# Deadwood Mountain Grand Ownership Donates Conservation Easement

Deadwood's National Historic Landmark and its viewshed was further protected through

the voluntary, legal agreement known as a conservation easement with ZCN, LLC, the ownership of the Deadwood Mountain Grand. The conservation easement is a viable tool for the long-term protection of the historic integrity of the City of Deadwood for future generations.

A portion of McGovern Hill was recently restricted from potential development through the donation of an easement to the Deadwood



Historic Preservation Commission. The ownership of the DMG made a momentous guarantee to the long-term preservation of Deadwood's natural setting, viewshed and historic character.

# **Fassbender Photographic Collections**

The past year has been a challenge for most organizations and the Fassbender Photographic Collection is no exception. Volunteer participation was halted and attention was given to tidying up the database with spelling corrections and in some cases, updated information. Cataloguing and digitizing the collection continues as well. Just over 35,000 entries have been made in our database to date. In addition, there have been thousands of items listed in a spreadsheet as a means of "pre-sorting" some of the collection.

More recently, Madalen Sprigler from Spearfish High School joined our efforts to learn more about being an archivist. Sprigler took part as a job shadow and was able to do

# **Have You Signed Up for CodeRED?**

The City of Deadwood uses CodeRED, a high-speed mass notification system, to keep residents informed. The notification system delivers general and emergency messages to residents via phone, text message and email.

General messages are used to communicate non-life safety matters such as community events, planned road closures, power service interruptions and water main repairs. Emergency messages notify residents of emergencies such as an evacuation notice, utility outages, fire, floods, severe weather or other emergency situations.

The Public Works Department utilizes CodeRED during the winter to notify residents of upcoming snow clearing to make sure all vehicles are removed from the road.
