Trash Collection and Curbside Recycling

The City of Deadwood recently advertised for proposals for a residential trash and recycle collector. Only one proposal was submitted to the City by Sander Sanitation from Blackhawk, South Dakota. The City Commission recently approved entering into a contract with Sander Sanitation with service to begin in January 2020.

Sander Sanitation presented a proposal which included weekly trash collection the same as the current contractor is providing. In addition, residential accounts will have an option to enroll in curbside recycling. One recyclables container will be provided to each enrolled residential account and recyclables will be collected curbside once a month. Details will be coming soon about curbside recycling and information will be provided to assist with understanding the process. Please watch for additional information in the next newsletter, on the City of Deadwood Facebook page, the City of Deadwood website, or enroll in Code Red.

NOTICE

The Deadwood Public Works Department reminds you that cars need to be removed from the street during snow removal. The streets will be posted one day in advance. If your car is not removed prior to snow removal it will be ticketed and towed.

Sidewalks need to be cleared within 24 hours after the snow stops falling. Failure to clear your sidewalk will result in it being completed by the city. A fee of \$71.50/man hour will be charged if the city is required to clear the sidewalk. Snow should not be shoveled into the street after the street has been cleaned.

The Historic Preservation Commission presented a plaque to the Christeleit's honoring the 100th year of the building's location at 59 Sherman Street.







ADAMS COMPANY GARAGE

59 SHERMAN STREET
1916

By 1916, automobiles were replacing draft horses and wagons as modes of hauling freight and goods in and around Deadwood Gulch. In September, the W.E. Adams Company, located at 51-55 Sherman Street began work on a one-story brick garage adjacent to its large warehouse complex. Local newspapers recorded the progress of the construction and arrival of the new delivery trucks. "The new trucks have a capacity of three tons, and will go any place that a horse and wagon can go," was stated by one local newspaper. By month's end, the new garage was completed and held two delivery trucks used by both the W.E. Adams Company and Warner Fruit Company. In 1933, an addition was added to the garage and the buildings were faced with street brick pavers from Illinois.
