DANR Recognizes City of Deadwood for Drinking Water Compliance

On July 21, 2021, The South Dakota Department of Agriculture and Natural Resources (DANR) announced the City of Deadwood public water

system and the system's operations specialists have been awarded a Secretary's Award for Drinking Water Excellence.

"Access to safe and reliable water sources is crucial for all South Dakotan's," said DANR Secretary Hunter Roberts. "It is my honor to present the Secretary's Award for Drinking Water Excellence to the City of Deadwood who, through hard work and dedication, has achieved 20 consecutive years of Safe Drinking Water compliance." The system's operations specialists are Cory Percy, Randy Pfarr and Steven Henderson.

To qualify for the Secretary's Award for Drinking Water Excellence, public water systems and their system operations specialists had to meet all of the compliance monitoring and reporting requirements, drinking water standards, and certification requirements for ten consecutive years or more.

September 23: Preservation Thursday: T.J. Grier, A New Mine Superintendent for a New Century – The Homestake Mine started in 1876 as a small mining prospect claimed by the Manuel brothers using just a wheelbarrow, pick, and shovel. However, under the management of George Hearst and Samuel McMaster it would become a district-wide operation consisting of numerous shafts, multiple mills, blacksmith shops, a spider's web of wagon access roads, railroad connections, and logging operations. As superintendent Samuel McMaster's health declined, a young man would emerge to become one of the most prominent Homestake Mining Company superintendents. At the age of 34 years old and having been hired as a mere telegrapher and accountant only six years earlier, his age and limited mining experience would belie his real hidden managerial talents. David Vardiman will discuss how this young man would go on to lead the company for the next thirty years and take the Homestake Mine from its humble beginnings into the new twentieth century to become the world's largest and most successful gold mine. Rubble Site Rules

- Prior to entering the rubble site, all loads must be checked by site attendant and the proper fee paid.
- Items must be separated by plain wood, buryables, rubble,
- Buryables are furniture, shingles, mattresses, carpets, treated and/or painted lumber/wood.
- Tires, household garbage, plastics and older cathode ray tube (CRTs) televisions will be charged a fee.
- Tires **must** be removed from rims.
- Metal, electronics (other than CRTs) and trees/brush are free year-round.
- NO SALVAGE WILL BE ALLOWED.
- All vehicles will be required to stop at the attendant's building prior to leaving the site.

Sign Up for CodeRED

The City of Deadwood uses CodeRED, a high-speed mass notification system, to keep residents informed. The notification system delivers general and emergency messages to residents via phone, text message and email.

General messages are used to communicate non-life safety matters such as snow removal, community events, planned road closures, water main repairs, and power service interruptions. Emergency messages notify residents of emergencies such as an evacuation notice, utility outages, fire, floods, severe weather, or other emergency situations.

The Public Works Department utilizes CodeRED to notify residents of upcoming snow clearing to make sure all vehicles are removed from the road.


