interview tapes, an oral history release form, and vouchers for work completed.

- 6. CITY shall pay JULIN the sum of Six Hundred Seventy-five and no/100s Dollars (\$675.00) per completed oral history, for a total not to exceed Six Thousand Seven Hundred Fifty and no/100s Dollars (\$6,750.00), for work completed and this amount cannot be exceeded unless change orders are agreed upon in writing by both parties;
- 7. Prior to scheduling any oral histories, the CITY shall select the interview subjects.
- 8. JULIN may not subcontract any portion of this contract or any portion of the work.
- 9. No further changes or additional work will be approved by the CITY, unless approved in writing by both parties;
- 10. Either party may terminate this agreement upon providing the other party with thirty (30) days notice in writing and served upon the other party via certified mail; however within one (1) week of such notice, JULIN shall provide to CITY all original documents produced at that time.
- 11. JULIN is an independent contractor and this contract shall not be construed as creating any type of relationship including but not limited to, principal and agent or employer and employee between CITY and JULIN. JULIN does not have authority to hire any person on behalf of CITY.
- 12. JULIN shall indemnify, defend and hold harmless CITY, its employees and authorized representatives from and against any and all suits, claims, actions, legal and administrative proceedings, demands, damages, liabilities, costs and expense including attorney's fees arising out of or in connection with any conduct or work of JULIN as set forth in this agreement.

AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF DEADWOOD AND RUSHMORE FENCING COMPANY, INC.

THIS AGREEMENT is by and between the CITY OF DEADWOOD, a municipal corporation with its principal place of business located at 102 Sherman Street, Deadwood, South Dakota 57732, hereinafter referred to as "CITY," and RUSHMORE FENCING COMPANY, INC. with its principal place of business located at P.O. Box 925, Rapid City, South Dakota 57709-0925, hereinafter referred to as "RUSHMORE FENCING;"

WHEREAS, RUSHMORE FENCING; has agreed to install replacement fencing along Highway 85 behind Tin Lizzie Casino, for a total sum not to exceed Thirty-two Thousand Nine Hundred Ninety-six and 35/100ths Dollars (\$32,996.35); and

WHEREAS, the South Dakota Department of Transportation has fixed the guardrail along Highway 85 at its own cost and has agreed to reimburse the CITY for one-half of the cost of the fencing, leaving the CITY responsible for payment to RUSHMORE FENCING of Thirty-two Thousand Nine Hundred Ninety-six and 35/100ths Dollars (\$32,996.35); and

WHEREAS, the purpose of this agreement, herein referred to as the "Agreement," is to set forth the terms and conditions for which RUSHMORE FENCING shall perform the services concerning the fencing along Highway 85; and

WHEREAS, the CITY has accepted the proposal from RUSHMORE FENCING and based upon the representations made above, the parties agree as follows:

- 1. The Recitals set forth above are herein incorporated and made part of this Agreement;
- 2. RUSHMORE FENCING shall install 640 linear feet of five foot tall black vinyl coated chain link fencing and 764 linear feet of four foot tall black vinyl coated chain link fencing along Highway 85 behind Tin Lizzie Casino;

- 3. RUSHMORE FENCING shall weld plates on the fence posts in order that they can be attached to the guardrail posts with galvanized lag bolts. RUSHMORE FENCING shall weld plates to posts mounted on concrete and attach the plates to concrete with anchored bolts;



Re:

Creation of a Mobile Visitor Information Center

One of the items in the Branding, Development and Marketing Action Plan through Roger Brooks International is the creation of a mobile visitor information center. The plan recommended the Deadwood Chamber of Commerce & Visitors Bureau along with the Deadwood Historic Preservation Commission take the lead in this effort.

A trend in the destination tourism industry is the deployment of mobile visitor information centers. A recent study of 850 destination marketing organizations (DMOs) shows that 25% of DMO's have mobile visitor information centers (VICs), and 50% of those are in very high pedestrian traffic areas.

This project would allow Deadwood to put the mobile VIC in the spending district of our town – on Historic Main Street. The unit should be designed for the pedestrian visitor who has already parked and is looking for what more there is to do and see in our community. Get them to spend more time and more money in our community as well as to experience more of our history.

Printed brochures are important at this stage of a visitor's trip. While before traveling, the Internet rules as the "go-to" place for travel information, brochures are the most important resource once the visitor arrives in the destination. Visitors don't want to take notes; they want the physical brochure they can read on the street or in the car. Once on the road, 81% of visitor decisions come from brochures.

The mobile VIC allows for the information to be where and when it is needed - on Main Street during high pedestrian traffic events and daily during our peak season.

The Action Plan suggested uses a stage coach or wagon, and converts into a workable space for an information specialist, brochures, possibly sell even branded/logo merchandise or other activities. This office has coordinated with the Chamber staff in providing the following recommendation – *Transform an antique chuck wagon into a mobile visitor information center.*

Below is a summary of the project:

Overview:

In partnership with Deadwood Historic Preservation, Deadwood Chamber, Deadwood Alive and BID 7, Main Street of Deadwood will play host to an "Info-Wagon," a transformed antique chuck wagon, during the summer months and available in the off-season for special events and activities in Deadwood and possibly throughout the region. The wagon will contain Deadwood information and be staffed by personnel in period clothing. It will have an authentic look and feel, eye-catching to visitors.

Schedule:

- Memorial Day to September in concert Deadwood Alive schedule
- Noon to 8:00 p.m. Monday-Saturday

Location: (to coincide with Deadwood Alive re-enactments):

• 12:00 p.m. to 2:30 p.m.: Near Tin Lizzie's

• 2:45 p.m. to 4:30 p.m.: Near the Celebrity or Fairmont

• 4:45 p.m. to 8:00 p.m.: Near the Silverado/Franklin


Set up daily at a key location

Storage:

The portable VIC would potentially be stored either under the canopy at the Silverado (near the front entrance) or in the Deadwood Pavilion (while available).

Interpretive Panel(s):

The portable VIC would have an interpretive panel(s) describing the wagon and the trails surrounding Deadwood as well as how the chuck wagon was used. (See sample below)




Specifics:

While the portable VIC would be staffed by a Chamber/Info Center staff member in costume, they may not be capable of moving the wagon without an ATV or other equipment. Deadwood Alive cast members may be charged with the task.

Size of the wagon: 87" H x 140" Long x 67" wide

There will be some sort of awning on the wagon that would shield the staff working the wagon from the sun/elements. Visitor information will be semilimited, but will include city-wide visitor guides, Deadwood Alive information, maps and a selection of materials. The wagon cover could be branded with the new Deadwood logo similar to what is seen on the wagon below.



Costs:

The costs for the project should not exceed \$15,000 for the wagon and necessary modifications to have a wagon developed for portable visitor information center. This would mean acquiring an original wagon and include the creation of an appropriate awning, providing weathertight chuck box, trappings, branding costuming, etc.

BID 7 has committed \$2,500.00 to the Chamber towards this project.

Hansen Wheel and Wagon Shop have a good solid chuck wagon ready to hitch and drive for sale at approximately \$13,000.00. This original antique farm wagon has been nicely outfitted into a working chuck wagon. Sturdy chuck box and pan boot creates ideal storage for gear. Also comes with a 30 gallon water barrel and wagon bows. Wagon comes complete with pole, double tree and neck yoke. Manual brakes and a lazy back seat complete this trail ready setup.

The Historic Preservation Office and the Deadwood Chamber of Commerce would like to purchase a wagon from Hansen Wheel and Wagon Shop and outfit it for the upcoming season as a portable visitor information center.

We believe this is an outstanding year to implement this program. The Deadwood Welcome Center is not complete and additional locations to provide visitor information is merited. The wagon could be resold in the future as an asset if warranted.

Recommended Motion: Move to approve the Deadwood Historic Preservation Commission's recommendation to develop a chuck wagon from Hansen Wheel and Wagon Shop into a portable visitor information center and allocate up to \$13,000.00 from the HP Public Education budget line item to the project.



AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF DEADWOOD AND CABLE COMMUNICATIONS SERVICES, INC.

THIS AGREEMENT is by and between the CITY OF DEADWOOD, a municipal corporation with its principal place of business located at 102 Sherman Street, Deadwood, South Dakota 57732, hereinafter referred to as "CITY," and CABLE COMMUNICATION SERVICES, INC., with its principal place of business located at 7200 Shadowland Court, Black Hawk, South Dakota 57718, hereinafter referred to as "CCS;"

WHEREAS, CCS; has agreed to perform specific tasks concerning trenching, installation of conduits and installation of an underground vault for the '76 Drive Realignment Project for a total sum not to exceed Six Thousand Seven One Hundred Eighteen and 66/100ths dollars (\$6,128.66); and

WHEREAS, the purpose of this agreement, herein referred to as the "Agreement," is to set forth the terms and conditions for which CCS shall perform the services concerning the trenching and conduit work for the '76 Drive Realignment Project; and

WHEREAS, the CITY has accepted the proposal from CCS and based upon the representations made above, the parties agree as follows:

- 1. The Recitals set forth above are herein incorporated and made part of this Agreement;
- CCS shall remove asphalt including dumping removed asphalt;
- CCS shall trench and install two 2-inch conduits for communication and two 3inch conduits for power;
- 4. CCS shall install an underground concrete vault with heavy-duty lid;
- 5. CCS shall clean up trenched areas;
- 6. Asphalt replacement shall be completed by CITY;

- 7. CCS shall perform these services with reasonable diligence and expediency consistent with sound professional practices.
- 8. All work will be subject to a final inspection by the Deadwood Public Works Department before acceptance;
- 9. No further changes or additional work will be approved by the CITY, unless approved in writing by both parties;
- 10. CCS shall comply with all local and state laws relating to workmen's compensation and additional insurance requirements to adequately protect the CITY from any claims or damages arising out of or in conjunction with the work contemplated herein;
- 11. CCS agrees to indemnify and hold harmless CITY and any of its officers, agents, and employees from any and all liabilities, actions, causes of actions, claims or executions of any character, including attorney's fees, or any sums which CITY may have to pay to any person on account of any personal or bodily injury, death or property damage, which results from any negligent act, error or omission of CCS in connection with this agreement or services performed or materials provided pursuant to this contract;
- 12. CITY may, at its option, terminate this agreement for any reason upon thirty (30) days notice to CCS;
- 13. CCS shall be paid in an amount not to exceed Six Thousand Seven One Hundred Eighteen and 66/100ths dollars (\$6,128.66) for work completed unless change orders are agreed upon in writing by both parties;
- 14. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement of the parties on its subject.

138 & 140 Sherman Street -- Façade Easement Program Approval

Tim Conrad is requesting acceptance and funding through the Historic Facade Easement Program for façade restoration.

The actual costs of restoring or rehabilitating the façade will be used in determining the value of the façade grant. There is a maximum allowed per building. The standard maximum award per building is 80 percent of the qualified expenditures and capped at \$75,000. Any award cap may be increased by up to \$25,000 for buildings on corner lots and with more than one prominent façade for funding the restoration or rehabilitation of additional prominent facades.

The estimated total cost of the façade restoration project is \$73,120.85. The applicant is requesting \$58,496.68 for the façade project. The anticipated appraisal value at conclusion of the project will be between \$200,000 and \$300,000.







RUBBLE SITE AGREEMENT

This contract made and entered into this 1st day of June, 2016 by and between the City of Deadwood, a political subdivision of the State of South Dakota, the City of Lead, a political subdivision of the State of South Dakota, and Central City, a political subdivision of the State of South Dakota (hereinafter referred to as "CITIES") and Chad Adams (hereinafter referred to as "ADAMS").

1. BASE TERMS:

- a. For the purposes of operating a Type III Solid Waste Disposal Site on behalf of CITIES (hereinafter "rubble site").
- b. The term of this contract shall be for a period of six months from the date set forth above and shall expire on November 30, 2016. CITIES do hereby grant to ADAMS an option to renew the contract for an additional six month period upon ADAMS giving 30 days written notice prior to the end of the original term and each renewal term. The annual renewal rate for each renewal period will be determined, changed or adjusted by mutual agreement, in writing, of the parties. The other terms and conditions of this contract will continue in effect unless changed in writing by agreement of the parties.

At the end of this second 6-month period, the parties have the option of entering into a 3-year agreement by mutual agreement of ADAMS and CITIES. The annual renewal rate to be paid by ADAMS for the 3-year period will be determined, changed or adjusted by mutual agreement, in writing, of the parties. The other terms and conditions of this contract will continue in effect unless modified in writing by agreement of the parties.

In the event the parties are unable to agree on appropriate terms for the renewal period within 15 days of the expiration of the original term, the option to renew will be rescinded.

Should this Agreement be terminated as a result of default by ADAMS, then the prepaid fees previously paid to ADAMS shall be prorated to the date of termination with \$10,485.00 representing the total yearly fees paid to ADAMS.

2. <u>CITIES' OBLIGATIONS</u>:

- a. CITIES shall approve any fee rates charged by ADAMS, pursuant to the attached fee schedule. Once set, the fee schedule may not be modified without the consent of CITIES.
- b. CITIES assumes hazards of damage or destruction of any of the improvements now on the real property or to be placed thereon. CITIES agrees to maintain and carry at all times fire and extended coverage insurance on all of the structures of the said premises to the full insurable value thereof

3. <u>ADAMS' OBLIGATIONS</u>:

- a. To operate the rubble site in accordance with the terms set forth herein;
- b. To abide by all applicable laws and permit requirements of the operation of a

 Type III Solid Waste Disposal Site, and ensure that all operations are in compliance with
 all local, state and federal laws, rules, regulations and permits or leases covering the
 same. ADAMS shall be available for any inspections by federal, state or local authorities.
- c. ADAMS shall be responsible for disposing of tires including costs of disposal on an annual basis. No tires shall become a permanent part of the rubble site.
- d. ADAMS shall maintain a complete record keeping system, including but not limited to income statements, accounts receivable and daily usage logs. ADAMS shall

provide a written quarterly report to CITIES on usage, quantity waste disposal, income and expenses. These records shall also be made available to CITIES as CITIES' request for review.

e. ADAMS shall provide all necessary equipment for operation and maintenance of the rubble site. ADAMS is responsible for the year-round maintenance of all roads within the rubble site as well as access to and from the rubble site from Yellow Creek Road.

4. <u>MECHANIC'S OR CONSTRUCTION LIENS:</u>

ADAMS shall not subject the rubble site to any mechanics, materialmen or construction liens of any kind unless specifically approved in writing by CITIES.

5. <u>INDEMNIFICATION:</u>

- a. During the entire term of the contract, ADAMS shall indemnify and hold harmless CITIES against any and all claims, debts, demands or obligations which may be made against ADAMS or against ADAMS' title in the rubble site arising out of or in connection with any alleged act or admission of ADAMS or any person claiming under, by or through ADAMS.
- b. If it becomes necessary for ADAMS to defend any action seeking and imposing liability, ADAMS will pay CITIES all costs of court and attorney fees incurred by CITIES in effecting such defense in addition to any other sums which CITIES may be called upon to pay by reason of the entry of a judgment against ADAMS.
- c. This indemnification is applicable only to ADAMS' operation and management of its rubble site, according to all federal, state, and local laws and regulations. ADAMS shall obtain comprehensive general liability insurance to cover the activities of ADAMS undertaken herein with the general limits of said coverage being Two Million and no/100s Dollars (\$2,000,000.00), or a combination of general liability policies totaling

Two Million and no/100s Dollars (\$2,000,000.00). CITIES shall be added as an additional insured on said policy(ies) and shall present proof of such insurance to the CITIES.

6. **DEFAULT**:

- a. If at any time a default shall be made by ADAMS in the performance of any obligation of ADAMS herein set forth, then it shall be lawful for CITIES to declare the contract term ended and to reenter upon the rubble site and take possession of the same under the terms and conditions herein provided.
- b. If the default occurs, and if CITIES shall so elect, they may declare this contract term ended by giving ADAMS thirty(30) days' written notice specifying the event causing the default and ADAMS shall have thirty (30) days, after the date of receiving the notice, to cure such default.
- c. If not timely cured, this contract shall terminate; if timely cured, this contract shall continue.

7. HOURS OF OPERATION:

- a. The rubble site shall be open for use by the public Mondays through Saturdays during regular business hours during the summer months as set forth below and Thursdays through Saturdays during regular business hours during the winter months as set forth below.
- b. CITIES and ADAMS may agree to different hours of operation if agreed to in writing by CITIES and ADAMS:

Summer Months

May 1 through September 30

8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.

Winter Months

October 1 through April 30

9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.

8. FREE DUMPING:

Residents of CITIES and of Lawrence County shall be allowed free dumping four times per year:

- a. Near the end of March (free dump weekend);
- b. Mid-May (spring clean-up week);
- c. Late September (free dump weekend), and
- d. Early November (free dump weekend).

9. FEES:

Fees shall be established by contract addendum and agreed to by both CITIES and ADAMS. Tipping fees may be adjusted pursuant to mutual agreements with CITIES and ADAMS, exclusive of these contract terms. CITIES will approve the rate of the fees.

10. SITE USAGE:

CITIES have exclusive rights to harvesting timber, minerals and other rubble site natural resources. ADAMS shall coordinate with CITIES to facilitate these operations as deemed necessary by CITIES.

- b. ADAMS may, with the approval of CITIES, engage in other appropriate, lawful and permitted activities for income generation at the rubble site.
- c. ADAMS shall ensure the operations of the rubble site are conducted in a safe, efficient and professional manner.

11. TERMINATION:

At the termination of this contract, ADAMS will peaceably and quietly deliver possession of the rubble site to CITIES.

12. QUIET ENJOYMENT:

CITIES covenant and agree with ADAMS that so long as ADAMS keeps and performs all of the covenants and conditions by ADAMS to be kept and performed hereunder.

ADAMS and his successors in interest shall have quiet and undisturbed and continued possession of the rubble site, free from any claims by CITIES or any persons or entities claiming thereunder.

13. <u>FORCE-MAJEURE</u>:

In the event that CITIES or ADAMS shall be delayed, hindered in or prevented from the performance or any act required hereunder by reason of strikes, lock-outs, labor troubles, inability to procure materials, failure of power, restrictive governmental laws or regulations, the act or failure to act of either party for said reason shall be excused for the period of delay necessitated by the above without either party being held accountable for the same.

14. CONSENT NOT TO BE UNREASONABLY WITHHELD:

Whenever the contract requests any consent, permission or approval which may be required or desired by ADAMS pursuant to the provisions hereof.

15. WRITTEN MODIFICATIONS:

No modifications, release, discharge, amendment or waiver of any provisions hereof shall be of an force or effect unless reduced to writing and executed by both parties.

16. **LAWS**:

The laws of the state of South Dakota in force and effect at the date of the execution of this contract shall govern and control the interpretation and application of this contract except where new laws or regulations mandate a modification to this contract in order to continue to perform the duties and obligations of either party hereunder, which the parties hall not unreasonably withhold consent to such modification pursuant to any new law or regulation mandating the modification hereto.
