# **Snow Removal Reminder**

Snow and ice permitted to gather upon the sidewalks of Deadwood is dangerous to the safety of its citizens and others using such sidewalks and is declared a public nuisance.

The record owner of any building or ground, within the city, fronting upon or adjoining a street where a sidewalk exists in front of or adjoining such premises shall clear or make arrangements to clear the sidewalk in front of or adjoining such buildings and ground to the width of the sidewalk within twenty-four (24) hours after snow or ice has fallen or formed. Where it is impossible to take the snow and ice from the sidewalk by reason of it being frozen to the sidewalk the record owner shall sprinkle or spread some suitable material upon the same to prevent the walk from becoming slippery and dangerous to travel.

If the record owner of any building or lot fails or neglects to remove snow and ice from the sidewalk adjoining the property within twenty-four (24) hours after the same has fallen or formed, or who deliberately or intentionally places snow or ice on a public street or right-of-way in such a way as to obstruct the normal flow of vehicular or pedestrian traffic, the city public works director or his or her designee may arrange for an independent contractor to remove the snow and ice. The city may also, at its discretion, remove the snow or ice if it deems such action appropriate. In either case, the city shall be entitled to a fifty-dollar (\$50.00) fee for the costs of arranging the removal plus the actual cost paid to the contractor or, in the event the removal is done by city employees, the sum of seventy-one dollars and fifty cents (\$71.50) plus material per hour for each employee. Such sums shall be recoverable by the same legal means as for the recovery of other nuisance abatements, including, but not limited to, direct billing of the property owner, assessment of the sum against the property itself, or by bringing an action against the property owner.

January 13: Preservation Thursday: Charles Windolph: Experiences with the US 7<sup>th</sup> Cavalry — Nineteen-year-old Charles Windolph immigrated to the United States in 1871 from the Lower Saxony region of northwestern Germany and enlisted in the 2<sup>nd</sup> US Infantry that same year. The following year, he began an eleven-year enlistment with the 7<sup>th</sup> US Cavalry, which included the 1873 Yellowstone Expedition, Custer's 1874 Black Hills Expedition, and the 1876 Battle of Little Bighorn. Windolph's actions at the Little Bighorn resulted in his being awarded the Medal of Honor and eventually the Purple Heart. His military unit also assisted with the removal of miners trespassing in the Black Hills as well as going to New Orleans to subdue the increasingly violent activities of the Ku Klux Klan. Windolph is interred at the Black Hills National Cemetery. The presentation is by South Dakota Humanities Council's Speakers Bureau Scholar Brad Tennant. # **Utility Rate Changes**

# The following utility rate changes will be effective January 1, 2022

The residential utility rate will increase by \$3.00 monthly plus applicable taxes.

**Water:** Residential minimum demand charge is \$24.85 monthly for all accounts, whether on or off, regardless of water usage; water usage charged as follows:

Water Usage	Water Rate	
0 - 4,999 gallons	\$2.10/1,000 gallons	
5,000 - 9,999 gallons	\$2.55/1,000 gallons	
10,000 - 19,999 gallons	\$3.20/1,000 gallons	
20,000 - 49,999 gallons	\$3.85/1,000 gallons	
50,000 and over gallons	\$5.00/1,000 gallons	

**Commercial accounts:** Monthly minimum (demand) charge for all accounts, whether on or off, based upon meter size, per meter, as follows:

(Rate increase due to demand charge increase to the City from the Sanitary District)

Meter Size	Cost
1 inch or less	\$51.60
1.5 inch	\$69.10
2 inch	\$103.65
3 inch	\$155.40
4 inch	\$207.20
6 inch	\$310.85

The new rate for trash/recycling collection is \$23.00 plus applicable taxes

# **Mandatory 10-Digit Dialing**

On July 16, 2020, the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) adopted an Order (FCC 20-100) approving 988 as the 3-digit abbreviated dialing code to reach the National Suicide Prevention Lifeline starting July 16, 2022. Customers must continue to dial 1-800-273-TALKS (8255) to reach the Lifeline until July 16, 2022.

The Order requires all telecommunications carriers, interconnected Voice over Internet Protocol (VoIP) providers, and one-way VoIP providers (covered providers) to make any network changes necessary to ensure that users can dial 988 to reach the existing National Suicide Prevention Lifeline by July 16, 2022. For 988 to work in the South Dakota 605 area code, 10-digit dialing must first be implemented.

To complete local calls, the new dialing procedure requires callers to dial the area code + telephone number. This means that all local calls in the entire 605 area code that are currently dialed with 7 digits will need to be dialed using the area code + telephone number.

Beginning October 24, 2021, you must dial 10 digits (area code + telephone number) for all local calls. On and after this date, local calls dialed with only 7 digits may not be completed, and a recording will inform you that your call cannot be completed as dialed. If you get this recording, you must hang up and dial again using the area code with the 7-digit telephone number.

In addition to changing your dialing patterns, all services, automatic dialing equipment, or other types of equipment that are programmed to complete local calls using only 7-digit numbers will need to be reprogrammed to complete calls to 10-digit numbers. Some examples are: life safety systems or medical monitoring devices, PBXs, fax machines, internet dial-up numbers, fire or burglar alarm and security systems or gates, speed dialers, mobile or other wireless phone contact lists, call forwarding settings, voice mails, and other similar functions.

Be sure to check your website, personal and business stationery, advertising materials, personal and business checks, contact information, your personal or pet ID tags, and other such items to ensure the area code is included.
