McKinley Street Signal Light

As you may know the City of Deadwood has been working with the South Dakota Department of Transportation to stop the removal of the traffic signal on McKinley Street during the 2019 construction phase of Highway 14A. Mayor Chuck Turbiville met with Darin Bergquist, Secretary of the South Dakota Department of Transportation, to discuss the concerns of Deadwood residents. During this meeting Mayor Turbiville presented nearly 300 e-mails and petition signatures and a map of the affected area. Mr. Bergquist was informed of the development around this signal light including the events going on at the Event Complex and how difficult it is to make a left turn onto Highway 14A.

Mr. Bergquist did indicate the State receives funding from the Federal Government. Because of this funding the State must meet traffic signal guidelines set by the Federal Government. Because the signal light does not meet Federal standards and if not removed it could affect future Federal funding to the state. Mr. Bergquist stated he will give the request new consideration and will contact Mayor Turbiville of his final decision at a later date.

Hopefully this meeting was a successful one. Thank you to everyone who submitted e-mail responses and signed the petition. Your support of the residents and visitors of Deadwood is definitely appreciated.

Weed Reminder

The City of Deadwood would like to remind Citizens of the City Ordinance regarding weeds. *Chapter 8.20, Weeds*, states, "It is the duty of the owner, occupant, or person in charge of any lot in the City to keep such lot free from weeds as defined herein or to cut such weeds at such times as may be necessary to prevent growth. Weeds and grass left uncut cause an unsightly appearance, create a fire hazard, and offer an environment conducive to rodents and small animals." If public notice is given (may be generally published in newspaper), owner, occupant, or person in charge of any lot within the city shall cut and remove all noxious weeds, and keep grass and other weeds cut as to prevent problems from occurring. Failure to keep such weeds and grass cut will cause the

keep such weeds and grass cut will cause the same to be cut by the City or its assigns and assess the costs thereof against the property benefited. Please contact the City with any questions.
