# HP Moment: 2015 Chinese Textile Conservation Project

After more than a year of waiting and anticipation, the City of Deadwood received the cleaned and stabilized clothing unearthed during the 2001 Deadwood Chinatown archaeological investigation. In January of 2015, the City of Deadwood hired the Midwest Art Conservation Center (MACC) located in the Minneapolis Institute of Art in Minneapolis, Minnesota to hydrate, clean, and flatten a large clump of fabric associated with a Daoist death ritual known as "shao hua". In the Chinese language, "shao hua" is defined as the cremation or



burning of objects as an offering to the dead. The ceremony is performed within the first few



hours after a person's death. Upon its arrival at the MACC, textile conservators began the daunting task of rehydrating fabric and flattening out the garments. During the course of the project, emails and digital photographs were periodically sent to City Staff. One of the more fascinating discoveries during the conservation was the intricate floral embroidery on one of the garments. In addition to the clothing, an assortment of personal possessions, food offerings, Chinese currency, and opium and smoking paraphernalia

were found wrapped inside the textiles at the time of discovery by South Dakota State Archaeologists. This project is just one of several conservation projects to be funded by the Deadwood Historic Preservation Commission and City of Deadwood in recent years.

Upon completion of this project, the clothing and associated artifacts will provide a unique glimpse into 19<sup>th</sup> century traditional Chinese clothing and mortuary rituals. A detailed account of this project will be featured on Deadwood's Historic Preservation YouTube channel.





# CDDERED

By now you should be familiar with the City of Deadwood's new high-speed mass notification system to keep our residents informed. CodeRED provides two important notification services: **General** and **Emergency** messages.

- General messages will be received from 855-969-4636, which are used to communicate non-life safety matters, such as community events, planned road closures, water main repairs, and power service interruptions.
- Emergency messages will be received from 866-419-5000 and will keep citizens informed of emergencies such as an evacuation notice, utility outages, fire or floods, severe weather, or other emergency situations.

You are encouraged to program these numbers into your cell phone so the phone number will be easily identifiable. If you need to replay the message again, simply dial the number and you will be able to hear the message again.

The City of Deadwood encourages citizens to stay informed by signing up for CodeRED. If you have already signed up for CodeRED and would like to modify which messages you receive, simply go to the City of Deadwood

website, <a href="www.cityofdeadwood.com">www.cityofdeadwood.com</a>, and select the CodeRED signup on the upper right of the homepage. You are asked to fill in the required information again. Under "Phones" you will see check boxes for Alert Types and you are able to select or

deselect the notifications you wish to receive. If you do not have internet or would like assistance modifying your notifications, please call (605)578-2082.

There is also an app called **CodeRED Mobile Alert** that can be downloaded onto your smartphone for free from iTunes or Google Play which will allow you to modify your notifications and settings as well.



#### **Lawrence County Historical Society Spring Meeting at the HARCC**

DEADWOOD – The Lawrence County Historic Society will host their spring meeting at the Homestake Adams Research and Cultural Center (HARCC) on Sunday, May 15, 2016, at 12:00 p.m. The cost, including lunch is \$15.00 per person. The spring meeting will focus on the Botanical Legacy of Deadwood's Chinatown District. Archaeological excavations from 2001-2004 revealed several major structures in Deadwood's Chinatown District. Also noted were privies and a ceremonial pit that was probably used for disposal of personal items. The Black Hills State University (BHSU) herbarium — a plant research facility located in Spearfish, South Dakota — has recently analyzed materials collected from the site.

The presentation will introduce the BHSU herbarium and its botanical research projects, summarize the known history of Deadwood's Chinatown District, report on the composition of plant specimens recovered to date from the study site, and offer preliminary insights on uses of plants by the Chinese population.

Starbucks at Tin Lizzie is partnering with the City of Deadwood for a Spring Community Event.



# **May Safety - Electrical Safety and Bicycle Safety**





Electricity and toddlers don't mix. Help protect your child by placing protective covers on all unused outlets within the child's reach.

The number one electrical safety rule for anyone to remember is this: Don't touch a power line or anything that's touching the power line such as a tree limb, kite string, or model airplane. No one can tell by looking at a line whether it is energized or not, and contact with a power line can be deadly. Summer activities include tossing footballs and playing badminton. Teach your children the importance of getting help from adults if they need to retrieve balls or anything from a power line.

Keep liquids, such as soft drinks, away from electrical items, including TVs, VCRs, and computers. They could spill and cause dangerous shocks and fires.

When there is lightening, stay away from trees and get inside.

Help children learn to stay away from transformers and other ground-mounted electrical equipment.

Remember; keep power tools and electric lawn tools away from swimming pools and sprinklers. Water and electricity don't mix! Power tools should never be used when children are in, or are around, the area.

Keep children well away from lawnmowers, weed-eaters, and other products that may throw objects, such as rocks and sticks.

Little boys love tree houses. Remember; don't build tree houses in trees near electric lines. Never allow your children to climb trees growing near power lines.



Over 800 people die in the U.S. from bicycle crashes, mostly from head injuries. Studies show wearing a helmet can prevent injuries more than 85% of the time. May is Bicycle

Safety Month, and this is a good time to fit your whole family with bike helmets!

No helmets on playgrounds! Kids have died from strangulation on monkey bars when their

helmets got caught. Remind your children to take their helmets off when getting off their bikes. Nearly 1/3 of car-bike crashes occur when a child rides a bicycle down a driveway, into the path of a car. Teach your kids how important it is to stop, look left, look right, look left again and

listen to be sure no cars are coming, before entering a street.

Be bright...dress right! Bright clothing can double the distance from which a driver sees a child during the day. Children who can be seen are less likely to be hit by a motor vehicle.

## **Historic Preservation Paint Grant Program**

The Deadwood Historic Preservation Commission recognizes pride of ownership is a valuable resource and improves the quality of life in this community and has established the Paint Grant Program, for up to \$500.00, to inspire property maintenance and improvement of Deadwood's historic neighborhoods and commercial district. To be eligible for the Paint Grant Program, a property must meet the following qualifications:

- The property must be located within the Deadwood city limits
- The property, commercial or residential, must be at least 20 years or older
- The property must not have used the Program in the previous five years
- The Paint Grant Program is only available for exterior surfaces
