Years of Service

Asst. Fire Chief Glover presented a certificate to Courtne Rakow for 5 years of service as a volunteer firefighter. Chief Glover also mentioned Matt Helmin for 5 years of service as a volunteer firefighter. Commission thanked them for their years of service.

Open Container

Lacey Kirwan, Gunslinger Saloon, asked the Commission to consider open container in Deadwood year around from 2:00 p.m. to 10:00 p.m. Kirwan handed out pamphlets to the Commission with suggested guidelines as well as a proposed ordinance. Commissioner Ruth said he witnessed open container in Savannah, GA and had a positive experience. He added that if done correctly it could be a positive experience, but a great deal of planning and coordination must be done first. Commission Van Den Eykel stated Deadwood has to decide what type of community it wants to be: either drinking or family oriented. Main Street business owner Jim Tice agreed with Van Den Eykel, and said there are ample open container days during the summer. Business owner Louie Lalonde spoke in opposition, said other changes need to be put in place first, and there are ample places for people to drink. Chief Fuller outlined ten calls for service during the previous weekend that involved alcohol. He reminded Commission there were no special events, no open container and bad weather. Chief Fuller stated that in 2015 alcohol arrests were up 25%, and of the 456 total arrests made last year, 90-95% were drug and alcohol related. Hospital employee Courtne Rakow agreed with Fuller, and stated that increased alcohol related calls have an impact on the hospital as well. 

AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF DEADWOOD AND MOSS ROCK LANDSCAPING, INC.

THIS AGREEMENT is by and between the CITY OF DEADWOOD, a municipal corporation with its principal place of business located at 102 Sherman Street, Deadwood, South Dakota 57732, hereinafter referred to as "CITY," and MOSS ROCK LANDSCAPING, INC., with its principal place of business located at 25160 Little Italy Road, Custer, SD 57730, hereinafter referred to as "MOSS ROCK;"

WHEREAS, MOSS ROCK has agreed to perform specific tasks addressing drainage issues above the Wild Bill Hickok gravesite and erosion control along the grass streets of Mt. Moriah Cemetery, for a total sum not to exceed Thirty-two Thousand Four Hundred Ninety and 00/100ths dollars (\$32,490.00); and

WHEREAS, the purpose of this agreement, herein referred to as the "Agreement," is to set forth the terms and conditions for which MOSS ROCK shall perform the services concerning erosion control in Mt. Moriah Cemetery; and

WHEREAS, the CITY has accepted the proposal from MOSS ROCK and based upon the representations made above, the parties agree as follows:

- 1. The Recitals set forth above are herein incorporated and made part of this Agreement;
- 2. MOSS ROCK shall construct interventions to resolve ongoing erosion concerns as a result of compaction from pedestrian traffic along Boaz Street at Jerusalem Street to Morgan; Morgan to Mid Slope and Mid Slope to Paul Street pursuant to the pursuant to the project specifications, L-1.1 through L-3.3;
- 3. MOSS ROCK shall scarify all areas in the work zone showing bare dirt of compacted topsoil pursuant to the project specifications, L-1.1 through L-3.3;
- 4. MOSS ROCK shall apply native topsoil that is free of negative materials necessary to recreate a natural grade in the work zone; geotextile over new topsoil

- areas deeper than 2 inches pursuant to the project specifications, L-1.1 through L-3.3;
- 5. MOSS ROCK shall install Greenarmor 7020 (or a comparable performance alternative as indicated in the Addenda No. 1), and top dress the geotextile with 1-3 inches of hand placed topsoil that completely covers the reinforcement but does not crush the armoring system pursuant to the project specifications, L-1.1 through L-3.3;
- 6. MOSS ROCK shall hand seed and hydromulch all areas disturbed due to this operation as detailed in the project specifications, L-1.1 through L-3.3;
- 7. MOSS ROCK shall be responsible for watering and general maintenance after seeding, including any repairs in the area due to erosion pursuant to the project specifications, L-1.1 through L-3.3;
- 8. Maintenance period shall end after a healthy, uniform, close stand of grass has been established free of weeks and surface irregularities with coverage exceeding 90 percent over any 10 square foot and bare spots not exceeding 5 by 5 inches pursuant to the project specifications, L-1.1 through L-3.3;
- 9. In the spring or fall following installation MOSS ROCK shall reseed grass areas that did not establish during planting pursuant to the project specifications, L-1.1 through L-3.3;
- 10. MOSS ROCK shall place a minimum of three (3) signs and rope off the restoration area as indicated the project specifications, L-1.1 through L-3.2.. Rope may be removed at the end of the restoration area or at the direction of CITY;
- 11. MOSS ROCK shall utilize drainage products as detailed in the project specifications, L-1.1 through L-3.3;
- 12. MOSS ROCK shall utilize path material as detailed in the project specifications, L-1.1 through L-3.3;
- 13. All work shall be completed within sixty (60) days from the Notice to Proceed;
- 14. In the event of deposits of historical or archaeological interest are found during construction, MOSS ROCK shall cease operations affecting the find(s) and notify the Historic Preservation Officer of the CITY as indicated in Instructions to Bidder, paragraph 13;
- 15. All work will be subject to a final inspection by the Deadwood Public Works Department before acceptance;

- 16. No further changes or additional work will be approved by the CITY, unless approved in writing by both parties;
- 17. MOSS ROCK shall perform these services with reasonable diligence and expediency consistent with sound professional practices.
- 18. MOSS ROCK shall comply with all local and state laws relating to workmen's compensation and additional insurance requirements to adequately protect the CITY from any claims or damages arising out of or in conjunction with the work contemplated herein;
- 19. MOSS ROCK agrees to indemnify and hold harmless CITY and any of its officers, agents, and employees from any and all liabilities, actions, causes of actions, claims or executions of any character, including attorney's fees, or any sums which CITY may have to pay to any person on account of any personal or bodily injury, death or property damage, which results from any negligent act, error or omission of MOSS ROCK in connection with this agreement or services performed or materials provided pursuant to this contract;
- 20. CITY may, at its option, terminate this agreement for any reason upon thirty (30) days notice to MOSS ROCK;
- 21. MOSS ROCK shall be paid in an amount not to exceed Thirty-two Thousand Four Hundred Ninety and 00/100ths dollars (\$32,490.00) for work completed unless change orders are agreed upon in writing by both parties prior to incurring any additional costs;
- 22. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement of the parties on its subject.

April and May 2015 City Archives Monthly Report

These are the items I worked on during the months of April and May of 2015.

RESEARCH REQUESTS

I received and answered twenty-one (21) research requests in April and seventeen (17) requests in May. The requests took the form of emails, walk in researchers, mail inquiries, and department head and city employee requests.

COLLECTIONS MANAGEMENT

- Historic Preservation Digital Photographs: In April and May, I worked on the backlog of Historic Preservation digital photographs. During these months, I cataloged 358 images from 2014. This will be an ongoing project, and I hope to be caught up by December of 2015.
- 2016 City Archives Budget: On June 1, 2015, I submitted the 2016 Archives Budget to Kevin. The City Archives budget is similar to the 2015 budget with a few new projects. If interested, I have copies available for review in my office.
- Fountain House Archaeological Collection: On April 17, 2015 Kevin and I met with the Bradsky Family and Joy McCracken of Neighborworks to discuss the Fountain House artifacts. At the end of the meeting, the Bradsky Family decided to donate the 95 artifacts to the City of Deadwood.
- Fidler-Isburg Mortuary Ledgers and Lawrence County Ledgers: On May 22, 2015 the South Dakota State Archives Microfilm Unit picked up seven (7) mortuary ledgers, four (4) Lawrence County circuit court journals and five (5) Executor and Administrator Bonds & Letters ledgers from the City Archives. These ledgers will be microfilmed and digitized as outlined in the 2015 City Archives budget. Prior to the State's arrival, I compiled a loan agreement between the City and the State Archives and organized the appraisal of the mortuary records for insurance purposes. There are two additional boxes of mortuary records that wait microfilming.

PROJECTS

- Chinese Coin Video, Facebook and YouTube: During May, I worked with Grant Welford of Macrovison on a new four minute video focusing on the discovery and conservation of 168 Chinese coins. During this project, I helped write, edit, and select images to be used in the video. I also contacted Terry Holts, a former South Dakota Archaeology technician who narrated the opening and closing of the video. The video aired on June 8, 2015 on both the Historic Preservation Facebook page and the Historic Preservation YouTube page.
- 2015 Arbor Day Student Art Exhibit: On May 8, 2015, the City of Deadwood and the Lead/Deadwood Lions Club celebrated national Arbor Day by planting two (2)

trees at the corner of Pioneer Way and Deadwood Street and at the U.S. Post Office. In addition to the tree planting, I installed the annual student art show at the Deadwood Information & Visitor Center. The student artwork was on display for two weeks.

- 66 Taylor Avenue Burial Project: On April 16, 2015 I drove to the South Dakota School of Mines and videotaped the spectral analysis of the teeth from the 66 Taylor Avenue burial. Of the nine fillings, two gold and three silver-tin amalgam fillings were tested by David R Lingenfelter, a Research Scientist for the Engineering and Mining Experiment Station (EMES). The results indicated that one of the gold fillings was refined based on the types of elements found in the gold. The three silver-tin amalgam fillings showed different concentrations and percentages of elements indicating a lack in a standardized filling. Upon completion, all of the forensic reports will be sent to Karen Taylor who will begin the facial reconstruction for this burial.
- Deadwood Information/Visitor Center Request for Proposal: In May, I spent a considerable amount of time developing a Request for Proposal (RFP) focusing on the development of the interpretive area at the Deadwood Information/Visitor Center. The City Archives would like to develop a series of permanent, changeable and interactive exhibits in 593 square feet at the Deadwood Information & Visitor Center (3 Siever Street). The current exhibit was installed in 1992 and, for the most part, served its purpose. The proposed exhibit would provide the City a wonderful opportunity display and interpret portions of its massive archaeological collection.
- John Bolan Archaeological Exhibit: In April, Mr. John Bolan of Huntington Beach, California agreed to loan one box of artifacts discovered on his property during the filming of National Geographic Channel's reality television show "Diggers". In April and May, I began developing an exhibit focusing on these artifacts. This included researching the manufacturer's marks on some of the artifacts, writing the narrative, and designing the exhibit. The temporary exhibit was installed at the visitor center in June 1, 2015 and will remain on exhibit for the summer.
- 2015 BHSU Herbarium Conservation Project: In April and May, I met with Mark Gabel and Justin Ramsey the curators of the Black Hills State University Herbarium located on the BHSU campus. The meeting was in regards to hiring the curatorial staff to stabilize the City's collection of floral specimens unearthed during the 2001 to 2004 Chinatown excavations. In addition, the City Archives would like to incorporate the Chinatown botanical information into the online Collaborative Database of the Plants from Western South Dakota and Eastern Wyoming (http://herbarium.bhsu.edu/database.htm) managed by the BHSU Herbarium. If funded, this will be a two year project. As an offshoot of this project, the Deadwood Historic Preservation Commission and the City of Deadwood donated two wood cuts to the Herbarium. An article of this donation appeared in May 1, 2015 Black Hills Pioneer newspaper.
- Rotary Park Outdoor Interpretive Sign: At the end of April, I finished and submitted the Rotary Park outdoor sign files to Pannier Graphics. The completed sign arrived on May 20, 2015 and was installed in the park the next day by the

Streets Department. The next step will be creating a YouTube video on the history of the park.

• **Deadwood Firewiswe:** In April, I continued to work with the Finance Office to secure land easements for the upcoming summer. This included looking up legal locations at the Register of Deeds, writing the landowners in Zone #5, and talking with the DOC Firewise crews.

MISCELLANEOUS ITEMS & MEETINGS

- James Aplan Site Visit and Appraisal, April 22, 2015: On April 22, 2015 James and Peg Aplan came to the Deadwood City Hall and appraised four collections. These appraisals included one (1) glass transparency of the Homestake Mine (Sanford Visitor Center, Lead, South Dakota), the John Bolan Archaeological Collection (Deadwood Information/Visitor Center), twenty (20) Mortuary Ledgers from the Fidler-Isburg Funeral Chapel, and seven (7) photographs from Marlene Todd of Deadwood, South Dakota.
- Dakota Conference, Augustana College, April 23-25, 2015: On April 23-25, 2015 I attended the Dakota Conference at Augustana College in Sioux Falls, South Dakota. As part of this trip, I dropped off the 1930 Sanborn Fire Insurance Map at Mathisons Graphics in Rapid City and picked up the six panel baseball exhibit at the Siouxland Heritage Center in Sioux Falls.
- **Presentation, NAPA Postmasters Convention:** On May 1, 2015 I gave a twenty minute presentation on Deadwood's history and area attractions to the South Dakota and Wyoming NAPA Postmasters convention at the Holiday Inn Express.
- SD State Historical Records Advisory Board (SHRAB) Board Meeting: On May 13, 2015 I attended a SHRAB board meeting in Pierre, South Dakota. During this meeting, the SHRAB board reviewed seven (7) grant applications and disseminated \$4,000 in funds to local repositories, organizations, and historical societies.
- John Moore Site Visit: On May 12, 2015 I gave John Moore, my former Anthropology and Archaeology professor from the University of Wisconsin-Stevens Point a tour of the City's Archaeology Lab and City Archives.

SUMMARY

These change orders are for work completed on the Utility Relocation Project, part of the Highway 85 Reconstruction Project. Included is work required due to unknown conditions near the Super 8 Motel, and relocation of two water curb stops near Southside Oil Station. Near the Super 8 Motel it was discovered that the existing routing of the City's service to the Motel was in conflict with the new storm sewer being installed as part of the highway project. It was also determined the sizing of the service was inadequate. To rectify these issues, work was performed as outlined in CQs#7 and 8. Additionally, a 2 inch service was added for the new building at the Gateway Park as part of CO #7.

The relocation of the two water curb steps near Southside Oil Station was done to prevent the curb stops from being in the new gutter line, which was changed as part of the highway reconstruction project.

The cost for these three change orders is:

CO #6 \$2,124.16 CO #7 \$1,856.50 CO #8 \$2,916.71

Enclosed is a copy of the Contractor's breakdown of costs for CCO#6.

This change involved moving curb stops at 67+69R and 67+62R. These curb stops fell in the gutter line of the SDDOT curb & gutter and were moved to beyond the curb and gutter into the approach pavement for the Southside Service Station.

The breakdown indicates the Contractor's total cost for these changes is \$2124.16 or \$1,062.08 per curb stop. The Contractor has indicated that when excavating for moving of these curb stops, the Contractor determined that the existing curb stops and boxes were not salvageable, so both the curb stops and curb boxes were replaced. The Contractor used 10 I.f. of 1" copper pipe for moving these curb stops.

If the work were to be done at Contract unit prices, the Contractor's contract unit price for "1" Curb Stop & Box" is \$716.36/each for a total of \$1,432.72. The Contractor's unit price for "1" Copper Pipe" is \$84.76/l.f. for a total of \$847.60 for 10 l.f. Enclosed is a copy of the Contractor's breakdown of costs for CCO#8.

This change involved the abandonment of the existing Super 8 Motel domestic water service at Sta. 56+72.00. The project plans called for insulation of this service from the water main to the curb stop. However, upon excavation, the Contractor did not find the service at the location indicated on the drawings. The Contractor performed additional excavation and found that the service consisted of 3-1" copper water service taps on the side of the main opposite the Super 8 Motel. These 3-1" copper services then looped around to the south and crossed over the main to turn in the direction of the Super 8 Motel. These 3-1" services then transitioned to 1-2" steel service via a manifold. The steel service was cased in a steel casing under the street,

Along with time spent trying to ascertain the configuration of the service, the Contractor had to excavate to the 3 corporation stops, turn off these corporation stops, and then cut and crimp these services prior to abandonment and backfilling. The Contractor's documentation indicates that the crew spent a day performing this work. I was on site most of that day and confirm that the Contractor's claim of time spent appears accurate. The Contractor is requesting an amount of \$2,916.71 for this additional work.

On April 13, 2016, Matt Steiner, representing the ownership group at 610 Main Street, formally requested the Deadwood Historic Preservation Commission consider purchasing the Wild Bill Bar Sign currently located at 610 Main Street. This request was continued by the commission to have staff put together additional historical information on the sign and garner a formal appraisal of the sign to determine value.

At the request of the Historic Preservation Commission, contact was made with a certified appraiser. Staff has had communication with James O. Aplan with Antiques and Art in Piedmont, South Dakota regarding a formal appraisal of the sign. Mr. Aplan did agree with staff's opinion in the sign would probably be valued from \$15,000 to \$25,000 if not more.

Also, at the request of the Historic Preservation Commission, staff has met with the Rick and Margi Olesen, proprietors of the Wild Bill Bar and Matt Steiner, owner of the sign in question.

Mr. Steiner is requesting \$13,500 for the purchase of the sign. We also have a quote from Northern Hills Neon and Signs for \$450.00 to remove the sign. It is estimated it would cost approximately another \$500.00 to install the sign at a new location.

Rick and Margi Olesen are interested in having the sign reinstalled on their building, home of the Wild Bill Bar, and are willing to lease to own from the City of Deadwood at a rate of \$1,500 per year for 10 years. After the term of the lease-purchase, the Olesen's would provide the Deadwood Historic Preservation Commission a conservation easement to protect the sign in perpetuity.

This Historic Preservation Commission recommends purchasing the Wild Bill Bar sign in the amount of \$13,500 from Mr. Steiner and enter into a lease to own agreement with Rick and Margi Olesen at a rate of \$1,500 per year for 10 years with a lease purchase easement to protect the sign in perpetuity.
