Deadwood Historic Preservation Spotlight Project

In August, representatives from Black Hills State University (BHSU) Herbarium picked up six cubic feet of botanical specimens collected during the 2001 to 2004 Chinatown archaeological excavations. This fall, BHSU Herbarium will analyze the collection, make recommendations for long term conservation, and help develop an educational exhibit for these objects. The City's botanical collection is unique since it provides an insight into the diet of people who once lived along Deadwood's lower Main Street before 1920. Seed and dried plant specimens from both

native and introduced species are represented in the assemblage. Upon completion, the data from this collection will be included in the Collaborative Database of the Plants from Western South Dakota and Eastern Wyoming including the Bear Lodge Mountains and Black Hills, managed by the BHSU Herbarium.

Upcoming work on the reconstruction project is as follows: grade and base course from Regional Hospital to Corral Street; storm drain work from Stewart Street to Walnut Street; sidewalk work from Cemetery Street to Deadwood Home Center; water line work from Stewart Street to Walnut Street.

Preservation Thursday — September 20, 2015 Historian Paul Hedren from Omaha, Nebraska, will explore the clash between the U.S. Army and the Northern Cheyenne Indians on March 17, 1876, just west of the Black Hills. This was the first great battle in a war fully grounded in Black Hills Gold. The fight went poorly for the army and three court-martials occurred in consequence. It was even more devastating to the Cheyenne people. Instead of avoiding this Indian War, they soon were enmeshed in all that followed, joining the great Indian coalition that fought Crook at the Rosebud and whipped Custer at the Little Big Horn. 
