Broadway Parking Garage Soon To Be Automated

On February 6, 2017, the Deadwood City Commission approved the purchase of a fully automated parking system for the Broadway Parking Garage. The hardware and software upgrades to the current parking garage computer system will enable the City to become compliant with today's processing standards and will accept cash, credit cards, and validations as payment. With the new system, the City may choose to operate the parking facility in a fully automated mode 24-7, or have the option to continue staffing the facility as deemed appropriate.

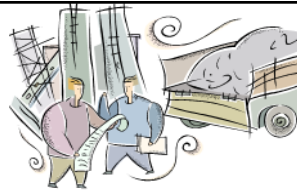

Voter registration for the City of Deadwood Election to be held on April 11, 2017, will close on March 27, 2017. Failure to register by this date will cause forfeiture of voting rights for this election. If you are in doubt about whether you are registered, check the Voter Information Portal at www.sdsos.gov or call the county auditor at (605) 578-1941.

Registration may be completed during regular business hours at the county auditor's office, municipal finance office, secretary of state's office, and those locations which provide driver's licenses, SNAP, TANF, WIC, military recruitment, and assistance to the disabled as provided by the Department of Human Services. You may contact the county auditor to request a mail-in registration form or access a mail-in form at www.sdsos.gov.

Voters with disabilities may contact the county auditor for information and special assistance in voter registration, absentee voting, or polling place accessibility.

Streets and Sidewalk Snow Removal

The Deadwood Public Works Department reminds you cars need to be removed from the street during snow removal. The streets will be posted one day in advance. If your car is not removed prior to snow removal it will be ticketed and towed. Sidewalks need to be cleared within 24 hours after the snow stops falling. Failure to clear your sidewalk will result in it being completed by the City. A fee of \$71.50 per man hour will be charged if the City is required to clear the sidewalk. Snow should not be shoveled or blown into the street after the street has been cleaned. Thank you for your cooperation.
