Deadwood Box Study

The Deadwood Box is a concrete box structure which supports Highways 14A and 85 and channels Whitewood Creek beneath the highway.

The SD Department of Transportation (SDDOT), the Federal Highway Administration and the City of Deadwood are conducting a study that will evaluate alternate options for the redesign and replacement of the structure and roadway corridor. This is an important undertaking to protect the city's rich history and famous landmarks.

Due to limitations on public gatherings recommended by the CDC, SDDOT is posting information to the study website rather than presenting documents at an in-person public meeting. Members of the public are requested to submit questions or comments through the study website at https://deadwoodbox.com/ from July 28, 2020 through August 25, 2020.

Your input will aid in the development of study recommendations.

The results of the census, which is taken once a decade, help determine how billions of dollars in federal funding is distributed to states and communities every year.

The number of seats each state has in the House of Representatives is determined by the results. They also are used to draw congressional and state legislative districts.

The Census Bureau is making follow-up calls to some households that have already completed the 2020 Census. The goal is to make sure *everyone* in a household was counted, and to validate information provided when they completed the census.

Deadwood's Fuels Reduction Program and the United States Forest Service




In July, the United States Forest Service Northern Hills Ranger District received funding to continue the Deadwood fuels reduction project adjacent to the Deadwood city limits. Known as Deadwood Fuels Phase II, this USFS project consists of 160 acres of federal lands that border the northern boundary of the Deadwood city limits along Mount Roosevelt Road.

The project will be divided into two areas: Phase 2A is north of the Stage Run subdivision and Phase 2B is south of the Mount Roosevelt Road. This project went out for bid in July and work could begin as early as this fall. The prescription for treatment in this area consists of thinning and hand piling coniferous trees less than 9 inches within the project area.

Piles created during Deadwood Fuels Phase I (Sunrise Mountain beside the Lodge of Deadwood) will most likely be burned this winter, if conditions allow.

Upon its completion, Phase II will help establish a defensible parameter against the threat of wildfire on the northern side of the Deadwood city limits.



Chamber Corner

August 10: The <u>Legends Ride</u> is a 50-mile ride from Deadwood to Sturgis to raise money for regional charities. Celebrities lead the ride to the legendary Buffalo Chip, where a private reception is followed by a concert. Main Street, in front of the Historic Franklin Hotel, (Deadwood Street to Pine Street) is closed to traffic from 9:00am to 3:30pm on August 10 for this event.

August 7-16: During the **Sturgis Rally** the History & Information Center (Depot) lot will be reserved for bikes August 6 -16, and bike parking will be allowed on Main Street in designated areas from August 2-16.

August 26-30: Kool Deadwood Nites brings car lovers together for four days full of classic cars, classic music and classic fun. It's a 50's and 60's sock hop - Deadwood style. Enjoy a parade, show and shine, car show and FREE concerts on Main Street featuring the biggest names in rock 'n roll history, plus an extra night of music in Outlaw Square on Wednesday, August 26. Headliners include The Grass Roots, The Box Tops, The Buckinghams, the Motortown All-Stars and Surfin' Safari. Main Street will close to traffic from Wall Street to Deadwood Street starting at 2:00pm on Wednesday, August 26 and will remain closed until 2:00am on Sunday, August 30. Main Street will be closed to traffic again on August 30 from 7:00am to 3:00pm for the Kool Deadwood Nites Parade and Show & Shine. The History & Information Center parking lot is closed to all non-registered classic cars from 2am on Thursday, August 27 through 3:00pm on Sunday, August 30.
