Discussion

Chief Fuller spoke on behalf of Parking and Transportation Committee who was approached by a local business requesting a portable sidewalk café. He stated this is a concept Roger Brooks brought forth from Revitalization Committee which involves a bump out for restaurant seating along the curb in front of a business. He stated some issues to consider include alcohol on public property, which businesses could accommodate portable sidewalk cafes due to street width, tour buses, trolleys and daily deliveries on Main Street. Chief Fuller requested that Commission provide direction to Parking and Transporation Committee. After discussion, Commission requested that Revitalization Committee prepare a proposal for review and forward to city attorney prior to placement on agenda.

First Reading

Discussion was held on first reading of Ordinance #1226 for Dangerous Wild/Exotic Animal Prohibited. Attorney Riggins explained that he assisted the public with preparation of the proposed ordinance and that the ordinance grandfathers the two existing businesses with permits under state law. Riggins also directed Commission to review item "O" regarding assessment of a fee. Commissioner Van Den Eykel stated guidelines are already followed with Planning and Zoning and questioned the necessity of this ordinance. Mayor Turbiville allowed comment from Joe Kosel and Tom Huhnerhoch concerning issues with the animals and said ordinance. Terri Petter, owner of Fur-Ever Wild also spoke regarding her present operation and provided an alternative view. After discussion among Commissioners and Attorney Riggins regarding merits of the proposed ordinance and possible amendments, Ruth moved, Todd seconded to approve first reading of Ordinance #1226 for Dangerous Wild/Exotic Animal Prohibited. Roll Call: Aye-Ruth, Speirs, Todd, Turbiville. Nay-Van Den Eykel. Motion carried.

Locally cultivating and selling foods and crafts, Dahl McLean and Talli Nauman are the proprietors of Moonrise Mountain Enterprises, which we established in 2004.

We are asking for a permit for the use of the described city property for a Farmer's Market in recognition of Deadwood's origins, which were reliant on the local supply of food from milk producers at the dairy of the historic Anderson Ranch adjacent to our place and on fruits, vegetables and grains grown in our part of Lawrence County.

We would need the permission to set up and operate with our canopies, tables, and signs every Friday from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. from July through October, beginning in 2015. The specific dates for 2015 are: July 3, 10, 27, 24, and 31; Aug. 7, 14, 21, and 28; Sept. 4, 11, 18, and 25; Oct. 2, 9, 16, 23 and 30. We agree with Chamber of Commerce Executive Director Lee Harstad to refrain from operation if it would create a conflict with scheduled events at the premises leased to that entity.

We have operated a Farmers Market in Deadwood on private property at the northeast corner of Pine and Sherman streets since 2011. One or two other producers with tables and canopies join us. We wish to relocate our market stand to the Deadwood and Siever Street address to become a more visible and integrated part of the city's tourism trade.

Farmers will unload vehicles at the location at 9 a.m. and remove them to designated parking areas, as we have in past years, for the duration of the market, which is from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m., when we reload the vehicles, clean the area, departing by 2 p.m.

While this is a very low-impact activity, we are responsible for and commit to maintaining the area we use to avoid any degradation of the property as it now exists and to safeguard its attractiveness. Tasks we perform to assure this include: sweeping, gathering litter, washing spills, and off-site disposal of trash in designated receptacles.

As farmers, we have proof of insurance and a South Dakota sales tax license.

We have received verbal expressions of hearty support and endorsement for using the venue as a Farmers Market from the operators of the private property and business interests surrounding the proposed public site:

CITY FIVE CENT SLOT MACHINE LEASE AND OPERATING AGREEMENT

This Agreement is made and entered into on this 16th day of June, 2015, by and between FIRST GOLD HOTEL AND GAMING, of Deadwood, South Dakota, hereinafter referred to as OWNER, and the CITY OF DEADWOOD, a municipal corporation of the State of South Dakota, hereinafter referred to as DEADWOOD.

WITNESSETH

The parties acknowledge that Deadwood has been authorized by SDCL 42-7B-44 to purchase or lease fifty (50) up to and including five-cent (5¢) slot machines to be placed in businesses with retail gaming licenses. The parties further acknowledge that Deadwood has advertised for and requested bids for leasing space in retail licensed gaming businesses, for leasing from gaming businesses up to and including five-cent slot machines, and entering into agreement for the operation of said up to and including five-cent slot machines. The parties further acknowledge that OWNER was a successful bidder for TEN (10) up to and including five-cent (5¢) slot machines in the total amount of EIGHTY THOUSAND AND No/100ths Dollars (\$80,000.00) per year.

NOW THEREFORE, it is agreed by and between OWNER and DEADWOOD as follows:

- 1) For and in consideration of the sum of Zero Dollars (\$0.00) per year, to be paid from DEADWOOD to OWNER, OWNER agrees to let and lease to the City of Deadwood five (5) up to and including five-cent (5¢) slot machines along with sufficient space in OWNER'S retail licensed business for said TEN (10) up to and including five-cent (5¢) slot machines, for a period of three (3) years with said lease payment due and payable from the City of Deadwood to OWNER at the end of the three (3) year lease period.
- 2) For and in consideration of the sum of EIGHTY THOUSAND AND No/100ths Dollars (\$80,000.00) per year for TEN (10) machines to be paid from OWNER to DEADWOOD, OWNER shall be entitled to keep and receive all revenue from such machines. OWNER agrees to operate and maintain said up to and including five-cent (5¢) slot machines during the three (3) year lease period term commencing on the 1st day of July, 2015, and ending on the 30th day of June, 2018, for the use and benefit of DEADWOOD. This sum in the amount of EIGHTY THOUSAND AND No/100ths DOLLARS (\$80,000.00) per year shall be payable as follows:
 - a) The sum of TWENTY THOUSAND AND No/100ths Dollars (\$20,000.00) shall be due and payable on or before the 30th day of June, in the years of 2015, 2016 and 2017.
 - b) Monthly payments for the balance owing each year after the "down payment" is made in the amount of FIVE THOUSAND FOUR HUNDRED FIFTY FOUR AND 55/100 Dollars (\$5,454.55) per month all of which shall be due and payable on or before the 31st day of the month for the months of July through May of each year of this lease with the first payment due and payable in such amount on or before the 31st day of July, 2015, and like payment on the 31st day of each month thereafter.

- 3) Such payments shall be made to the City of Deadwood as net proceeds generated from the operation of the up to and including five-cent (5¢) slot machines under this Agreement to be forwarded by DEADWOOD to the South Dakota Commission on Gaming for deposit in the South Dakota Gaming Commission fund.
- OWNER shall be responsible for all maintenance, repairs, and all other operations connected with the up to and including five-cent $(5\not e)$ slot machines including all record keeping, accounting, and such other requirements or procedures as may be imposed or required at any time by DEADWOOD or the South Dakota Commission on Gaming.
- 5) The City up to and including five-cent (5¢) slot machines placed under this agreement shall be licensed and stamped by the South Dakota Commission on Gaming. Neither this Lease Agreement nor any rights obtained hereunder may be transferred to any other retail licensee without the express written consent of DEADWOOD.
- In the event that South Dakota laws are changed so as to allow for an increase in the number of gaming devices allowed per building for any building in Deadwood by more than twenty-five percent (25%), OWNER shall have the right to terminate this Lease upon ninety (90) days written notice to DEADWOOD prior to the end of the year for which OWNER wishes to terminate this Lease, at which time the CITY will be allowed to enter into a lease and operating agreement or other agreement for up to and including five-cent (5¢) slot machines at any other retail licensed gaming business in the City of Deadwood.
- The Except as set forth above, OWNER shall not have the right to terminate this Lease at any time during the lease period and in the event that OWNER fails to make any payment required herein when due, DEADWOOD may immediately cancel and terminate this Lease and operating agreement provided, however, that such cancellation and termination shall not relieve OWNER of its obligation to make all of the payments required under this agreement as penalty and liquidated damages. OWNER specifically acknowledges that said penalty and liquidated damages are fair and due and owing DEADWOOD and specifically acknowledges the right of DEADWOOD to collect the same in the event of default by OWNER in the making of any payment when due under this agreement. OWNER further specifically agrees that upon such cancellation and termination DEADWOOD may enter into a Lease Agreement with another retail licensed business for such canceled or terminated nickel slot machines.
- 8) OWNER acknowledges and agrees to the extent that this Agreement is contingent upon an appropriation by the City of Deadwood being made available for the purpose of paying lease payments under this Lease and if such funding is not available from such sources, or in the event sufficient money is not appropriated, this Lease is null and void and said Lease shall expire at the end of the fiscal year for which the last funding shall be made available for the lease payments required under this Lease. Further, in the event that this Lease or any City of Deadwood action or preceding or provision of SDCL 42-7(b) is declared illegal or unlawful or amended so as to remove authorization for this Lease, or in event that any action or proceeding by the City of Deadwood is set aside by reason of a legal challenge or referral, this Lease shall be null and void and terminated without penalty to DEADWOOD.
- 9) OWNER agrees to indemnify and hold harmless CITY and any of its officers, agents, and employees from any and all liabilities, actions, causes of

actions, claims or executions of any character, including attorney's fees, or any sums which CITY may have to pay to any person on account of any personal or bodily injury, death or property damage, which results from any negligent act, error or omission of FIRST GOLD HOTEL AND GAMING in connection with this agreement or services performed or materials provided pursuant to this contract.

10) In further consideration of the sums to be paid OWNER to DEADWOOD under this agreement, DEADWOOD grants to OWNER an option to extend the term of this agreement for an additional three (3) years from and after the expiration of this agreement on the 30th day of June, 2017. This option may be exercised by OWNER by giving DEADWOOD written notice of its intent to exercise this option, which notice must be received by DEADWOOD on or before the 30th day of April, 2018.

CITY FIVE CENT SLOT MACHINE LEASE AND OPERATING AGREEMENT

This Agreement is made and entered into on this 16th day of June, 2015, by and between SILVERADO GAMING, of Deadwood, South Dakota, hereinafter referred to as OWNER, and the CITY OF DEADWOOD, a municipal corporation of the State of South Dakota, hereinafter referred to as DEADWOOD.

WITNESSETH

The parties acknowledge that Deadwood has been authorized by SDCL 42-7B-44 to purchase or lease fifty (50) up to and including five-cent (5¢) slot machines to be placed in businesses with retail gaming licenses. The parties further acknowledge that Deadwood has advertised for and requested bids for leasing space in retail licensed gaming businesses, for leasing from gaming businesses up to and including five-cent slot machines, and entering into agreement for the operation of said up to and including five-cent slot machines. The parties further acknowledge that OWNER was a successful bidder for FIVE (5) up to and including five-cent (5¢) slot machines in the total amount of FORTY TWO THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED AND No/100ths Dollars (\$42,500.00) per year.

NOW THEREFORE, it is agreed by and between OWNER and DEADWOOD as follows:

- 1) For and in consideration of the sum of Zero Dollars (\$0.00) per year, to be paid from DEADWOOD to OWNER, OWNER agrees to let and lease to the City of Deadwood five (5) up to and including five-cent (5¢) slot machines along with sufficient space in OWNER'S retail licensed business for said FIVE (5) up to and including five-cent (5¢) slot machines, for a period of three (3) years with said lease payment due and payable from the City of Deadwood to OWNER at the end of the three (3) year lease period.
- For and in consideration of the sum of FORTY TWO THOUSAND AND FIVE HUNDRED AND No/100ths Dollars (\$42,500.00) per year for FIVE (5) machines to be paid from OWNER to DEADWOOD, OWNER shall be entitled to keep and receive all revenue from such machines. OWNER agrees to operate and maintain said up to and including five-cent (5ϕ) slot machines during the three (3) year lease period term commencing on the 1st day of July, 2015, and ending on the 30th day of June, 2018, for the use and benefit of DEADWOOD. This sum in the amount of FORTY TWO THOUSAND AND FIVE HUNDRED AND No/100ths Dollars (\$42,500.00) per year shall be payable as follows:
 - a) The sum of TEN THOUSAND SIX HUNDRED TWENTY FIVE AND No/100ths Dollars (\$10,625.00) shall be due and payable on or before the 30th day of June, in the years of 2015, 2016 and 2017.
 - b) Monthly payments for the balance owing each year after the "down payment" is made in the amount of TWO THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED NINETY SEVEN AND 73/100 Dollars (\$2,897.73) per month all of which shall be due and payable on or before the 31st day of the month for the months of July through May of each year of this lease with the first payment due and payable in such amount on or before the 31st day of July, 2015, and like payment on the 31st day of each month thereafter.

- 5) The City up to and including five-cent (5¢) slot machines placed under this agreement shall be licensed and stamped by the South Dakota Commission on Gaming. - In the event that South Dakota laws are changed so as to allow for an increase in the number of gaming devices allowed per building for any building in Deadwood by more than twenty-five percent (25%), OWNER shall have the right to terminate this Lease upon ninety (90) days written notice to DEADWOOD prior to the end of the year for which OWNER wishes to terminate this Lease, at which time the CITY will be allowed to enter into a lease and operating agreement or other agreement for up to and including five-cent (5¢) slot machines at any other retail licensed gaming business in the City of Deadwood.

Thank you very much for your consideration. FMG is pleased to present the following revised work scope and cost estimate for geotechnical services in support of the proposed project. We have revised our previous proposal dated June 12, 2015 to include: Phase 1 – Geotechnical Evaluation and Phase 2 – Concrete and Soils Testing scopes and costs, per the scope of work recommendations provided by Albertson Engineering.

General Background

We understand the City of Deadwood plans to reconstruct the lower main street parking lot. The reconstruction will include new asphalt and concrete pavement, landscaping improvements, a new pedestrian bridge across Whitewood Creek, and a new one-story, 9,218 ft² visitor center building. A geotechnical evaluation of the existing subsurface conditions and geotechnical recommendations for the proposed construction are required. We have received and reviewed the proposed scope of work developed by Advanced Engineering and Environmental Services, Inc. (AE2S). Construction period services including cast-in-place concrete testing and soil compaction testing will also be required.

This proposal outlines our project approach and costs to provide these services.

Phase 1 - Geotechnical Evaluation

Task 1.1 - Project Management and Coordination

FMG will assign a Project Manager who will act as the primary client contact, coordinate and direct the primary project tasks, interface with the internal project engineers and geologists, attend meetings and interface with other primary project consultants, maintain the project information, and oversee the project schedule and budget.

The Project Engineers and Geologists will be responsible for the primary field and laboratory work execution, analysis and coordination, and final report production.

For this project the primary project team is anticipated to be as follows:

Task 1.2 - Geotechnical Exploration

To evaluate the existing soil conditions and determine the appropriate geotechnical design parameters, the following boring schedule is planned:

- Thirteen (13) boreholes will be drilled in the general locations recommended by AE2S.
- Of the 13 boreholes, 5 will be drilled within the proposed building footprint, and the remaining 8 will be drilled within pavement areas, the bridge abutment area, retaining wall areas and landscaped areas.

Field testing will be performed, and samples will be extracted for further laboratory analysis.

Assumptions:

- Boreholes within structure footprints and retaining/abutment structure areas will be drilled to minimum depths of 20 feet.
- Boreholes within pavement areas will be drilled to minimum depths of 5 feet.
- Fill materials, soft or otherwise unsuitable bearing soils at depth may require additional borehole depth.
- Specific borehole locations will be determined in the field by FMG, Inc. based on descriptions and
 drawings of the project layout provided by the client or the project architect. Locations may be
 adjusted as necessary to avoid existing overhead and underground utilities.
- Boreholes within existing pavement areas will be patched with grout.
- FMG, Inc. Geologist will log the boreholes.
- Auger drilling methods will be utilized.
- Sampling will consist of SPT and Shelby Tube (thin wall tube).
- Wireline coring of bedrock or heavy alluvium after auger refusal is beyond the scope of this
 geotechnical exploration.
- Right of entry and site access is provided for conventional two-wheeled drive vehicles.
- FMG will conduct a utility location via One Call.
- FMG will coordinate as necessary with the City for site access dates and times.

Task 1.3 - Laboratory Testing

Select soil samples will be tested in our laboratory to determine their general classification, physical properties, and engineering characteristics. The following tests are planned to provide the required geotechnical parameters. The testing will be completed in accordance with applicable ASTM testing procedures.

- Natural Moisture Content and Density.
- Standard Sieve Analysis.
- Atterberg Limits.
- Unconfined Compressive Strength Testing.
- One-dimensional Consolidation/Swell Testing.
- Other specific laboratory tests may be performed as necessary for the soil types encountered.

Task 1.4 - Report Preparation

Upon completion of the field and laboratory testing and our analysis, a report will be prepared that transmits the boring logs and field data and laboratory results, provides a limited geologic analysis of the area, and provides our recommendations for foundation design of the various structures and pavement thickness design. In general our recommendations will include the recommended foundation types, placement and design parameters, and fill placement recommendations. The report will also include the general and site specific construction recommendations that we consider applicable, such as groundwater, retaining/abutment wall design parameters, utility installations, sidewalk sections, site drainage, and anticipated construction challenges.

Phase 2—Concrete and Soils Testing for Visitor Center Structure

We understand the scope of work to be considered for Phase 2 shall be:

- · Cast-in-place concrete testing for the Visitor Center structure, and
- Soil compaction testing services for the Visitor Center structure.

A brief description of the type and estimated number of tests required for the above testing follows. This should be considered an estimate based on the description of the project provided. The actual number of trips to the site and tests may vary during construction based on the contractors approach to the project and pace of construction. However, we will not exceed our estimates for this portion of the testing scope of work without justification and prior approval from the City of Deadwood.

Additional construction materials testing services will be required for other project items and improvements, but are not able to be accurately defined at this point in the project. We understand these additional testing services will be negotiated with the selected geotechnical firm once the final project plans and specifications are completed. As such, costs associated with construction materials testing beyond that listed above for the Visitor Center structure are beyond the scope of this proposal. We anticipate the additional construction materials testing services will include, but may not be limited to:

- Structural steel testing and special inspections,
- Parking lot subgrade inspection and compaction testing,
- Asphalt pavement/PCC pavement material testing,
- Bridge foundation concrete testing,
- Retaining wall concrete testing,
- Retaining wall backfill compaction testing,
- · Utility trench backfill compaction testing,
- · Compaction or concrete testing associated with larger landscaping features, and
- Concrete flatwork and curb & gutter concrete testing.

<u> Task 2.1 – Cast-in-place Concrete Testing</u>

We estimate cast-in-place concrete testing for the Visitor Center structure will include shallow foundation elements, foundation walls and concrete slabs-on-grade.

Assumptions:

- Shallow foundation elements 3 placements, 1 test per placement.
- Foundation walls 3 placements, 1 test per placement.
- Slabs-on-grade 2 placements, 1 test per placement.

Task 2.2 - Soil Compaction Testing

As described in Albertson Engineering's scope of work recommendations, we agree that it is possible that some degree of overexcavation and refill with engineered fill will be necessary to correct soft foundation and slab subgrade conditions. As such, we estimate soil compaction testing for the Visitor Center structure will entail compaction testing of said engineered fill, foundation and floor slab subgrade, and foundation and wall backfill.

Assumptions:

- Engineered fill 2 trips.
- Foundation and floor slab subgrade 1 trip.
- Foundation and wall backfill 2 trips.

General Phase 2 Assumptions

Where possible, we will attempt to combine services on trips to the job-site. For example, in coordination with the contractor, compaction testing can also be performed during trips to the site for concrete testing. This can only occur during certain phases of the construction, but it does offer a chance for cost savings. To the extent practical, we will also work to eliminate "dead-leg" trips to the site to retrieve concrete cylinders. These trips can add unnecessary costs to a project. When able and within ACI specifications and time constraints, we will work to retrieve cylinders during other testing trips, or even coordinate with the contractor to bring the cylinders to our lab, if they happened to be local to Rapid City.

Schedule and Fees

Weather and site access permitting; we are available to begin the field services for the Phase 1work outlined in this proposal within approximately 5 days following notice to proceed, with approximately 4 weeks from time of drilling for completion of laboratory testing, analysis, *and* report preparation, for a total project timeframe of approximately 4 to 5 weeks. We will be available to verbally discuss the information with the design team and have some preliminary indications of subsurface and foundation conditions immediately after drilling.

We propose to complete the scopes of work described herein as outlined below.

Phase 1 – Geotechnical Evaluation	\$5,320.00
Phase 2 – Concrete and Soils Testing for Visitor Center Structure	\$4,047,00

The presented costs for Phase 2 – Concrete and Soils Testing for Visitor Center Structure are a rough estimation based on the description of the project in the RFP, the scope of work recommendations by Albertson Engineering and our experience with similar projects. We would be happy to revise this estimate based on the final project plans and specifications, our recommendations for overall project testing scope, and after discussions with the design team and selected contractor.

Enclosed are a detailed breakdown of the estimated Phase 2 costs, a Fee Schedule on which additional testing beyond those outlined herein can be based, and a copy of our Professional Liability Insurance certificate.

We will not exceed the cost estimates without justification, and prior approval.

All Angels Episcopal Church - Roof

The All Angels Episcopal Church of Spearfish is seeking an Outside of Deadwood Grant to assist in the cost of shingle removal, roof repair and placement of new shingles. Listed on the National Register of Historic Places, All Angels Episcopal Church was built in 1895 as a memorial to Alexander Hamilton. Spearfish and Deadwood have had a close relationship over the last century or more due to the Homestake Mine. In 1911 Homestake built a power plant on Spearfish Creek to provide consistent electrical power to the Homestake mine; several Spearfish citizens, who attended this church, were employed by Homestake. In addition, Spearfish was a source of the majority of fruit and vegetable produce consumed by citizens of Deadwood and surrounding areas.

Emmanuel Episcopal Church - Tuckpointing

The Emmanuel Episcopal Church in Rapid City is seeking an Outside of Deadwood Grant to assist restoration of mortar and tuckpointing project to preserve the integrity of the sandstone block/brick structure of church. Listed on the National Register of Historic Places, the Church's cornerstone was laid in 1887 making it the oldest church in Rapid City. Throughout its 127-year existence, the Emmanuel Episcopal Church remains closely tied to the Black Hills Deanery, which includes Episcopal Churches in Lead and Deadwood.

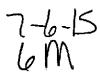

AGREEMENT BETWEEN CITY OF DEADWOOD AND BLACK HILLS STATE UNIVERSITY, INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR

This agreement is made by and between the CITY OF DEADWOOD, a municipal corporation with its principal place of business located at 108 Sherman Street, Deadwood, South Dakota 57732, (hereinafter referred to as "CITY") and BLACK HILLS STATE UNIVERSITY (hereinafter referred to as "BHSU"), as an Independent Contractor.

WHEREAS, the purpose of this agreement is to set forth the terms and conditions of the agreement between CITY and BHSU to provide conservation treatments on botanical specimens from the Deadwood Chinatown District; and

WHEREAS, BHSU has the experience and expertise to provide the requested conservation treatments; and

WHEREAS, based upon the representations and understanding of each party, CITY and BHSU agree as follows:

- 1. The Recitals set forth above are herein incorporated and made part of this Agreement;
- BHSU is an independent contractor and this agreement shall not be construed
 as creating any type of relationship, including, but not limited to, principal and agent, or
 employer and employee between CITY and BHSU.
- BHSU shall preserve all plant materials sampled during previous archaeological work as well as any samples, taken from the remaining areas in the Deadwood Chinatown district in 2015.
- 4. BHSU shall transport the previously sampled plant specimens to its oncampus facilities.
- 5. BHSU shall provide its own office space and equipment needed to meet the requirements of this Agreement.

- 6. BHSU shall mount whole plant specimens on archival herbarium paper, identify taxonomically to the extent that the specimen is able to be identified, and label the mounted specimens with scientific and common names.
- 7. BHUS shall transport seeds and plant fragments recovered from Chintatown privies and ceremonial pit areas in the early 2000s to BHSU facilities, and carefully sort and move the seeds and plant fragments into plastic vials with screw-top lids for long-term storage. Sample identification and accessioning will be maintained by labels within the vials by BHSU.
- 8. BHSU shall catalogue and summarize all data in a separate database created specifically for the Deadwood Chinatown District's seeds as well as within the BHSU herbarium database.
- 9. BHSU shall visit the remaining areas of the Deadwood Chinatown District approximately twice per month during the months of June, July and August of 2015, collect samples and taxonomically identify extant vascular plant species with the goal of determining if exotic and medicinal plant species have persisted at the site and to generate high quality herbarium collections of these species.
- 10. BHSU shall obtain the permission of the landowner to sample on private property and will avoid disturbance or soil erosion at the site. Samples of the aforementioned plant species shall be returned to BHSU facilities for pressing, drying, mounting and labeling. These new samples will be entered into the herbarium database.
- 11. The cost of the work performed in 2015, shall be Two Thousand Four Hundred and no/100s Dollars (\$2,400.00) for wages of a student employee, Darlene Coppe; plus Three Hundred Ninety-four and no/100s Dollars (\$394.00) for supplies as listed in the BHSU proposal. BHSU shall submit an invoice to CITY for the total amount of Two Thousand Eight Hundred Fifty and no/100s Dollars (\$2,850.00).

12.	BHSU shall not subcontract any of the services to be provided by this
agreement.	

- 13. The parties agree it is BHSU's responsibility to comply with all local and state laws relating to workman's compensation, register, report and pay all necessary taxes and insurance, including, but not limited to Social Security, FICA, Unemployment Insurance and comply with the Equal Employment Opportunities Act.
- 14. Either party may terminate this agreement upon providing the other party with thirty (30) days' notice, in writing, and served upon the other party via certified mail; however, within one (1) week of such notice, BHSU shall return samples to CITY and shall produce work completed at that time.
- 15. BHSU does not have the authority to hire any person other than those individuals named in its proposal on behalf of CITY.
- 16. This agreement and the rights and obligations of the parties shall be interpreted, construed and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of South Dakota; and

17.	This agreement constitute	es the entire agreement of the parties on its subject.

SUMMARY

We received only one Bid for this project, which came in at \$145,000.00. This was approximately 3 times the estimated cost. When investigating as to why other firms had not bid on this project, the primary reason given was, that due to the poor Spring weather most were so far behind on current projects they would be uncomfortable taking on additional work at this time.

RECCOMMENDATION

It is my recommendation that the Commission reject all bids and we re-bid the project in the Fall when we may have a more favorable bidding climate.

First Amendment to the Agreement for Administration of Deadwood Historic Preservation Loan and Grant Funds

7-6-15 9 A

As of July 1,2015 Article II of the "Agreement" will be revised:

HPC agrees to reimburse NHS for ELIGIBLE COSTS incurred by NHS pursuant to this Agreement, subject to a maximum of Forty three thousand four hundred fifty dollars (\$43,450) for the period beginning January 1, 2015 and ending on June 30, 2015.

And HPC agrees to reimburse NHS for ELIGIBLE COSTS incurred by NHS pursuant to this Agreement, subject to a Maximum of Thirty five thousand five hundred (\$37,500) for the period beginning July 1, 2015 and ending on December 31, 2015. The amount of such reimbursement shall be at hourly rates included in the attached Rate Sheet, with total amounts to be paid during this time period under this agreement not to exceed \$37,500, without prior express written approval and consent by HPC. For the purposes of this Agreement, ELIGIBLE COSTS shall mean costs to NHS of salaries, wages, and fringe benefits, office expense, worker's compensation insurance, liability insurance including officers and directors' liability insurance, utilities, and other necessary expenses. The parties acknowledge that NHS has other duties and functions and the HPC will only pay that portion of ELIGIBLE COSTS determined to be related to services performed for HPC by NHS pursuant to this Agreement. Request for reimbursement shall be made no more frequently than monthly and shall be accompanied by a voucher to be approved by the Historic Preservation Commission and the City Commission. All such reimbursement for ELIGIBLE COSTS will be paid solely from HPC Revolving Loan Fund.

ORDINANCE #1226

An ordinance Dangerous Wild/Exotic Animal Prohibited

Be it ordained by the City of Deadwood:

Chapter 6.04

6.04.060 Dangerous Wild/Exotic Animal Prohibited.

- (a) It is considered a nuisance and shall be unlawful for any person to keep and or to sell native fur bearers, otter, beaver, fox, fischer, pine martin, badger, possum, porcupine, weasels, flying squirrels, endangered species, native wildlife or dangerous wild animals as stated in (e) below.
- (b) Noting in this section shall be deemed to prohibit the keeping of domestic cats, ferrets, or domestic dogs, as long as all provisions of Chapter 6.04 are followed.
- (c) Slaughter of animals is prohibited.
- (d) Breeding of dangerous wild/exotic animals as defined in (e) is prohibited.
- (e) "Dangerous wild animal" should be defined as the following types of animals, whether bred in the wild or in captivity, and any or all hybrids of these species:
 - 1) all species of cats, excluding domestic cats
 - 2) red wolves and gray wolves, including wolf-dog hybrids
 - 3) all species of bears
 - 4) all species of hyena and aardwolf
 - 5) raccoons, kinkajous, and coatimundis.
 - 6) rhinoceroses
 - 7) hippopotamus
 - 8) all species of non-human primates
 - 9) all elephant species
 - 10) all species of alligators, crocodiles, caimans, gharials
 - all venomous snakes, as well as anacondas, boa constrictors, Burmese phythons, reticulated pythons, amethystine pythons, scrub pythons, Northern African pythons, and Southern African pythons.
- (f) Animals cared for/kept/held/sheltered/housed under the following conditions and by the following institutions, entities and persons are permitted:
 - 1) Zoos accredited by the Association of Zoos and Aquariums (AZA);
 - 2) Sanctuaries accredited by the Global Federation of Sanctuaries, and wildlife sanctuaries defined as non-profit organizations that meet all of the following criteria:

- a) Operate a place of refuge where abused, neglected, unwanted, impounded, abandoned, orphaned, or displaced animals are provided care for the lifetime of the animal;
- b) Do not conduct any commercial activity with respect to dangerous wild animals, including sale, trade, auction, lease, or loan or use dangerous wild animals in any manner in a for-profit business or non-profit business. Do not exempt USDA licensees;
- c) Do not use dangerous wild animals for entertainment purposes or in a traveling exhibit;
- d) Do no breed any dangerous wild animals; and
- e) Do not allow members of the public the opportunity to come into contact with dangerous wild animals.
- 3) Law enforcement and animal control authorities;
- 4) Licensed veterinary hospitals for the purpose of providing veterinary care;
- 5) Humane societies and animal shelters temporarily housing a dangerous wild animal at the written request of law enforcement officers;
- 6) Circuses that possess a class C license under the federal Animal Welfare Act, that are temporarily in the state, and that offer performances by live animals, clowns and acrobats for public entertainment, and
- 7) A person temporarily transporting a legally owned dangerous wild animal through the state if the transit time is not more than 24 hours.
- (g) <u>Grandfather Provision</u>: Current owners may be required to obtain a license or permit, register all animals as defined by Chapter 6.04, and comply with any caging, husbandry, handling and other requirements set forth by the City of Deadwood or State of South Dakota. Owners are required to retain proof of ownership prior to the effective date of the law. Owners of grandfathered animals must also maintain veterinary records, acquisition papers, or other documents that establish the date the animal was acquired. The current number of dangerous wild animals already owned and placed within the city limits by June 8, 2015 may not increase.
- h) Owners may not be convicted of an offense involving the abuse or neglect of any animal pursuant to any state, local, or federal law;
- i) All animals in current possession shall be microchipped by a licensed veterinarian and records provided to city officials. Microchips cannot be transferred to other animals;

- j) Owners may not have a license or permit regarding the care, possession, exhibition, breeding, or sale of animals revoked or suspended by any state, local, or federal agency;
- k) Not allow members of the public to come into physical contact with a dangerous wild animal;
- 1) Owners must register all animals with the regulatory or enforcement agency and received proper permit from the South Dakota Animal Industry Board;
- m) Owners must maintain \$2 million dollar liability insurance;

An additional publicly owned performance area is available for PERFORMERS at History & Information Center under the breezeway or in the lawn on either side of the building.

Sidewalk performances by PERFORMERS shall not permitted on the public sidewalks. This creates a considerable safety issue for pedestrian and vehicular traffic. Sidewalk performances will be strictly prohibited; failure to follow this mandate will result in revocation of Performers License.

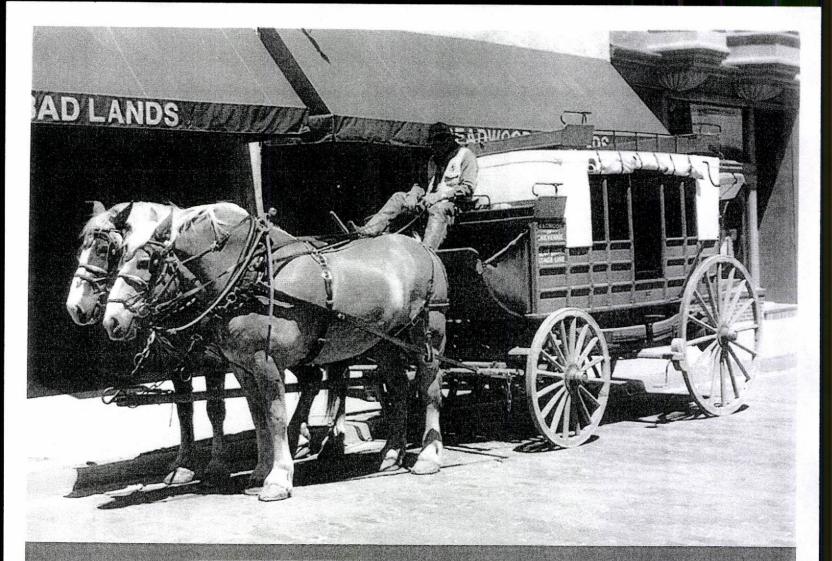

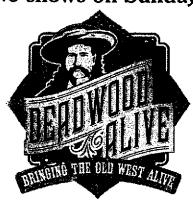

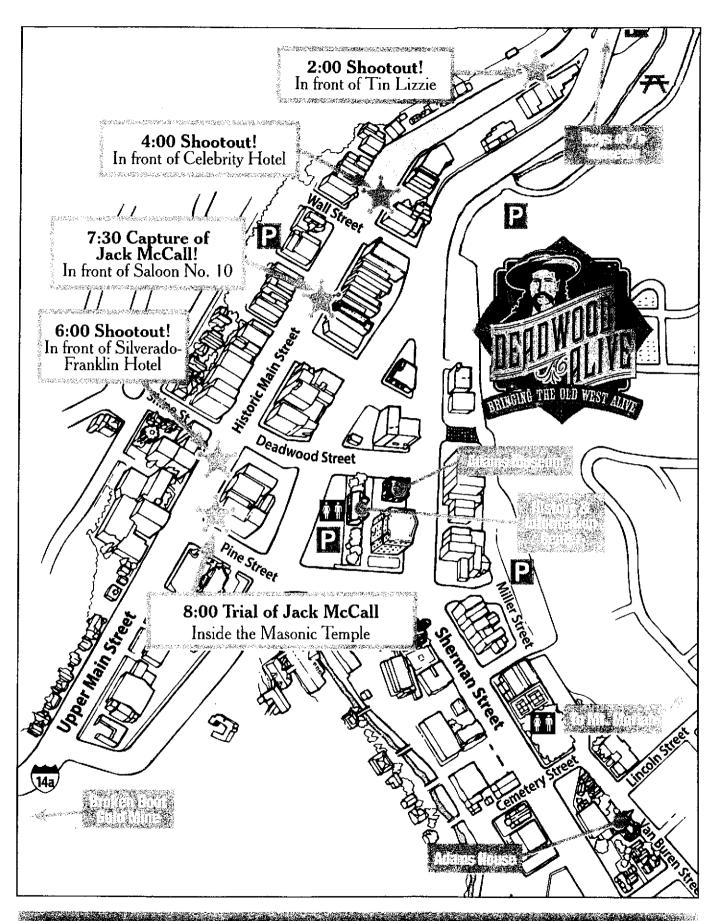

Subject: Cleaning Exterior Access Public Restrooms

SUMMARY

Cleaning our exterior access, public restrooms is an issue for the City. These restrooms, including those at: Mt. Moriah, the History and Information Center, the baseball field complex, Gordon Park, the lower Main St. Information Center and the trailhead near the Sherman St. parking lot can and do become very messy at any given moment, particularly if a tour bus happens to stop near them. We have often had complaints about their condition within an hour after they have been cleaned. This reflects poorly on the City.

I have contacted some cleaning services and have received proposals, from them, to provide cleaning services for these restrooms. I have requested their proposals to include cleaning both the Mt. Moriah and the History and Information Center restrooms 3 times per day, 7 days a week and the others once a day, 7 days a week. This would be a maximum that we would require and occur only during the heavy tourist season (May thru Sept.). The remainder of the year we would only need the History and Information Center and the trailhead restrooms cleaned since we shut down the other bathrooms for the season. At that time, we could have the Parks Dept. take care of those bathrooms or our part- time cleaning group clean them.

The best proposal I received included performing the service at a rate of \$15.00 per hour with estimates of 7 to 8 hours per day required. This estimate equates to approximately \$3,000.00 per month.

RECCOMMENDATION

It is my recommendation that the Commission give the Mayor permission to sign a contract with S&C Cleaners to provide the cleaning services described above, for an amount not exceed \$3,000.00 per month, through September of this year. We would then make an evaluation to determine if this is an appropriate way to improve our outside access facilities in the future.

State of South Dakota Department of Transportation License Agreement

This License Agreement (License) is made and entered into by and between the State of South Dakota, acting by and through its Department of Transportation, referred to in this License as the "STATE," and the city of Deadwood, South Dakota, referred to in this License as the "CITY."

BACKGROUND:

- A. The STATE is the fee owner of certain real property located in the city of Deadwood, South Dakota. The subject real property is commonly known and identified as the Deadwood maintenance facility located inside the fenced area of the STATE'S maintenance facility in Deadwood, Lawrence County, South Dakota.
- B. The STATE has agreed to grant the CITY certain non-exclusive rights in and to the real property described in Section A above, subject to the terms, conditions, and limitations of this License.

In consideration of the mutual benefits and obligations contained in this License, the receipt and sufficiency of which is acknowledged, the parties agree as follows:

TERM

- (a) The term of this License will begin on January 1, 2015, and will end upon termination of this License pursuant to the terms of this License. The CITY'S access to the property and use of the STATE facility under this License will be allowed only during the CITY'S yearly scheduled event times for the following events: the Days of '76, Cool Deadwood Nights, and the Deadwood Snow Cross.
- (b) Either Party may terminate this License on seven (7) days' written notice to the other. If the CITY breaches any of the terms or conditions of this License, the STATE may terminate the License at any time with or without notice.

2. USE OF PREMISES

- (a) The STATE grants the CITY a non-exclusive license to use the area designated by the STATE on the maps attached to and incorporated in this Agreement as Exhibit A and located on the STATE'S Deadwood maintenance facility as a parking area during the CITY'S scheduled event times for those events listed in Paragraph 1(a) above, and for no other purpose. The CITY will manage and maintain the subject property in such a manner so as to in no way depreciate the value of the land which is the subject of this License.
- (b) The CITY will supply and install a snow fence or other barrier for 250' along the north edge of the property to delineate the edge of the STATE'S yard from the steep drop off to the creek. CITY may, at its option, install a permanent fence or barrier that has been approved in advance by the STATE. Any permanent fence or barrier will include two 10' wide gates, too be placed at locations specified by the Deadwood Maintenance supervisor. The CITY will be responsible to maintain the fence and repair any damages caused by any of the three events.
- (c) The CITY will provide CITY employees or representatives to monitor the STATE'S yard and gate from the beginning date of each event to the ending date of each event or at such time when event parking is no longer required within the STATE'S facility.
- (d) The CITY will clean the STATE'S facility to its original condition or better at the end of each event.
- (e) The STATE will place concrete barriers to block off portions of the yard not accessible for parking and delineate areas accessible for parking. At no time will parking be allowed outside the defined areas set forth by the STATE.
- (f) Nothing contained in this License will imply or import a covenant on the part of the STATE for quiet enjoyment.
- (g) The CITY agrees the CITY does not and will not claim, at any time, any interest or estate of any kind or extent whatsoever in the above described property of the STATE, by virtue of the rights granted under this License or the CITY'S occupancy or use of the above described property of the STATE under this License.

3. IMPROVEMENT OR ALTERATION

The CITY will erect no structure on the subject property without the STATE'S prior consent and approval. The CITY will not place or permit to be placed any advertising matter upon any part of the subject property or upon any improvement thereon, except as approved by the STATE, in writing, in advance of said placement.

4. COMPLIANCE

The CITY will comply with all federal, state, and local laws, rules, statutes, regulations, ordinances, guidelines, permits, and requirements applicable to this License, and will be solely responsible for obtaining current information on such requirements.

5. INDEMNIFICATION

- (a) The CITY will indemnify the STATE, its officers, agents, and employees against any and all actions, suits, damages, liability, claims, demands, expenses, judgments, fees, and costs of whatever kind or character, arising from, by reason of, or in connection with the use of the subject property. The parties intend that the STATE, its officers, agents, and employees will not be liable or in any way responsible for injury, damage, liability, loss, or expense to persons or property, resulting to the CITY, or to those the CITY brings onto the property, whether caused by accidents, mishaps, misconduct, or negligence.
- (b) The CITY assumes full responsibility for any and all damage or injury which may result to any person or property by reason of or in connection with the CITY'S use of the subject property, and will pay the STATE for any and all damage or injury resulting from the CITY'S activities.

RIGHT OF STATE TO USE.

The STATE reserves the right, to be exercised by the STATE and any other party who may obtain written permission or authority from the STATE to use the premises in any manner as the STATE in the STATE'S sole discretion deems appropriate, provided the STATE uses all commercially reasonable efforts to avoid interference with the use of the premises by the CITY for the purpose specified in Paragraph 2(a).

7. SURRENDER OF PREMISES

Upon termination of this License, the CITY will surrender the subject property in as good a state and condition as it was at the commencement of this License.

8. ASSIGNMENT OF LICENSE

The CITY will not transfer or assign this License or any interest in this License, without the STATE'S prior written consent.

9. SEVERABILITY

If any court of competent jurisdiction holds any provision of this License unenforceable or invalid, such holding will not invalidate or render unenforceable any other provision of this License.

10. CONTROLLING LAW

This License will be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of South Dakota. Any lawsuit pertaining to or affecting this License will be venued in Circuit Court, Sixth Judicial Circuit, Hughes County, South Dakota.

11. SUPERCESSION

All other prior discussions, communications, and representations concerning the subject matter of this License are superseded by the terms of this License, and, except as specifically provided in this License, this License constitutes the entire agreement with respect to the subject matter.

12. REPORTING

The CITY will report to the STATE any event encountered in the course of performance of this License which results in injury to any person or property, or which may otherwise subject the CITY, or the STATE, or the STATE'S officers, agents, or employees to liability. The CITY will report any such event to the STATE immediately upon discovery.

The CITY'S obligation under this section will only be to report the occurrence of any event to the STATE and to make any other report provided for by the CITY'S duties or applicable law. The CITY'S obligation to report will not require disclosure of any information subject to privilege or confidentiality under law (such as attorney-client communications). Reporting to the STATE under this section will not excuse or satisfy any obligation of the CITY to report any event to law enforcement or other entities under the requirements of any applicable law.

AMENDMENT

This License may not be amended, except in writing, which writing will be expressly identified as a part of this License, and will be signed by an authorized representative of each of the parties.

14. INSURANCE

The CITY will furnish the STATE the following certificate of insurance and assure that the insurance is in effect for the life of the License:

(a) Commercial General Liability Insurance:

The CITY will maintain occurrence based commercial general liability insurance or equivalent form with a limit of not less than \$1,000,000 for each occurrence. If such insurance contains a general aggregate limit it will apply separately to this License or be no less than \$2,000,000.

15. RIGHT OF INGRESS AND EGRESS

The STATE, by and through employees, officers, or agents employed by the STATE, will have the right of ingress and egress over the subject property. The CITY will be solely responsible for providing a means of ingress and egress for the CITY'S own use of the subject property.

16. The CITY has designated its Mayor as the CITY'S authorized representative and has empowered the Mayor with the authority to sign this License on behalf of the CITY. A copy of the CITY'S Commission minutes or resolution authorizing the execution of this License by the Mayor as the CITY'S authorized representative is attached hereto as Exhibit B.

The signing of this License signifies that the governmental agencies have taken all necessary official action to enter into this License.

The Deadwood Historic Preservation Commission has held two public meetings to develop, review and present the attached 2016 Historic Preservation budget. This is the public funding which supports historic preservation within the City of Deadwood. The Commission has made arduous determinations on which programs should receive funding and to what extent. These determinations are critical in identifying projects and activities to ensure the Deadwood National Historic Landmark is being preserved, protected and promoted as South Dakota's premier preservation initiative and tourist destination.
