Trolley News

On January 14, 2022, the fee to ride the Deadwood trolley changed to \$2.00 per person per ride or one (1) trolley token per person per ride. Tokens are available for purchase for \$1.00 each at select stops around Deadwood including the Welcome Center (501 Main Street) and History and Information Center (3 Siever Street). Day passes are available for the trolley for \$5.00 per person and can be purchased at the Welcome Center or the History and Information Center.

The City of Deadwood leases their trolleys from Hometown Trolley in Crandon, WI and will be receiving five (5) new trolleys with three (3) arriving before the end of March. The remaining two (2) trolleys are scheduled to arrive by May 15, 2022. As denoted in the picture below, you will notice the new trolleys are red in color replacing the current green ones.

In addition to the new trolleys, there is a change coming to the trolley tokens. The City is currently working on a new design and color for the tokens with plans to have them available by the end of March. The green tokens in circulation will continue to be used as well.

Dead Storage Reminder

The City of Deadwood Community Service Officers (CSOs) want to remind the community about the importance of our dead storage ordinance. Vehicles left on public property (parking lot, street, or alley way) over 24 hours will be considered dead storage. A ticket will be issued and the vehicle towed at the owner's expense.

Vehicles includes abandoned, wrecked, dismantled, partially dismantled, inoperative, junk motor vehicles or parts, and unattached trailers.

The CSOs would like for the community to familiarize themselves with Deadwood City Ordinance Chapter 10.16 ABANDONED VEHICLES which is available on the City's website at www.cityofdeadwood.com.

RUBBLE SITE RULES

- Prior to entering the rubble site, all loads must be checked by site attendant and the proper fee paid.
- Items must be separated by plain wood, buryables, rubble, metal.
- Buryables are furniture, shingles, mattresses, carpets, treated and/or painted lumber/wood.
- Tires, household garbage, plastics and older cathode ray tube (CRTs) televisions will be charged a fee.
- Tires **must** be removed from rims.
- Metal and electronics (other than CRTs) are free year-round.
- **Only** pickup loads of trees/branches/bushes are free year round, no contractor loads are free at any time.
- **NO SALVAGE WILL BE ALLOWED.**
- All vehicles will be required to stop at the attendant's building prior to leaving the site.

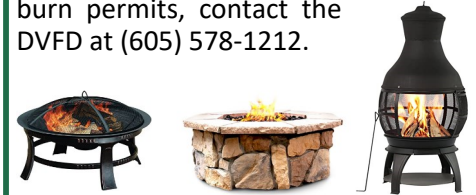
Enter a Float!

Burn Permits Required

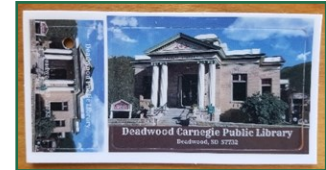
The Deadwood Volunteer Fire Department would like to remind residents burn permits are **REQUIRED** for outdoor fire pits and must be renewed each year.

Got CodeRED?



The City of Deadwood uses CodeRED, a high-speed mass notification system, to keep residents informed. The notification system delivers general and emergency messages to residents via phone, text message and email.

General messages are used to communicate non-life safety matters such as community events, planned road closures, power service interruptions and water main repairs. Emergency messages notify residents of emergencies such as an evacuation notice, utility outages, fire, floods, severe weather or other emergency situations.

The Public Works Department utilizes CodeRED during the winter to notify residents of upcoming snow clearing to make sure all vehicles are removed from the road.
