



October 6-7, 13-14, and 20-21: Paranormal Investigation Tours of the Adams House - Join Deadwood History and Black Hills Paranormal Investigations (BHPI) for an exclusive ninety minute paranormal investigation of on of Deadwood's most haunted sites. Learn the history behind the darker stories associated with the historic home an search for paranormal activity using night vision cameras, full spectrum cameras, digital audio recorders, periscopes, Ovilus, and EMF meters.
