Mr. Jim Ludd 1876 Pioneer

On October 16, 2017 the Lawrence County Historical Society (LCHS) and the Deadwood Historic Preservation Commission dedicated a marker for Jim Ludd, a freed slave, who came west with Gilbert Tower in 1876. When Ludd died, the Tower family buried him on a knoll overlooking a field where the family grew cabbages. Years later when the Towers established a formal family cemetery they inadvertently left Ludd's unmarked gravesite outside the fenced area. Kay Huhnerkoch, a great granddaughter of Gilbert Tower, discovered the indentation in the soil and realized it was the burial site of Jim Ludd. Her husband placed stakes at either end of the site so it would not be forgotten. The Deadwood Historic Preservation Commission provided the funds to purchase a grave marker and the Lawrence County Historical Society held a brief ceremony.

Because of the Constitution's separation of powers, we cannot assist in judicial or court matters, such as child custody, divorce, pending litigation or criminal trials or imprisonment. Problems involving South Dakota state agencies - such as welfare or state taxes - also are outside of my jurisdiction as a United States Senator.

Winter Reminders for Residents and Businesses

With winter and snow fall around the corner, the City of Deadwood would like to remind residents and businesses of the Snow Removal Policies, to ensure the safety of all residents and guests.

The Deadwood Public Works Department reminds you that vehicles need to be removed from the street during snow removal activities. The streets will be posted one day in advance, please take advantage of the public parking lots during the snow removal activities. If your vehicle is not removed prior to snow removal, it will be ticketed and towed.

Sidewalks need to be cleared within 24 hours after the snow stops flying. Failure to clear your sidewalk will result in it being cleared by the City. A fee of \$71.50 per man hour will be charged if the City is required to clear the sidewalk. Snow should not be shoveled, blown or dumped into the street. These policies will be enforced for all areas of Deadwood. The Public Works Department appreciates the cooperation of the citizens to assure our streets are passable and our sidewalks are safe.
