# **HP Moment: Photographic Slides**

In 2017, the Deadwood Chamber of Commerce donated a substantial collection of archival materials to the Deadwood Historic Preservation Commission. In amongst this collection were



over 300 photographic slides focusing on various Deadwood promotional events that occurred prior to and shortly after the inception of gaming in 1989.

Over the past six months, city staff and volunteers organized and cataloged this vast collection of 35mm slides. Some of the hallmark events featured in this assemblage include the first annual Deadwood Jam (1990), the filming of John McGuen's "Miners Night Out" music video on Main Street (1992), Michael Martin Murphy's "West Fest" (1995) featuring country music legends Merle Haggard and Toby Keith, and the Chinese New Year celebration (1996).

# **CodeRED Notification System**

The City of Deadwood uses CodeRED, a high-speed mass notification system, to keep residents informed. The system delivers general and emergency massages to residents via phone, text message and email.

General messages are used to communicate non-life safety matters such as community events, planned road closures, water main repairs and power service interruptions.

Emergency messages notify residents of emergencies such as an evacuation notice, utility outages, fire, floods, severe weather or other emergency situations.

Residents who have not yet registered to receive these free alerts can register by going to the City of Deadwood website, cityofdeadwood.com, then click the CodeRED Signup button at the top. If you do not have access to the internet you may register at the library or call 605-578-2082 and City Staff



can register you over the phone. There is also a free CodeRED Mobile app for your smartphone available at iTunes or Google Play.

August 14: Land of the Burnt Thigh Book Discussion - Celebrate the pleasure of reading with a discussion of Land of the Burnt Thigh by Edith Eudora Kohl. In Land of the Burnt Thigh, girl homesteaders, Edith Eudora Ammons and her sister Ida Mary, moved to central South Dakota in 1907 near the Lower Brule Indian Reservation. These two young women found a community of homesteaders who were eager to help them succeed at what looked to be impossible: living in a tiny tarpaper shack on 160 waterless, sunbaked, and snow blasted acres for eight months until they could prove up their claim. Within weeks Edith was running a newspaper, Ida Mary was teaching school, and the two were helping others. This story of South Dakota is told with simplicity, directness, and an understanding of quiet heroic elements. August 24: History on the Lawn: Water Wars - How dry was it in the 30s? By May of 1934 there was so little moisture that a stock pond northeast of Belle Fourche was already drying up. A dispute arose over ownership and possessory rights to the pond. A cattle rancher was watering his stock at the pond. A neighbor was also trying to water his sheep at the pond. Someone cut a hole through the dam that held the pond. One morning a group of the sheep men apprehended the cattle ranchers hired hand. A fracas ensued, and the hired hand was tied to a lariat behind his horse. Someone spooked the horse. It took off at a gallop, and the hired hand was dragged over cactus, sagebrush, and rocks for over half a mile. His assailants were charged with riot and assault with intent to murder. This presentation will deal with the incident itself, the criminal proceedings, and the civil lawsuits that followed. Come and learn about this twentieth century event with local historian Wayne Gilbert. Bring a lunch and enjoy the Historic Adams House lawn; 12:00 noon; admission by donation. In case of inclement weather, the lecture will be moved to the Homestake Adams Research and Cultural Center (HARCC).

Regional and local bands will play on select Sundays through September 2, from 2-6 p.m. near the Silverado-Franklin Gaming Complex on the corner of Deadwood and Main Streets.
