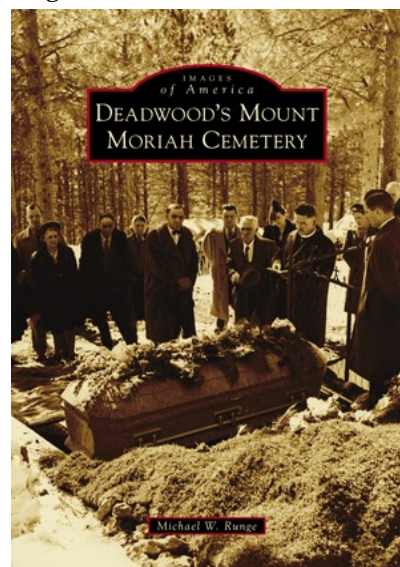

Images of America series: Deadwood's Mount Moriah Cemetery

The Deadwood Historic Preservation Commission and the City of Deadwood are proud to present a new book from Arcadia Publishing titled, Deadwood's Mount Moriah Cemetery, written by City Archivist Mike Runge. This new book chronicles the evolution of Mount Moriah Cemetery and the stories of the individuals – both colorful and illustrious – who helped carve Deadwood into the annals of the American West. The photographs in this book were gathered through resources from local and regional archives, including the City of Deadwood Archives; the Deadwood Public Library; Deadwood History, Inc.; Historic Black Hills Studios; the Minnilusa Historical Association; and the Denver Public Library. WAR ON WEEDS

It's a war and the battle is raging in our city! The definition of a weed is "a plant out of place". The most important thing is to keep a weed from going to seed. Seeds can lay dormant for eight to ten years. Pulling weeds, when the soil is moist, is your best bet. If you can grasp the plant as close to the soil as possible, you will usually be able to get the root also. This is the best scenario. Cutting off the flower head before seeding is another alternative. Spraying herbicides should be your last resort. If you do choose to spray:

- Read the label! Be sure you are using the right product; wear the right personal protection equipment (PPE) and follow the directions for best results.
- Be careful of run off and drift so you don't damage desirable plants or any water.
- PROTECT POLLINATORS!!!! All new labels will say if the chemical is harmful to pollinators and how to use it properly. Pollinators such as bees would be affected.

Betsy Carbo a Horticulturist working for the City of Deadwood is available to answer your questions regarding weeds. When you see her around town fighting the war on weeds say "Hi" or bring her a cup of coffee and share your plant questions. 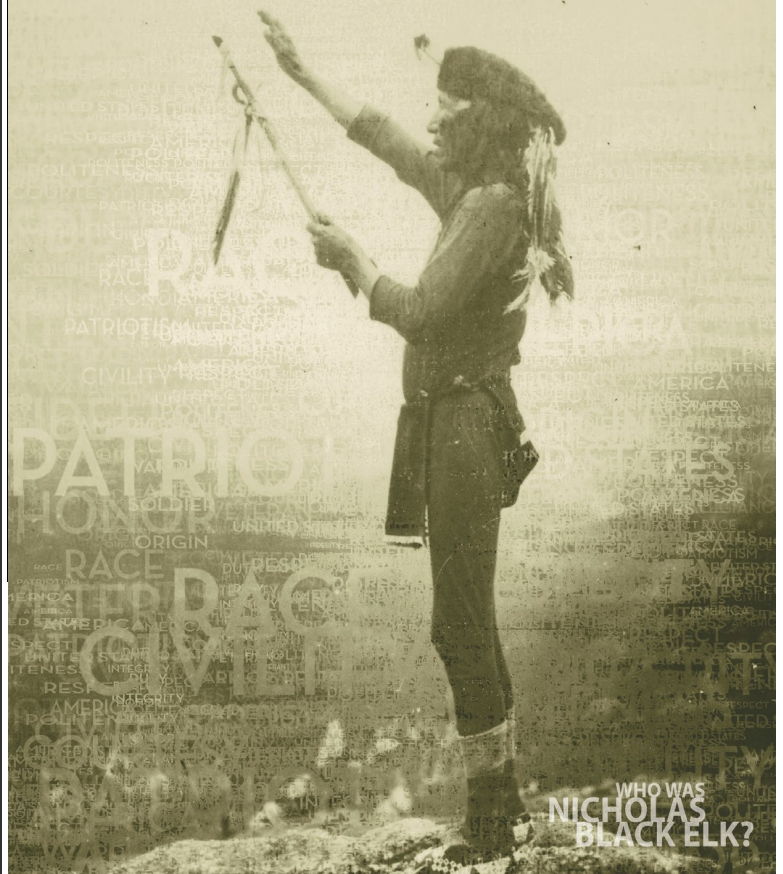
