Winterizing Reminder: How to Cope with Freezing Temperatures

As snow and cold rolls back into the Black Hills, City departments ask residents and property owners to be proactive in protecting their property by taking measures to winterize. Frigid temperatures can lead to frozen water pipes and costly plumbing repairs; heat loss due to open crevices; and the obstruction of fire hydrants due to heavy accumulation of snow. Take the time to find and locate where the water's master shutoff valve is in your house in case of an emergency situation.

To help in your winterization checklist, follow these helpful tips:

- * If property is vacant, either shut off master water valve OR have Water Dept. shut water off at curb stop outside;
- * After water is shut off, drain pipes OR leave heat on to prevent pipe bursts;
- * Detach outdoor hoses from faucets & drain hoses; insulate pipes or faucets in unheated areas;
- * Seal off access doors, air vents and cracks; cover unused windows to prevent drafts;
- * Keep fire hydrants clear of snow to help firefighters easily locate and access water; this preserves valuable time to potentially save lives and structures.

Taking the time to do these simple steps will save you costly repairs and assist the City in serving you.

PUBLIC SERVICE ANNOUNCEMENT: Deadwood Reconstruction Update

On August 26, 2014 the Department of Transportation (DOT) and the City of Deadwood held a meeting with perspective contractors to discuss the overall operations of the Deadwood Hwy 85 Reconstruction Project. During the meeting, one of the topics addressed due to safety concerns was the rock excavation sites near Southside Auto and Twin City Hardware. Excavations of these cliffs, which may involve blasting, are proposed to take place around the end of October.

Once the rock excavation work begins, the following schedules for each site are being tentatively suggested:

Southside Auto

- * Total of 30 Working Days to complete all rock excavation work;
- * First 10 Working Days (of the 30 total days) will require full closure between 9AM and 3PM with traffic allowed to pass through every ½ hour;
- * During the remaining 20 Working Days a single lane of traffic would be controlled by flaggers during working hours and temporary signals at night. A maximum delay is estimated to be 10 minutes when traffic is controlled by temporary signals or flaggers;
- * Traffic will need to be stopped any time the contractor blasts rock.

Twin City Hardware

- * Total of 35 Working Days to complete all rock excavation work;
- * First 10 Working Days (of the 35 total days) will require full closure between 9AM and 3PM with traffic allowed to pass through every ½ hour;
- * During the remaining 25 Working Days a single lane of traffic would be controlled by flaggers during working hours and temporary signals at night. A maximum delay is estimated to be 10 minutes when traffic is controlled by temporary signals or flaggers;
- * Traffic will need to be stopped any time the contractor blasts rock.

Information will be provided as plans are finalized. Area hotels and employers are asked to inform their staff of any tentative plans that may need to be in place during this time. During blasting the Trolley routes will only extend to Sherman Street Parking lot located near the Mickelson Trailhead from 8 AM - 3 PM. Please keep an eye out for further information as these plans are not set in stone and may be subject to change.

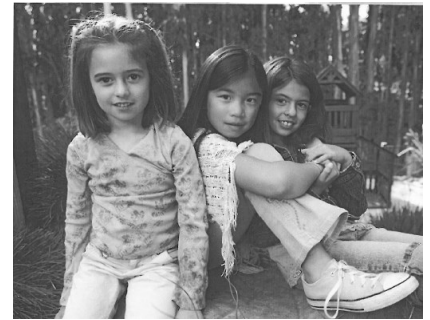
