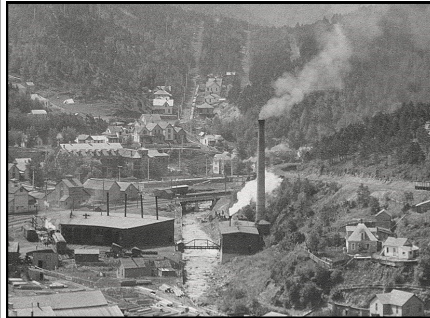

Deadwood's Newest Park - Powerhouse Park Update



Over the past month, some noticeable work has been performed at Deadwood's newest park, Powerhouse Park, located at 50 Water Street, near the Michelson Trailhead. Historically, this area was once part of the Burlington Interurban Power Plant, constructed in 1902. The power plant provided electricity to power the interurban trolleys that ran between the communities of Lead and Deadwood via Gold Run, today's US Highway 85. One of the more remarkable features of the substation was the 125' brick smoke stack that contained approximately 35,000 bricks. The power plant operated from 1902 until 1910. Ten years later, the smoke stack was demolished in place and the site sat vacant for over ninety-five years.

Two weeks ago, RSC Construction began the task of preparing the site for the new park. This included slowly removing the loose brick throughout the site and revealing the partially buried brick feature. Overseeing this part of the project is Randy Haynes, a stone mason from Spearfish, South Dakota. Haynes was hired to oversee the stabilization of the brick feature and partially rebuilding a portion of the smoke stack. After removing the loose brick, the square brick feature was identified as the cleanout box for the coal powered substation. Unbeknownst at the time, construction workers discovered a manhole beside the brick cleanout box. It appears the manhole was installed after the demolition of the substation. Embossed on the manhole cover were the words "WATERTOWN FDY S.D.". Shortly after the discovery, the Historic Preservation Office Archives contacted the Codington County Historical Museum in Watertown, South Dakota to learn about the Watertown Foundry. The Deadwood Historic Preservation Office will provide updates as the project develops.



Highway 85 Construction

Weekly meetings are held every Tuesday at 11:00 a.m. in the City Hall Commission Chambers. For the duration of the project:

- Expect 15 minute delays and one way traffic at various and changing locations
- Expect traffic stops and flaggers in the roadway and pilot car operations
- Motorcyclists should use extreme caution. Consider using 14A through Central City; especially during inclement weather.
- Access for business entrances will be maintained throughout the duration of the project
- The Mickelson Trail is being utilized as an alternate pedestrian route at various locations (check website link below for map)
- Expect increased truck traffic and equipment operating in the roadway

Deadwood Welcome Center Progress Report



The Deadwood Welcome Center project is slightly ahead of schedule. Construction crews are currently working on the sidewalks adjacent to the four lanes on the far north end and working on the storm sewer and curbing in the parking lot area. The masons have been working this week on the stone inset of the retaining wall facing Whitewood Creek. The plumbers have been working on the under slab and the electricians will be coming in right behind them.

Structural steel has been delivered to the site and the bridge has been set in place. Utilities across the highway have been bored in. The projected asphalt date for the parking lot is mid-June, with anticipation to have at least two-thirds of the parking lot open to the public before Wild Bill Days.

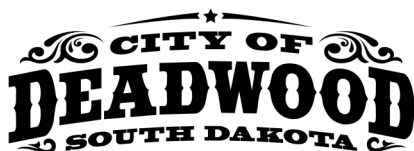
