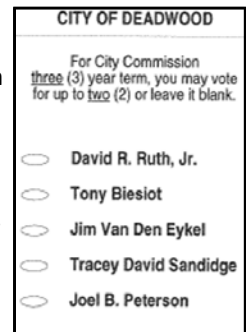


**City of Deadwood Municipal Election is April 8, 2014**

Five candidates are on the ballot this year. Incumbent Commissioners Jim Van Den Eykel and Joe Peterson will be running against David Ruth, Jr., Tony Biesiot, and Tracey Sandidge. Registered Deadwood voters will choose two (2) commissioners.

## Public Meeting on Rotary Park Project

In January 2014 the City of Deadwood took on a project to enhance Rotary Park. The goal of this project was to make this area of Deadwood a family friendly outdoor recreation area to be used by the residents as well as visitors to Deadwood. Elevate Design Studios of Rapid City was chosen to provide schematic designs for the following items of interest: Tennis Court; Pickle Ball; Horseshoe; Trolley Stop; Parking; and Toboggan Hill.



The Rotary Park Project is scheduled to start in June and be completed by September 1, 2014. The construction budget for this project has been estimated and approved for \$165,000 not including the design professional fees.

There is a Public Open House scheduled for April 3, 2014 at 4:30 to 5:45PM at the Deadwood City Hall to discuss the proposed sequence and traffic control.

## Public Meeting Scheduled for US Hwy 85 Reconstruction Project



This fall, the South Dakota Department of Transportation will begin the Highway 85 Reconstruction project. This project includes the overhaul between Highway 385 and Cemetery Street of the storm sewer, curb and gutter, asphalt surfacing, and lighting; the conversion to three lanes between Highway 385 and Walnut Street; asphalt resurfacing of road between Whistler’s Gulch Campground and Burlington Street; and revamp the primary two lanes with scattered on-street parking between Walnut Street and Cemetery Street.

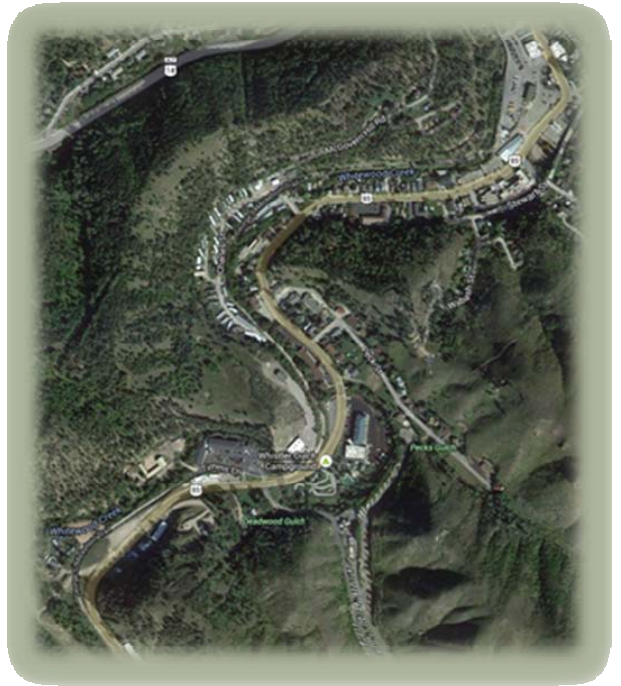
The Bid Letting is tentatively scheduled for August 2014. Some utility work will begin this fall along Charles Street as well as some rock work and the re-alignment of the Mickelson Trail near the hardware store.

In 2015, road work will begin at Cemetery Street and progress out to the Super 8. In 2016, the work is scheduled to continue from Junction 385 to the Super 8.

Access to all residents and businesses will remain open during the construction and the City will ensure communication lines are open to all citizens on the project .

To improve the awareness of this project with the community, there is a Public Meeting scheduled on April 1, 2014 from 5 to 7 PM at the Deadwood Gulch Gaming Resort’s Convention Center located at 304 Cliff Street.

Please plan to attend this meet to become better informed on the project!



## Snow Removal Reminder



When you remove snow promptly after a snowfall, you play an important role in keeping our city safe in difficult weather. Snow and ice permitted to gather upon the sidewalks of Deadwood is dangerous to the safety of its citizens and others using such sidewalks and is declared a public nuisance. Please remember that in accordance to Deadwood’s Snow Removal Ordinance 12.20.020, snow needs to be cleared from sidewalks within 24 hours after snow has fallen or ice has formed. ## “City Embarks on Wayfinding: What is it?”

The Deadwood Historic Preservation Commission budgeted funds in 2014 to develop a “Wayfinding Program” for the City of Deadwood. Wayfinding is the organization and communication of our dynamic relationship to space and the environment; it explores ways to navigate from one place to another as well as improve movement for pedestrians, cyclists and motorists. Back in December 1990 the Deadwood Historic Preservation Commission and City Commission identified wayfinding as an action item outlined in the Deadwood Comprehensive Historic Preservation Plan. It aimed to integrate a range of navigation and communication tools for traversing through and about Deadwood, such as signage, brochures, kiosks and today smart-phone applications. The City of Deadwood will be greatly enhanced by this project which will direct visitors and other road users to key civic, cultural, visitor and recreational attractions in Deadwood by use of signage. Examples of the original wayfinding signage from the Comprehensive Plan are shown here.
