PUBLIC SERVICE ANNOUNCEMENT: US Hwy 85 Reconstruction Update

In preparation for the scheduled highway 85 reconstruction this fall utility companies located in the Sherman and Charles Street corridor will be installing underground conduit for their facilities during the months of August and September. Work is complete from the Cemetery and Sherman Street intersection to the Stewart Street intersection. Work has now resumed and continues south with expectations of reaching the Walnut Street Bridge by mid-September.

Residential and commercial properties that are expected to be switched from overhead utility service to underground utility service may expect this to happen sometime from late August to the middle of September. Black Hills Power and the City hired electrician will schedule these changes with the landowners as the project proceeds south down Charles Street. This work is

expected to cause minor traffic delays as the work is being done in the sidewalk and boulevard locations on the north side of Charles Street along with various road crossings on Charles Street. There will not at any point be a complete road closure but you can expect some periods of one lane traffic with flaggers with delays both north and south bound. Sidewalks that are removed as a result of this

construction will be replaced with asphalt surfacing by the City of Deadwood as the contractor moves through the project to keep the businesses and residents in the construction area minimally impacted.

"Deadwood Stagecoach Days: 1876-1890"

On September 5-6, 2014, Deadwood History, Inc. will host the first annual "*Deadwood Stagecoach Days: 1876-1890*" at the Days of '76 Museum and Rodeo Grounds in Deadwood. This two-day event is co-sponsored by the Deadwood Historic Preservation Commission and National Stagecoach & Freight Wagon Association.

Deadwood's youthful attitude pervades the historic community year in and year out with the annual Days of '76 Celebration when the town harkens back to gold rush days where the only access to the gulch was by foot, horse, mule or ox team. Freight wagons and stagecoaches made the journey to the Black Hills on trails from Cheyenne, Sidney, Bismarck, Medora, Miles City and Fort Pierre.

The event features stagecoach and freight wagon demonstrations, wagon show and dust off, talks by noted historians and wagon experts, musical entertainment, 19th century craftsmanship expo, old-fashioned games, tours of the Days of '76 Museum's carriage collection, chuck wagon meal and more.

Registration is \$80 for both days (includes all activities and meals) or \$45 for one day (includes all activities and meals). On Saturday tickets will be available at the gate for \$15 for adults and \$5 for children, meals not included but may be purchased separately for \$15 per person. Wall of Fame

Deadwood's Historic Preservation Office located at 108 Sherman Street is now accepting applications for the 2014 Deadwood Wall of Fame program. This program began in 2005 as a way to honor individuals who made a significant contribution to the history and development of Deadwood. Deadwood's Historic Preservation Commission would like to encourage the general public to submit a completed application of individual(s) in the following fields: Arts and Humanities; Athletics; Business & Trade; Educational & Cultural Affairs; Governmental Affairs; Historical Characters; Professional; and Unsung Heroes & Good Hearts.

Since it began in 2005, a total of 18 individuals have been honored as a result of this program. The Deadwood Wall of Fame is on permanent display at the Deadwood City Hall (102-108 Sherman Street) and also online at www.deadwoodcenturyawards.com under "Wall of Fame" tab.

Applications for the Wall of Fame can either be picked up at the Historic Preservation Office located at 108 Sherman Street or be downloaded from the City's webpage www.cityofdeadwood.com under Permit, Licenses, & Forms. All applications to be considered for the 2014 Wall of Fame must be submitted no later than Friday, September 19, 2014. The Deadwood Historic Preservation Grants, Recognition, Advocacy, and Public Education committee will review all completed applications and select two. The selected nominees will be unveiled during one of the regularly scheduled Historic Preservation Commission meetings in October 2014.



September is Self Improvement Month! Let's Take a Walk


