Historic Preservation Archives Moment: Metals **Conservator Visits the City Archaeological Collection**

On October 17-19, 2016, Ms. Nichole Daub, the head metals conservator from the Maryland Archaeological Conservation (MAC) Laboratory in St. Leonard, Maryland came to the City of Deadwood and spent three days with staff reviewing the City's archaeological collections. The purpose of the visit was to assess the overall condition of the metals collections,

educate city staff on what treatments can be performed in-house and provide recommendations for long term storage and care of archaeological metal objects. During the visit, Historic Preservation staff spent two and one half days with Ms. Daub. One of the side projects included reviewing the bronze sculptures, the USS Maine shell and bells on public display within the City. Upon conclusion of this project, Ms. Daub will provide the Historic Preservation Office with a written document outlining the needs and recommendations for the City of Deadwood as related to metal objects.

DEADWOOD HISTORIC PRESERVATION COMMISSION **RESIDENTIAL REHABILITATION PROGRAM**

The Deadwood Historic Preservation Commission is once again offering a program to residents in Deadwood to help stimulate the quality restoration and protection of buildings contributing to the historic integrity of the City of Deadwood. The recipient of the program will receive grant funds for the restoration or rehabilitation of the historic exterior, roof, siding, foundation, windows and life safety issues to include plumbing, electrical, HVAC, retaining wall and drainage. All costs associated with the restoring or repairing of exterior and life safety issues will be paid 100% by the Historic Preservation Commission with a cap of \$100,000.

The recipient must first be nominated for the program by a neighbor or resident. The application will be reviewed by the Neighborhood Block Club Council and recommendations will be made to a selection committee for final nomination to the Historic Preservation Commission for approval or denial. The Historic Preservation Commission may approve up to two contributing buildings for 2017 based on the extent of rehabilitation costs.

To be eligible the building must be located on a primary street, easily viewable from the right of way and listed as a contributing historic property. The building must be a residential property and the building must be owner occupied for at least ten years. A non-contributing building may be eligible if the removal of inappropriate alterations or the reconstruction of missing details will reverse the listing to a contributing resource.

November Safety Awareness

Ear plugs are important!

- Use earplugs or earmuffs to protect you from loud noises.

- Long term exposure to 80-85 decibels or more can cause hearing loss without protection. It is not recommended to be exposed to 100 decibels without any protection for more than 15 minutes. Hearing loss can be permanent.

- Decibel levels of common sounds:

- Aircraft takeoff: 180
- Chainsaw: 110
- Amplified music: 110
- Lawnmower: 90
- Normal conversation: 60
- Signs of noise being too loud at workplace:
- Ringing or humming in your ears when you leave work.
- You have to shout to hear coworkers at arm's length away.
- You experience temporary hearing loss when you leave work.

Properly wearing ear plugs:

- Rubber Style Ear plugs.

1. Reach over your head and pull the top of the ear outward and upward.

- 2. With the other hand grasp the ear plug handle and gently push and rock into ear canal until a good seal is made.
- 3. Adjust to the greatest noise reduction.
- 4. Remove with a slow twisting motion to break seal.

- Foam Style Ear Plugs.

- 1. Roll the plug into a small cylinder.
- 2. Reach overhead and pull the top of the ear outward and upward.
- 3. Insert the plug in the ear canal.
- 4. Hold it in the ear canal until the plug expands and a good seal is made.
- 5. Remove with a slow twisting motion to break seal.
