Pet Licensing

Did you know under City of Deadwood ordinance your dogs and/or cats are required to be licensed? Pet licenses are \$5.00 for dogs or cats that have been spayed or neutered, \$10.00 if the dog or cat has not been spayed or neutered. A vaccination certificate from a licensed veterinarian is required before a license can be issued. Licenses are valid from May 1 to April 30 and shall be

renewed each year on or before May 1. The Chief of Police will issue a tag that is to be securely fastened to the collar around the neck of the pet. To apply for a license please visit the Police Department, 100 Sherman Street. If you have any question please call us at 605-548-2600.


CodeRED

The City of Deadwood uses CodeRED, a high-speed mass notification system, to keep residents informed. The system delivers general and emergency massages to residents via phone, text message and email.

General messages are used to communicate non-life safety matters such as community events, planned road closures, water main repairs and power service interruptions. Emergency messages notify residents of emergencies such as an evacuation notice, utility outages, fire, floods, severe weather or other emergency situations.

Residents who have not yet registered to receive these free alerts can register by going to the City of Deadwood website, www.cityofdeadwood.com, then click the CodeRED Signup button at the top. If you do not have access to the internet you may register at the library or

call 605-578-2082 and City Staff can register you over the phone. There is also a free CodeRED Mobile app for your smartphone available at iTunes or Google Play.

Lawrence County Comprehensive Plan

Lawrence County is working with the Black Hills Council of Governments to update the County's Comprehensive Plan. Public meetings and engagement sessions will be held in the late summer and fall of 2019. Meeting dates and times will be posted on the plan website: www.lawrencecountycompplan.com.



The County's comprehensive plan was last updated in 2005. Local needs and priorities have changed since the last update and a new plan is needed to reflect these changes. The Comprehensive Plan will be used as a road map to guide future decisions and development as the county grows.

A successful planning process requires public involvement and input. The planning process will combine public input, stakeholder meetings, and technical analyses.

Public input will ensure the plan represents the community's vision for the future and accurately addresses concerns and priorities. The plan website, www.lawrencecountycompplan.com will be updated with meeting dates, agendas, and notes so those who are unable to attend meetings can stay up-to-date with the planning process online.
