




From the Mayor's Desk

Franklin Hotel Parapet and Pediment Project

In the first week of November, the Deadwood Historic Preservation Office received several progress photographs from Architectural Mall, Inc. of the new parapet and pediment for the Franklin Hotel. Work on this project began two years ago when David Stafford was hired by the Silverado Gaming to develop a set of plans for the reconstruction of the parapet and pediment that

once resided above the Franklin Hotel. As lead architect on this project, Stafford consulted with the City Archives and obtained a digital copy of the 1904 hand tinted glass transparency of the Franklin Hotel (on display in the Deadwood City Hall council chamber). From this image, Stafford using AutoCAD software developed an exact replica of the architectural features that once graced the top of the Franklin Hotel.

The plans were then submitted to Architectural Mall, Inc. for the fabrication of the Franklin architectural features. Latex molds of each segment of the parapet and pediment were hand crafted using an assortment of media including silicone, wood, and styrofoam. During the molding and casting process, a stone sample of the original parapet was sent to the fabricators to match the color and texture. After approving this detail, the molds were ready for production. These photographs capture the completion of the casting of the architectural features.
