Can I Operate My ATV/UTV on Public Roadways?

ATV's and UTV's are legal to drive on public roadways in the State of South Dakota. However, they are required to be licensed. If they are not licensed from your state, you can purchase temporary licenses from any treasurer's office in South Dakota which allows them to be operated on public roads, excluding the interstate highway system. The Lawrence County Treasurer's Office is located in Deadwood at 90 Sherman Street .

If you plan on using the Forest Service trail systems, a Motorized Vehicle Use Trail Permit is required for any motor vehicle traveling on motorized use trails in the Black Hills. The trails requiring permits are marked. The permits can be obtained at the locations in the link below.

Mirrors, brake lights, headlights, and an audible signal (horn) are required on your ATV/UTV to operate on public roads. Eye protection is required if you do not have a windshield. One can use hand signals to indicate a directional change. Operators and passengers under the age of 18 are required to wear a helmet. The ATV/UTV must be insured to operate on a public road. Make sure the proof of insurance is with you.

Feeding the Deer

The City finds that the baiting of deer by placing unnatural food sources upon any real property within the city for the purpose of attracting deer to eat such unnatural food source has the effect of enticing deer from their natural habitat into



an unnatural urban environment, thereby endangering the deer, resulting in an unnatural growth of the deer population, resulting in an unnatural loss of the deer's instinctive avoidance of humans, resulting in reliance by deer upon such unnatural food source, and also endangering persons and domestic animals, and resulting in damage to property. (Reference Deer Baiting Ordinance 6.12)

SNOW REMOVAL NOTICE

The Deadwood Public Works Department would like to remind you cars need to be removed from the street during snow removal. Residents will be notified one day in advance via CodeRED when snow removal is scheduled for their street. If your car is not removed prior to snow removal it will be ticketed and towed.

Sidewalks need to be cleared within 24 hours after the snow stops falling. Failure to clear your sidewalk will result in the city clearing the sidewalk. A fee of \$71.50/man hour will be charged if the City is required to clear the sidewalk. Snow should not be shoveled into the street after the snow has been removed.

The Public Works Department appreciates the cooperation of the citizens to assure our streets are passable and our sidewalks are safe. If there are questions, please feel free to contact us at (605) 578-3082.

Pet Ordinances

The City of Deadwood would like to remind residents all pets must be licensed every year, be on a leash when walking on the trails, sidewalks, in parks, and other public places within the City of Deadwood. Most importantly you are required to clean up after your pet as well, even in the snow!

Please do your part to keep beautiful Historic Deadwood safe and clean for visitors and other residents.

Below are the ordinances pertaining to the above issues.

6.08.070 License required.

Any person within the city who keeps, maintains, or has in his or her custody or under his or her control any dog or cat shall first obtain a license to do so.

6.04.020 Animals running at large.

It is unlawful for any person to allow any animal owned by him or her or under his or her control to run at large within the city.

6.08.050 Removal of pet excrement.

It is unlawful for any person who owns, possesses, harbors or is in charge of any dog or cat to not immediately remove excrement deposited by the animal upon a common thoroughfare, street, sidewalk, play area, park or upon any other public property.

Recycling Reminder

Allowed:

Below is a list of recyclable items allowed in the blue containers:

Aluminum: beverage cans, food cans, aluminum bottles, hairspray cans, shaving cream cans, and spray starch cans

Steel: vegetable cans, soup cans, food cans, coffee cans, empty paint cans, and empty aerosol cans

Plastics: milk jugs, detergent jugs, water bottles, hair care bottles, food containers, empty paint containers, drained oil containers, items with a recycle triangle on the bottom (**Please triple rinse pesticide or other toxic substance containers**)

Glass: beverage bottles, jars (Please remove lids)

Not Allowed:

Please DO NOT place the following items in the blue containers: Styrofoam, plastic grocery bags, food wrap, automobile oil, plastic toys, aluminum foil, packing peanuts, Pyrex, pool chemical containers, shiny cardboard, paperboard, cereal boxes, drinking glasses, light bulbs, ceramics, window glass, mirrors, PVC, scrap metal: toasters, pots, coat hangers, service pans, pie tins, and roasting pans (No Garbage Please)

Additional Information:

If the blue container is out when the garbage truck comes by, they may check to see if there are any of the items on the not allowed list above. If so, they will dump the container as it is considered contaminated. Also, the recycling truck will not empty the blue container if they consider it contaminated by one or more of these items.

Corrugated cardboard and newspapers can be recycled at the Community Recycle Bins located in the Sherman Street parking lot.


