2020 Wall of Fame Winners

Deadwood Wall of Fame for their significant contribution to the history and development of Deadwood. Chairman Dale Berg presented the awards to the representatives of both inductess. Lew Keehn and James K.P. Miller will join the other twenty-four individuals honored on the Wall of Fame displayed at Deadwood City Hall.



Protecting a National Historic Landmark

The City of Deadwood was designated as a National Historic Landmark on July 4, 1961 and is

listed on both the National and South Dakota Registers of Historic Places. Since then it has been the community's desire to protect its historic resources and as a result the City established the Deadwood Historic Preservation Commission and implemented a process of architectural design review as it is in the best interest of the City as a whole to promote the preservation and interpretation of its historic sites, buildings, and properties. Maintaining our history is critical to the economic success of the City and the quality of life of its residents.

Any changes to the exterior of a property within a locally-designated historic district, or requiring a city building permit, must receive a Certificate of Appropriateness from the Deadwood Historic Preservation Commission before any work can commence. If the building is not located within a locally-designated historic district then property owners must receive a Project Approval from the Deadwood Historic Preservation Commission before any work can commence.

Requiring a Certificate of Appropriateness ensures that changes do not damage the City's



historic character. Review is not meant to discourage alterations, but to ensure they are appropriate and compatible for Deadwood. The Historic Preservation Commission uses the Secretary of the Interior's Standards for Rehabilitation as a guide when determining the appropriateness of altering historic properties. The Standards are general in character and are to be used in conjunction with the Guidelines for Rehabilitating Historic Buildings and Deadwood's Downtown Design Guidelines. Each of these publications specifically outlines the various aspects of architectural design and what changes are appropriate for historic structures.

Exciting changes are coming to the Deadwood Public Library!
