Safety Tips: New Year's Eve

If you are hosting a New Year's Eve party, following a few simple rules could prevent a tragedy:

- Plan ahead by naming a "designated driver." Make this your responsibility as the host.
- Contact a local cab company to provide rides for your guests.
- Serve non-alcoholic beverages as an option to your guests.
- Stop serving alcohol to your guests several hours before the party ends.
- Provide your guests with a place to stay overnight in your home.

- If you drink, don't drive.
 - ◊ Plan ahead and always designate a sober driver before the party or celebration begins.
 - ◊ If you are impaired, call a taxi, use mass transit, or get a sober friend or family member to come pick you up.
 - ◊ Or, stay where you are until you are sober.

Take the keys from someone if you think he/she is too impaired to drive.

PUBLIC NOTICE: Hwy 85 Reconstruction Meetings

Weekly public meetings for updates on the Highway 85 Reconstruction Project will be held at the Deadwood City Hall every Tuesday at 11 AM unless otherwise noted due to weather or holiday observations. These meetings are open to the public; all are welcome and encouraged to attend.

In addition, the Hwy 85 Project is moving ahead of schedule. Phase I of the rock cut near Southside Service Station is anticipated to be done around the week of November 24th. Phase II involving the rock cut near Twin City Hardware is anticipated to start around Monday, December 1st. During the 1st two weeks of this phase, expect 30 minute delays from 9AM to 3PM as well as a 10 minute delays from approximately 6:30-9AM and from approximately 3-5PM.

To qualify for the DENR Secretary's Award for Drinking Water Excellence, public water systems and their System Operations Specialists had to meet all of the following requirements for ten consecutive years or more: compliance monitoring and reporting, drinking water standards, and certification requirements.

Deadwood Revitalization Committee (DRC) - Progress Report

The success of Revitalizing Deadwood depends upon many factors, including city and citizen involvement. The Deadwood Revitalization Committee (DRC) is providing this update regarding their progress and encourages valuable input of ideas and feedback from all Deadwood businesses, property owners, residents and those gainfully employed in Deadwood.

In their Progress Report several items of discussion are highlighted such as DRC's review of the first draft of Roger Brooks Int'l (RBI), **Branding, Development & Marketing Action Plan** which includes a Main Street plaza geared toward building upon Deadwood's incredible assets; their work with city staff in preparing a **RFP/RFQ** directed at urban planning professionals to provide design, cost estimates, programming, building phases, traffic flows and conceptual drawings for the proposed Main Street plaza. Also, noted is the **Constitutional Amendment Q**, one of RBI's action items to keep Deadwood Gaming competitive, which passed November 4th; the next step in this process will be with the South Dakota Legislature in 2015, then the South Dakota Gaming Commission, with rules in place to allow craps, roulette and keno starting July 1, 2015.

The Deadwood Revitalization Committee (DRC) coordinates with three additional committees: **Design, Economic Restructuring and Promotion**.

The Design Committee works directly with business owners and the City of Deadwood department heads in coordinated efforts to enhance the visual appearance, traffic flow, and customer perception of our entire city. The Economic Restructuring Committee focuses on business diversification and is creating a list of potential new businesses they'd like to see in Deadwood.
