EXHIBIT MAKEOVER

The Deadwood History Information & Visitor Center, located at 3 Siever Street, is undergoing an exhibit makeover this summer! The Deadwood Historic Preservation Commission hired Split Rock Studios of Minneapolis, Minnesota to design and install the new exhibits at the depot. The new exhibits will replace the display panels installed in 1992 by the National Park Service and will feature items from the City Archives and the City's archaeological collections. The exhibits will incorporate the same design elements used in the Deadwood Welcome Center and Pluma Visitor Station at South Gateway.

Artifacts on display will include an 1858 Remington revolver from Deadwood resident Frederick M. Burroughs, military buttons unearthed from the Chinatown archaeological investigations, and an automobile axle from the Haynes Automobile Company unearthed during the 2005 Nelsons Garage archaeological investigation.

The new exhibit will showcase an HO scale diorama of Deadwood City, June 1876 created by Lead, South Dakota artist Jack Anfinson. The takeaway themes of the new exhibit include the history and importance of transportation in Deadwood and the diversity of historic preservation projects.

The new exhibits are scheduled for installation in September 2019.

WARNING SIRENS

Deadwood warning sirens are located in the Event Complex and on top of McGovern Hill with the objective of warning citizens and visitors of <u>life threatening emergencies</u> while they are outside. If sirens sound, you should turn to the local tv or radio for weather service or life threatening announcements. In addition to the warning sirens, the City encourages you to sign up for "Code Red" as this system will notify you of emergencies by cell phone, landline, text and email. This system enables you to receive notification indoors, outside or anywhere you have a phone or e-mail and will provide more details as to the emergency or notification. You can select to receive only emergency notifications and/or general announcements (snow removal, water line breaks, community cancellations or closures).

ORDINANCE REMINDER FOR THE HISTORIC DISTRICT

The City of Deadwood has ordinances regarding the use of sandwich boards and displays of merchandise in the historic district. The ordinances are as follows:

15.32.130 Disallowed Signs

#20. Any exterior, portable, freestanding or unattached signs, such as, but not limited to, a sidewalk sign or sandwich board sign shall not be allowed unless placed entirely on private property and not on a public sidewalk, roadway, or right-of-wav. Any exterior, portable, freestanding or unattached signs in existence on May 1, 2019 shall be removed from public sidewalks, roadways, or right-of-ways.

[▶] 5.28.035 Display of Merchandise.

It is unlawful for any person, entity or business to display merchandise by affixing the same to the exterior of any permanent or temporary structure or to display merchandise outside of any permanent or temporary structure (example: mannequins) within the city's locally designated historic district. (Ord. 1241 (part), 2015; Ord. 1101 (part), 2008)

The City will only issue <u>one</u> courtesy notice in regards to non-compliance to the City of Deadwood Ordinances. If the infraction is not corrected, a fine of \$100 per day for each day infraction is not resolved will be incurred against the property in violation and a citation will be issued to the property owner/business manager. No variances to the ordinances, including special events, will be allowed.

August 5: The Legends Ride is a 50-mile ride from Deadwood to Sturgis to raise money for regional charities. Celebrities lead the ride to the legendary Buffalo Chip, where a private reception is followed by a concert. Main Street, in front of the Historic Franklin Hotel, (Deadwood Street to Pine Street) is closed to traffic from 9am to 3:30pm on August 5 for this event. Deadwood Street will remain open and the ride will exit on Pine Street.

August 22-25: <u>Kool Deadwood Nites</u> brings car lovers together for four days full of classic cars, classic music and classic fun. It's a 50's and 60's sock hop - Deadwood style. Enjoy a parade, show and shine, car show and and FREE concerts on Main Street featuring the biggest names in rock 'n roll history. Headliners include Herman's Hermits starring Peter Noone, The Kingsmen and the Fabulous Thunderbirds. Main Street will close to traffic from Wall Street to Deadwood Street starting at 2pm on Wednesday, August 21 and will remain closed until 2am on Sunday, August 25. Main Street will be closed to traffic again on August 25 from 7am to 3pm for the Kool Deadwood Nites Parade and Show & Shine. The History & Information Center parking lot is closed to all non-registered classic cars from 2am on Thursday, August 22 through 3pm on Sunday, August 25. The public is invited to attend all events.
