BRIDGE REINSPECTION PROGRAM RESOLUTION FOR USE WITH SOUTH DAKOTA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION RETAINER CONTRACTS

WHEREAS, Title 23, Section 151, United States Code and Title 23, Part 650, Subpart C, Code of Federal Regulations, requires initial inspection of all bridges and reinspection at intervals not to exceed two years with the exception of reinforced concrete box culverts that meet specific criteria. These culverts are reinspected at intervals not to exceed four years.

THEREFORE, the *City of Deadwood* is desirous of participating in the Bridge Inspection Program using Bridge Replacement funds.

The City requests SDDOT to hire *Interstate Engineering, Inc.* (Consulting Engineers) for the inspection work. SDDOT will secure Federal approvals, make payments to the Consulting Engineer for inspection services rendered, and bill the City for 20% of the cost. The City will be responsible for the required 20% matching funds.

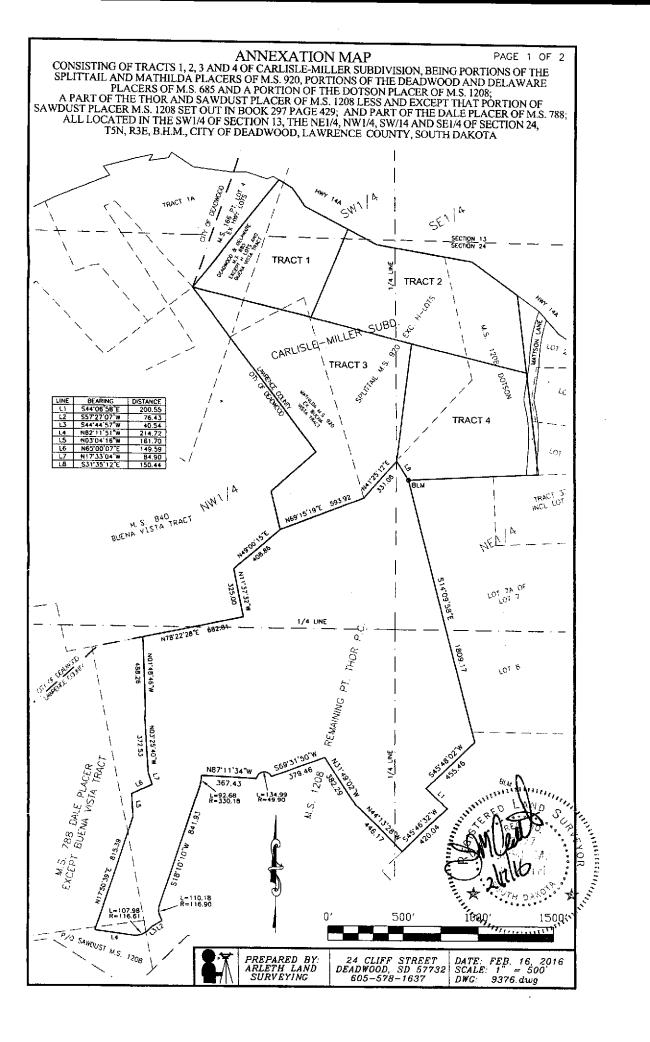

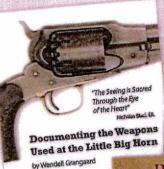

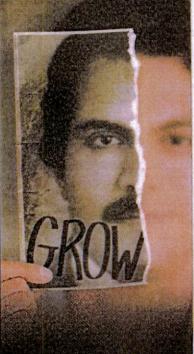

2016 PARKING LEASE WITH SOUTH DAKOTA COMMISSION ON GAMING

This Lease, made and entered into by and between the State of South Dakota, for the

South Dakota Commission on Gaming hereinafter referred to as TENANT, and the City of

Deadwood, hereinafter referred to as LANDLORD.

WITNESSETH

In consideration of the mutual covenants contained herein, the parties agree as

follows:

The LANDLORD hereby leases and rents unto the TENANT, and the TENANT hereby

hires and takes from the LANDLORD located in the City of Deadwood, County of Lawrence, the

following described property: 5 parking spots located in the Miller Street Parking Lot in

**SECTION 1 (TERM OF LEASE)**

### **SECTION IV (FUNDING OUT)**

The LANDLORD agrees that the continued rental of the hereinbefore described premises for the term hereinbefore specified by the TENANT is dependent upon receipt of both funds and expenditure authority from the Legislature. In the event that the Legislature does not provide said funds or expenditure authority for any fiscal year, then and in such event, this lease is null and void and said lease shall expire at the end of the fiscal year in which the last funding shall be made available for the TENANT. LANDLORD agrees that a termination because of lack of funds or expenditure authority will not result in a claim against the TENANT, the State of South Dakota, or any officer or employee of the State.

#### **SECTION V (TERMINATION)**

The TENANT at the termination of this lease agrees to quietly yield and surrender the premises to LANDLORD or its successors and assigns in as good a condition and repair as when TENANT took possession of the premises, reasonable wear and tear thereof, damage by the elements, other than casualty, condemnation and/or appropriation excepted.

#### SECTION VI (PEACEABLE AND QUIETLY HOLD)

The TENANT shall have the right to peaceable and quietly hold, enjoy and occupy the premises from 7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Monday through Friday as described for the term of this lease without hindrance, interruption, ejection, molestation by LANDLORD or by any other person or person whomever.

The TENANT agrees that it is merely renting a space to park a vehicle and that such rent does not include protection of the vehicle. TENANT acknowledges and agrees that it is taking the same risks of the vehicle being stolen or damaged that it would take if it parks on any street. TENANT further agrees that if anyone steals or damages its vehicle or anything in its vehicles, that TENANT will not request CITY to pay for any such losses incurred. CITY specifically disclaims any responsibility, expressed or implied, to protect against loss or damage to TENANT'S vehicles or its contents while parking in the Miller Parking Lot. TENANT agrees that no bailment is created for its vehicle or the contents under this Lease Agreement, and that it shall use the Miller Parking Lot at its own risk and responsibility.

TENANT shall assume all risks incident to the use of the premises as a parking lot and shall indemnify CITY against any loss, damage or expense resulting from personal injury or damage to, or loss of property caused in any manner by TENANT, and against any loss, damage, or expense resulting from injury to TENANT.

### **SECTION VII (CANCELLATION)**

Notwithstanding provision hereinbefore described, the TENANT may cancel this lease upon thirty (30) days' notice in writing. During the 30 days prior to the expiration of the term, LANDLORD shall have the right to exhibit the premises to prospective TENANTS. The giving of the notice required herein shall not release either LANDLORD or TENTANT from full and faithful performance of all terms and conditions of this lease during the continuing occupancy of TENANT after the notice of termination but before TENANT actually vacates the premises.

### SECTION VIII (PRIOR LEASE)

This lease shall render null and void any previous lease or agreements between the TENANT and LANDLORD for the premises herein described.

# AGREEMENT BETWEEN CITY OF DEADWOOD AND MARYLAND ARCHEOLOGICAL CONSERVATION LABORATORY, INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR

This agreement is made by and between the CITY OF DEADWOOD, a municipal corporation with its principal place of business located at 108 Sherman Street,

Deadwood, South Dakota 57732, on behalf of its Archives Department (hereinafter referred to as "CITY") and MARYLAND ARCHEOLOGICAL CONSERVATION

LABORATORY with its principal place of business located at 10515 Mackall Road, St.

Leonard, MD 20685, (hereinafter referred to as "MAC Lab").

WHEREAS, the purpose of this agreement is to set forth the terms and conditions of the agreement between CITY and MAC Lab to provide conservation treatments to three (3) solder-dot cans discovered during the Fountain House relocation.

WHEREAS, MAC Lab has the experience and expertise to provide the requested conservation treatments; and

WHEREAS, based upon the representations and understanding of each party, CITY and MAC Lab agree as follows:

- 1. The Recitals set forth above are herein incorporated and made part of this Agreement;
- 2. The parties agree it is MAC Lab's responsibility to comply with all local and state laws relating to workman's compensation, register, report and pay all necessary taxes and insurance, including, but not limited to Social Security, FICA, Unemployment Insurance and comply with the Equal Employment Opportunities Act;
- 2. MAC Lab shall provide its own office space, equipment and materials needed to meet the requirements of this agreement;
- 3. MAC Lab shall clean and stabilize three (3) solder-dot cans containing original lithographic paper labels;
- 4. MAC Lab shall remove and clean the paper labels, desalinate the cans, apply a protective coating on the metal and insert a protective barrier between the paper label and the metal can;

- 5. Upon the objects being returned to CITY, MAC Lab shall submit an invoice for work completed and be paid One Thousand Three Hundred and no 100/Dollars (\$1,300.00) by CITY. Any amounts greater than \$1300.00, will require prior written approval of CITY and MAC Lab;
- 6. MAC Lab may not subcontract any of the services to be provided by this agreement;
- 7. Either party may terminate this agreement upon providing the other party with thirty (30) days' notice, in writing, and served upon the other party via certified mail; however, within one (1) week of such notice, MAC Lab shall return the collection to CITY and shall produce work completed at that time;
- 8. MAC Lab is an independent contractor and this agreement shall not be construed as creating any type of relationship, including, but not limited to, principal and agent, or employer and employee between CITY and MAC Lab;
- 9. MAC Lab does not have the authority to hire any person on behalf of CITY;
- 10. MAC Lab shall indemnify, defend and hold harmless CITY, its employees and authorized representatives from and against any and all suits, claims, actions, legal and administrative proceedings, demands, damages, liabilities, costs and expenses, including attorneys' fees arising out of, or in connection with any conduct or work of MAC Lab as set forth in this agreement;
- 11. This agreement and the rights and obligations of the parties shall be interpreted, construed and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of South Dakota; and
- 12. This agreement constitutes the entire agreement of the parties on its subject. There are no other terms, conditions or understandings of any kind, expressed or implied.

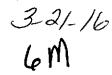

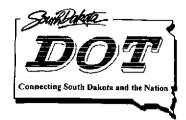

Bids were opened on March 15, 2016 at 2:00 p.m. for the Powerhouse Park Project, Historic Preservation Contractor and Gateway Landscape/Sign Project.

The low bid for the Powerhouse Park Project was received from RCS Construction Inc. for \$220,000. The budget for this project is \$200,000 with \$75,000 coming out of Historic Preservation, \$75,000 coming out of the General Fund, \$50,000 coming out of the LWCF Grant and reallocate \$20,000 from the Gateway Landscape Project CIP Project. The LWCF Grant must be used in 2016 or it will be forfeited.

Along with the Powerhouse Park Project the City advertised for a Historic Preservation Contractor to oversee the site, stabilize the powerhouse smokestack and construct a re-creation of a portion of the smokestack for a 3D exhibit of what used to be on the property. The City received one proposal from Custom Décor Masonry Inc. in the amount of \$19,346.63.

The Powerhouse Park Project and the Historic Preservation Contractor portion of Powerhouse Park go hand in hand and BOTH should either be approved or denied.

If both the projects listed above are approved the remaining budget amount for the Gateway Landscape/Sign project is \$35,653.37. If the projects listed above are not approved there will be \$75,000 available for this project. The bids presented are for five locations. 1. Wild Bill Hickok, 2. Gold Rush 1876, 3. Main Street, 4. Where Legends Were Born and 5. Where the Wild West Lives. The intent of separating the cost of each location is to have the ability to award as

many of the locations as possible within the budget. The Gateway Project can be approved as a single location or two locations as the budget allows.

Copies of the bids and quotes are attached for your review. The Planning and Zoning Office understands this may be confusing and discussion during the meeting may clear up questions or feel free to contact me prior to the meeting to get a better understanding of the budget versus the bid amounts.

#### **Potential Motions:**

**Powerhouse Park**: Approve/Deny the award of the Powerhouse Park Project to RCS Construction Inc. in the amount of \$220,000 to be paid from the CIP Project Fund, reallocate \$20,000 from the Gateway Landscape Project CIP Project Fund and direct the City Attorney to prepare a contract.

**Historic Preservation Contractor**: Approve/Deny the award of the quote for the Historic Preservation Contractor in conjunction with the Powerhouse Park Project to Custom Décor Masonry in the amount of \$19,346.63 to be paid from the Gateway Landscape Project CIP Project Fund and direct the City Attorney to prepare a contract.

**Gateway Landscape Project:** Based on the outcome of the Powerhouse Park Projects the City Commission will decide which locations they wish to fund based on the \$75,000 balance or the \$35,653.37 balance and direct the City Attorney to prepare a contract. Bob,

Thank you for asking Tallgrass Landscape Architecture to submit this proposal to develop a restoration / renovation plan for Whitewood Creek between the 76th Drive and McKinley Street bridges. We really enjoy working with you and are excited for this new creek habitat project.

From our conversation, we understand that you have a vision to systematically improve Whitewood Creek throughout Deadwood. This will be a long term program that restores the creek habitat, improves recreation access, decreases erosion and sedimentation, and enhances the riparian plant communities while cleaning up overgrowth and dead plants. The long term goals of the restoration are to create a stable stream system and improved water quality, as well as enhanced aquatic habitat (better active recreating like fishing) and aesthetic value (better passive recreation like walking) for the community of Deadwood and its visitors who enjoy the creek. The initial 2016 project is intended to be the model for future creek improvements, demonstrating the value and benefits of the process.

In order to identify the physical attributes and limitations of the site relative to the Project Program, the Landscape Architect shall coordinate with Survey and City Staff to:

- A. Identify existing site conditions and features such as topography, drainage patterns, vegetation, including significant specimen plants, water elements, structures, views, known off-site considerations and previous planning documents relevant to the Project Program and as they pertain to project
- B. Confirm general location of utilities as they pertain to project
- **C.** Analyze existing site conditions to identify physical attributes and limitations of the Project site as they pertain to project
- D. Conduct site visits as necessary to review and catalogue these items
- E. Review applicable governmental requirements, including zoning, ordinances and permit requirements, known special restrictions, and zoning conditions as they pertain to project
- F. Advise the owner of tests and surveys, such as soils analysis, topographic survey, utility survey, and/or property boundary survey, that may be required as they pertain to the project
- G. Submit findings in the form of the following deliverables:
  - i. letter or memo summarizing the findings, if requested
  - ii. plan view drawing summarizing the physical attributes and limitations, if requested
  - iii. summary description of needed tests and surveys, if requested
  - iv. summary of specific restoration issues pertinent to this section of the creek

Based on the Site Analysis Phase findings, the Landscape Architect shall explore design options and develop a schematic design through the following:

- H. Participate in meetings with City Staff / SD GF&P (if necessary) to determine programmatic elements of the proposed improvements.
- Prepare studies and relational diagrams for the organization and placement of proposed creek improvements taking in consideration the existing site features and other program requirements
- J. Prepare drawings illustrating design concepts for the form and configuration of creek improvements.
- K. Evaluate alternative design concepts and, in conjunction with the Owner, identify preferred design concepts to address the restoration issues relevant to this section of the creek.

Old Charles Street Bridge

At the March 9, 2016 Historic Preservation Commission meeting, the commission reviewed and held extensive discussion about the following options along with some additional options for the Charles Street Bridge.

The commissioners and City staff held on-site inspections and lengthy discussions on the future of the old Charles Street Bridge located at the intersection of Charles and Cliff Streets. The bridge is currently closed for safety reasons and upon a closer review it has been determined there needs to be a resolution in regards to the bridge's future. Staff determined there are at least three potential options regarding the future of the bridge. They are detailed on the following pages with some pros and cons of each option considered.

The Historic Preservation Commission is recommending to the City Commission approve Option 2: Disassemble the bridge and store for future use.

This options includes carefully disassembling the bridge and the metal components saved with all the wood structure discarded. At a future time the metal components could be rehabilitated and the bridge could be repurposed at a Deadwood location to be identified in the future.

**Recommended Motion:** Move to direct staff to further explore disassembling of the bridge for future use and finalize costs associated with this option.

#### Option 1: Demolition of Bridge

This option includes retiring the bridge though demolition with the metal taken to a salvage yard for recycling and the wood taken to the rubble site. Prior to demolition there would be a comprehensive historic recordation and documentation of the bridge. During the recordation, a few components from the bridge should be identified for salvage and for historical reference or future interpretation. A contractor would be hired for the demolition. The City could provide assistance to perform the work. A historic preservation consultant would be hired for the recordation and documentation work.

City estimates: \$17,500 demolition / \$1,750 historic documentation

<u>Pros</u>: Liability eliminated, aesthetics of the neighborhood improved, least expensive option, no future costs associated.

Cons: Loss of historical resource

#### Option 2: Disassemble bridge for future use

A more complete recordation and documentation of the historic bridge would be needed to allow reconstruction in the future. The bridge would then be disassembled carefully and the metal components saved with all the wood structure discarded. At a future time the metal components could be rehabilitated and the bridge could be repurposed at a Deadwood location to be identified in the future. One identified location could be near the Days of 76 Campground for a pedestrian access over Whitewood Creek to a future extension of Whitewood Creek Trail. This option requires a contractor along with city assistance to perform the work for the removal. Rehabilitation and reconstruction of the bridge would be contracted in a future project.

City estimate: \$35,000 / \$2,750 historic documentation

<u>Pros</u>: Liability eliminated, aesthetics of the neighborhood improved, potential for future trail development, cost benefit may be the highest value long term, adaptive reuse of historic structure.

<u>Cons</u>: Loss of historical resource in its current location, future costs will be associated, restoration and reconstruction anticipated to be expensive.

#### Option 3: Rehabilitate bridge in current location

This option involves the professional services of a qualified engineering firm to create plans and specifications to rehabilitate the bridge in its current location for pedestrian use. The plans would include the historic recordation and documentation of the bridge. All work related to this option would be done by outside contractors.

City estimate: \$250,000 including engineering fees.

<u>Pros</u>: Liability eliminated, aesthetics of the neighborhood improved, pedestrian access to neighborhood not altered, and preservation of the historical resource in its current location.

<u>Cons</u>: Most expensive immediate alternative, doubles up on pedestrian access to the same location.

Waiver of Banner Restrictions

The Deadwood Gulch Resort recently requested information about banner signage during road construction and within the construction area. As proposed the banners are not allowed based on the City of Deadwood code below:

Banners are generally not allowed. However, when used in connection with a special or civic event are allowed with a permit, available through the city, at a rate of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) per business, per banner, per calendar year - multiple banners may be included in one application, however each banner in such application is subject to the fee; provided the event is sponsored by a not-for-profit organization or a governmental agency. Special events shall be designated by the city commission. The permit fee may be waived for a nonprofit organization, provided it obtains a permit from the city. All such banners and signs shall be allowed to be placed no sooner than seventy-two (72) hours prior to the beginning of the event and removed within forty-eight (48) hours after the termination of the event. All banners displayed under this clause must explicitly and clearly promote the special or civic event or include the promotion of Historic Deadwood by including the following language, "Welcome to Historic Deadwood." A permit must be obtained and issued by the zoning administrator and the building inspector. The banners must be approved by the zoning administrator and the building inspector.

Banners hung pursuant to this section must primarily and principally specify the special or civic event, OR with the text "Welcome to Historic Deadwood" primarily and principally displayed. The banner must be made of water-resistant materials and placed on a building facade during the promoted special or civic event in compliance with the existing sign ordinance. It may not

exceed ninety-six (96) square feet in area. No variances to this size limit may be approved by the planning and zoning commission. It shall be a single-piece sign with no attachments or additions, including but not limited to, the addition of any handwritten letters or symbols. Only one (1) banner may be placed on any one (1) side of a building or facade. Banners may be placed on

temporary structures, including but not limited to, stages or fences that are constructed for special or civic events. An applicant who wishes to appeal the decision of the zoning administrator and the building inspector may appeal to the planning and zoning commission as provided by statute.

As you will notice that banners are 'generally not allowed' except for during designated special events, there are circumstances that are currently creating hardships on the service and business industry along the Highway 85 corridor in the form of Highway Reconstruction. The businesses in the construction area are going to be challenged with marketing and letting clients and customers know that they are open for business or to entice people to visit their establishments. I am sure that more of these requests will be submitted throughout the summer months as businesses contend with the highway 85 reconstruction. Below is a possible action that could be taken.

#### Action:

Approve/Deny allowing the Zoning Administrator and the Building Inspector to approve or deny banner applications for businesses with a maximum of two banners per business in the Highway 85 construction area from Walnut Street to Highway 385 during the reconstruction period of April 1st to October 1st of 2016.

#### **SUMMARY**

In the area behind Tin Lizzie Casino, the fencing that was attached to the guard rail was falling down due to deterioration of the fence itself. This had been installed to prevent pedestrians from crossing the four lane highway from the Railroad St. parking lot to the Tin Lizzie parking lot (a very dangerous act). The fencing was a safety hazard and had to be removed.

I approached the SDDOT to see if they could participate in replacing the fencing. After a site visit with the SDDOT, it was determined that the guard rail would also need replacing. This would be entirely at their cost. They also indicated that they would be willing to pay for half the cost of installing the new fencing. The SDDOT has drawn up an agreement to provide for this cost sharing with each party being responsible for \$16,498.18 of the \$32,996.35 which was the low quote we received.

#### RECCOMMENDATION

It is my recommendation that the Commission permit the Mayor to sign the agreement with the SDDOT for installation of the new fencing. The City's portion to be paid for from the Street Dept. repair budget.

Days of 76 Museum - Carriage Exhibits

During this year's Capital Improvement Planning (CIP) meetings, Deadwood History, Inc. identified a concern regarding the Days of 76 Museum and the collection. Several of the horse-drawn vehicles in the carriage gallery have begun to show noticeable structural changes due to low levels of relative humidity. When relative humidity levels are too low, wood loses moisture and shrinks. Numerous wooden wagon wheels have begun to show signs of shrinkage due to low humidity levels. Not only is it expensive to repair the damage, it also presents a potential danger to individuals who use the wagons in parades, events or other occasions.

The CIP committee has recommended the installation of a climate control system to regulate humidity in the carriage gallery this spring. It was not identified during last year's budget process; however the committee felt it was necessary to be a priority for 2016. This project includes installation of the humidity system, electrical work along with a glass door to enclose the gallery from the lobby area. See attached quotes for work to be done on the Days of 76 Museum Carriage gallery.

TYPE 2 Self-Guiding Parallel Parking



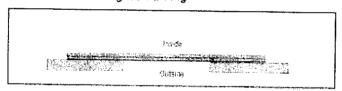
TYPE 3 - Self-Guiding 135 Degree Parallel Parking



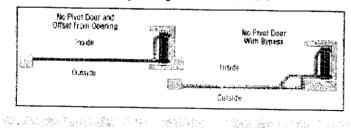
TYPE 4 - Bi-Parting Perpendicular Parking with Pivot Doors

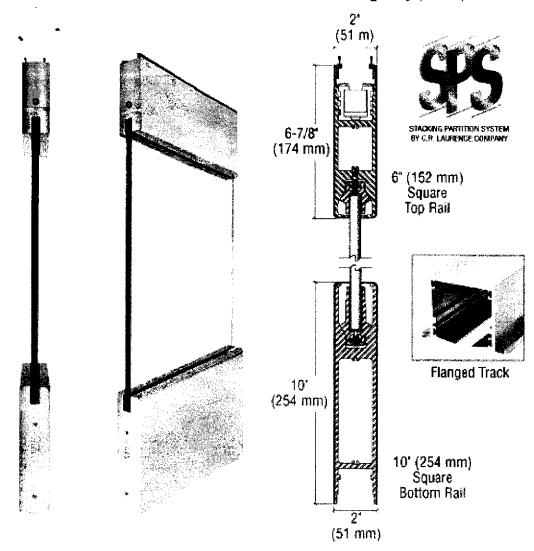


TYPE 5 - Bi-Parting No Parking

#### MEMORANDUM TO THE MAYOR AND THE CITY COMMISSION

Subject: Main St Water Valves

#### **SUMMARY**

The water valves on our Main St. water main were installed with bolts that are not corrosion resistant. Recently we have been experiencing water leaks due to the failure of these bolts. We expect this to continue in the future and have no way of controlling when these leaks may occur It is better to be proactive and replace the bolts with stainless steel bolts when we can control the shut downs times. We have identified an area that has four valves at the intersection of Wall and Main Streets that we feel is high priority. This area has two 12 in. valves, one 6 inch valve and one 4 inch valve that require bolts to be replaced and inspections performed.

We budgeted to do this proactive work this year and have quotes from three different contractors with the low quote being \$7,820.00.

#### RECCOMMENDATION

It is my recommendation that the Commission permit the Mayor to sign a Contract with Mainline Contracting, Inc. to perform the work outlined above for the amount of \$7,820.00

The City of Deadwood is looking to partner with a Contractor to do some maintenance on our City water main valves on Main Street. The primary concern for these valves are the condition of the valve bolts. In the past, we have had, several leaks develop where the valve bolts have failed. We anticipate this problem to be an on-going issue for the City and want to get out in front of the problem by, at a minimum, replacing the valve bolts and inspecting the condition of these valves.

The first set of valves we want to work on are the four valves near the intersection of Main St. and Wall St. There are two 12" valves, a 6" valve and a 4" valve at this location. In order to perform this work we anticipate the need to shut the water supply off to several businesses in this area. This will require coordination with the City and notification to all businesses impacted. Minimizing the water outage to these businesses is of the utmost concern.

Traffic control during this project is a concern. One lane of traffic on Main St. will need to be maintained at all times, which may require flaggers to control the flow. Additionally, access to and from the City Parking Ramp from Wall St. will need to be maintained at all times as well.

The City's responsibilities for this project include the following work.

- Control of and operation of the water valves to isolate the area to be worked on
- Removal of the brick street pavers
- Cutting of the underlying concrete pavement.
- Inspection of the valves and determining the work required on the valves (Water Superintendent)
- Supplying replacement bolts and O rings for the valves
- Replacing the brick street pavers.

The Contractor's responsibilities for this project include the following work:

- Removal and disposal of the existing concrete paving
- Excavation of the valves and temporary removal of the valve boxes
- Replacing valve bonnet bolts, valve body bolts and valve pipe connection bolts as determined by the City Water Superintendent.
- · Re-installation of the valve boxes and adjustment to final grade
- Installation of back-fill under "The City of Rapid City Specifications"- including the possibility
  of replacing existing fill material with imported acceptable fill material. (Water
  Superintendent to determine)
- Placement of 6" thick concrete to subgrade depth to allow City crews to install bricks to final grade. The new concrete is to be doweled into existing concrete with 5/8" smooth dowel pins 10" long with 5" imbed and 24" on center.

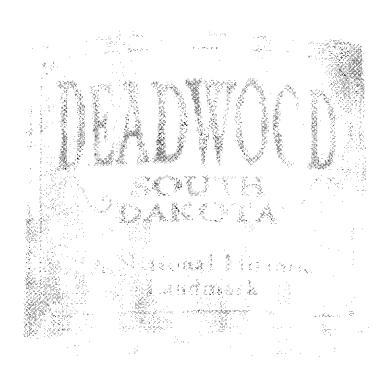

# AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF DEADWOOD AND MAINLINE CONTRACTING, INC.

THIS AGREEMENT is by and between the CITY OF DEADWOOD, a municipal corporation of 102 Sherman Street, Deadwood, South Dakota 57732, hereinafter referred to as "CITY," and MAINLINE CONTRACTING, INC., of P.O. Box 3448, Rapid City, SD 57709, South Dakota, hereinafter referred to as "MAINLINE;"

WHEREAS, MAINLINE; has agreed to perform maintenance on the CITY's water main valves on Main Street, for a total sum not to exceed Seven Thousand Eight Hundred Twenty and no/100s Dollars (\$7,820.00), plus applicable tax, and

WHEREAS, the purpose of this agreement, herein referred to as the "Agreement," is to set forth the terms and conditions for which MAINLINE shall perform the maintenance of water main valves on Main Street; and

WHEREAS, the CITY has accepted the proposal from MAINLINE and based upon the representations made above, the parties agree as follows:

- 1. The Recitals set forth above are herein incorporated and made part of this Agreement;
- 2. MAINLINE shall perform maintenance on four (4) valves, consisting of two 12" valves, a 6" valve and a 4" valve, near the intersection of Main Street and Wall Street, Deadwood, South Dakota;
- 3. CITY shall control and operate the water valves to isolate the affected area;
- 4. MAINLINE shall coordinate with CITY regarding shutting the water off in the impacted area and notification of the businesses affected by the shut-off;
- 5. MAINLINE shall coordinate with CITY regarding traffic control during the project, ensuring safety at all times and allowing access to city parking ramp from Wall Street at all times;

- CITY shall remove brick street pavers;
- 7. CITY shall cut underlying concrete pavement;
- 8. MAINLINE shall remove and dispose of the existing concrete paving;
- 9. MAINLINE shall excavate valves and temporarily remove valve boxes;
- 10. CITY shall inspect valves and determine work required;
- 11. MAINLINE shall replace valve bonnet bolts, valve body bolts and valve pipe connection bolts as determined by the City Water Superintendent;
- 12. CITY shall supply replacement bolts and O-rings for the valves;
- 13. MAINLINE shall reinstall back-fill material pursuant to the "City of Rapid City Specifications", including replacing existing fill material with imported acceptable fill material as determined by the City Water Superintendent;
- 14. MAINLINE shall place 6" thick concrete to subgrade depth to allow city crews to install bricks to final grade. MAINLINE shall dowel the new concrete into existing concrete with 5/8" smooth dowel pins 10" long with 5" imbedded and 24" on center;
- 15. CITY shall replace brick street pavers
- 16. MAINLINE shall perform these services with reasonable diligence and expediency consistent with sound professional practices.
- 17. All work will be subject to a final inspection by the City Water Superintendent before acceptance;

MAINLINE agrees to indemnify and hold harmless CITY and any of its officers, agents, and employees from any and all liabilities, actions, causes of actions, claims or executions of any character, including attorney's fees, or any sums which CITY may have to pay to any person on account of any personal or bodily injury, death or property damage, which results from any negligent act, error or omission of MAINLINE in connection with this agreement or services performed

or materials provided pursuant to this contract;

- 21. CITY may, at its option, terminate this agreement for any reason upon thirty (30) days notice to MAINLINE;
