As many of you may have noticed, we have gone from winter to construction season! I will begin by saying please have some patience with the ongoing construction and please travel at safe speeds through the two primary construction work areas. The construction taking place on Lower Main Street involves infrastructure improvements, relocating overhead utilities to underground, sidewalk and lighting improvements, and road repairs. This project will be ongoing from now until October with the construction being halted during the Days of 76 through the Sturgis Motorcycle Rally.

Outlaw Square is making progress every day and slated for a September opening. Along with the Outlaw Square project, the Deadwood Street traffic signal will be replaced by the South Dakota Department of Transportation. This area of Deadwood will be under construction from now until this fall.

We understand construction is not ideal for pedestrian movement as well as vehicular movement and at times it can be very frustrating to travel across or through Deadwood but please take some extra time to get to your destination. Please watch for pedestrians not only walking about Deadwood but also the workers getting these projects completed. The construction taking place today will be great improvements to our community and in no time the projects will be complete. CodeRed Notification System

The City of Deadwood uses CodeRED, a high-speed mass notification system, to keep residents informed. The system delivers general and emergency messages to residents via phone, text message and email.

General messages are used to communicate non-life safety matters such as community events, planned road closures, water main repairs and power service interruptions. Emergency messages notify residents of emergencies such as an evacuation notice, utility outages, fire, floods, severe weather or other emergency situations.

Residents who have not yet registered to receive these free alerts can register by going to the City of Deadwood website, www.cityofdeadwood.com, then click the CodeRED Signup button at the top. If you do not have access to the internet you may register at the library or call 605-578-2082 and City Staff can register you over the phone. There is also a free CodeRED Mobile app for your smartphone available at iTunes or Google Play.

Rubble Site Hours of Operation

Monday - Saturday 8:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m.

Rubble Site Rules

- Prior to entering the rubble site, all loads must be checked by site attendant and proper fee paid
- Items must be separated by plain wood, buryables, rubble, metal
- Buryables are furniture, shingles, mattresses, carpets, treated and/or painted lumber/wood
- Tires, household garbage, plastics and older cathode ray tube (CRTs) televisions will be charged a fee
- Tires must be removed from rims
- Metal, electronics (other than CRTs) and trees/brush are free year-round
- No salvage will be allowed
- All vehicles will be required to stop at the attendant's building prior to leaving the site
