Archaeology Camp Discovery

In June of 2018, Deadwood History, Inc. and the Deadwood Historic Preservation Office partnered for the annual two week, archaeology camp for elementary and middle school students. The excavation area was Richard Gordon Memorial Park, located along Deadwood's Sherman Street. In 2017, the City of Deadwood, through its Capital Improvement Plan, began plans for new playground equipment in the park. Prior to installing the equipment, HPC decided to conduct a limited archaeological investigation of the project area. Prior to the archaeological investigations, city staff reviewed maps, photographs, and newspaper articles on file at the Deadwood City Archives. This research provided insight into the buildings that once existed within the confines of today's Gordon Park.

The primary goals of the camp were to introduce students to the scientific study of archaeology and test for any archaeological anomalies beneath the proposed project area. Over the two week field school, forty students hand excavated the site using trowels, brushes, dust pans and shaker screens. In addition to excavating, students learned about soil stratigraphy, site history, and diagnostic artifact identification and their association to the site history.



Several interesting objects were uncovered during the camp included white stoneware fragments, plate glass window fragments, a twelve gauge paper cartridge shotgun shell with the United Metallic Cartridge Company Nitro Club head stamp and a fork associated with the pre-1911 residential occupation of the park. Objects associated with the post 1911 development of the park included a 1938 Lincoln

cent, or "wheat penny" and a 1930s era metal cap gun. After its recovery from the site, city staff enlisted the help of the Northern Hills Veterinary Clinic in Sturgis, South Dakota to x-ray the toy gun. Based on the results, city staff was able to verify the object was indeed a cap gun based on the pistol grip assembly. Several of these objects will be on display in the Deadwood City Hall's "Cabinet of Curiosities".

Main Street Master Plan Update

Hard to believe but it has been approximately 30 years since the last major renovation to the infrastructure of Historic Main Street. With the need to update some additional infrastructure, accessibility issues and the daily use of Main Street the City of Deadwood through the Historic Preservation Office recently put out a Request for Qualification for the development of a Main Street Master Plan. This project will look at urban planning, "Special Event" management, safety and security, infrastructure reconstruction, pedestrian access, Main Street amenities, landscaping, public space development while ensuring our National Historic Landmark is protected.

Seven proposals were submitted and these were narrowed down to three firms or teams for in-person interviews by a Selection Committee representing City Commissioners, Historic Preservation Commissioners, Planning & Zoning Commissioner, Chamber of Commerce, and Deadwood Business Club Representatives. From these interviews, the committee selected their top choice. The next step is now entering into negotiations with the qualified team. The entire development of the Main Street Master Plan is estimated to take approximately twelve months and is scheduled for completion in early summer of 2019.

The components identified for consideration in the Master Plan include: sidewalks, ADA compliance, road surface, trolley stops, bump outs for businesses, alignment of Deadwood Street, public restrooms, drainage, curb and curb cuts, water valves, curb boxes, domestic and FD sprinkler services, piping, fire hydrants, manholes, water service audit to eliminate single services to multiple buildings, water main crossings through the Box Culvert, traffic signal lights at Deadwood and Main Street, light poles, sign poles, wayfinding signage, downtown sound system, Wi-Fi, security cameras, private utility coordination in rebuild (would utilities want to participate), traffic control/public safety bollards, event traffic planning, considerations for community gathering spaces, new parking meter system, sidewalk basements/coal chutes, roof drains to the storm sewer, banners/bunting/lights across Main Street, Pedestrian crossings on Highway 14A/85.



Stay tuned for upcoming meeting schedules as we garner citizen and stakeholder input during this intensive process.

Sun Safety Tips
