Discovery at Outlaw Square Site

On February 12, 2019, the staff of the Deadwood Historic Preservation Office along with archaeologists from the South Dakota Archaeological

Research Center and construction workers from



Quinn Construction made an amazing discovery at the Outlaw Square area. Buried and intact under ten feet of fill was the Frost Manufacturing Company fire box and boiler from the Deadwood Theatre. circa 1903. The door off the fire box was still intact and contained the Frost Company logo. This was a truly amazing discovery that provided Deadwood a glimpse into its past.

City of Deadwood Election for Office of Mayor

The City of Deadwood will not have an election on April 9, 2019 for Office of Mayor. David R.

CodeRED Notification System

he City of Deadwood uses CodeRED, a high-speed mass notification system, to keep residents nformed. The system delivers general and emergency massages to residents via phone, text nessage and email.


General messages are used to communicate non-life safety matters such as community events, planned road closures, water main repairs and power service interruptions.

Emergency messages notify residents of emergencies such as an evacuation notice, utility outages, fire, floods, severe weather or other emergency situations.

Residents who have not yet registered to receive these free alerts can register by going to the City of Deadwood website, www.cityofdeadwood.com, then click the CodeRED Signup button at the top. If you do not have access to the internet you may register at the library or call 605-578-2082 and City Staff can register you over the phone. There is also a free CodeRED Mobile app for your smartphone available at iTunes or Google Play.


