Deadwood's Snocross Event named <u>AMSOIL</u> Championship Snocross Event of the Year for 2014

Deadwood's Snocross held in late January has become an annual winter event for motorsports enthusiasts throughout the region.

In early May ISOC, the International Series of Champions, producers and promoters of 2013-14 AMSOIL Championship Snocross, powered by Ram, announced the Deadwood Snocross Shootout, presented by K&N Filters, had been named the "Event of the Year" for America's premier competition snowmobile racing series.

Arbor Day Exhibits

In 1872, Arbor Day was declared as a day to "to plant trees, both forest and fruit". A Tree Board was established in Deadwood and every year since 1993, Deadwood has been awarded a "Tree City USA" designation.

The Deadwood Tree Board organizes and hosts the annual Arbor Day celebration which includes tree planting and an art contest for third and fourth grade students at the Lead/Deadwood Elementary School. The winners of each grade are placed on exhibit at the Deadwood Information and Visitor Center located at 3 Siever Street.

Excavated Firearms from Deadwood's Chinatown Dig

After a year of conservation treatments, five firearms discovered from the Deadwood Chinatown dig have returned to Deadwood. In April of 2013, Historic Preservation Office sent five firearms excavated from the 2002 Deadwood Chinatown archaeological dig to the Maryland Archaeological Conservation Laboratory (MAC Lab) in St. Leonard, Maryland. The MAC Lab has performed conservation treatments on metal artifacts excavated from some of the Nation's earliest archaeological settlements including historic Jamestown and Colonial

Williamsburg in Virginia.


Unbeknown at the time, one of the firearms was still loaded as

indicated by the x-rays performed at the MAC Lab. The guns underwent a battery of cleaning and desalination sessions before being coated with a clear acrylic sealant. The guns will be on display at the Deadwood City Hall before being exhibited at one of Deadwood Historic Inc.'s Museum.
