Dead Storage Reminder

The City of Deadwood Community Service Officer's (CSO's) would like to remind the community about the importance of our dead storage ordinance. Vehicles left on public property (street, alley way, or parking lot) over 24 hours will be considered dead storage and will be issued a ticket and towed at the owner's expense.

Vehicles includes abandoned, wrecked, dismantled, inoperative, partially dismantled or junk motor vehicles or parts.

The CSO's are asking the community to familiarize themselves with Deadwood City Ordinance Chapter 10.16 ABANDONED VEHICLES which is available on the City's website at www.cityofdeadwood.com.

The time is now to get signed up to receive snow related CodeRED messages.

Feeding the Deer

The City of Deadwood finds that the baiting of deer by placing unnatural food sources upon any real property within the city for the purpose of attracting deer to each such unnatural food source has the effect of enticing deer from their natural habitat into an unnatural growth of the deer population, resulting in an unnatural loss of the deer's instinctive avoidance of humans, resulting in reliance by deer upon such unnatural food source, and also endangering persons and domestic animals, and resulting in damage to property.

"Unnatural food source" means any amount of grain, fruit, vegetables, nuts, hay, salt blocks or other similar edible material or substance which has the effect of attracting deer

for the purpose of eating such material. "Unnatural food source" does not include growing plants or the natural remainders of such growing plants. Living food sources such as fruit trees and other vegetation shall not be considered as "unnatural food sources".


