#### Historic Preservation Archives Intern

In March of 2022, Box Elder Job Corp student and graduate Shyne Addison began a two-month internship with the City of Deadwood Archives to fulfill her on-the-job training in office administration. Shyne is from Eagle Butte, South Dakota and has been at Job Corp since February of 2019. Her interests include hiking in the Black Hills and playing volleyball.

The City of Deadwood Archives internship program provides local high school and undergraduate students an opportunity to work in the field of archives and collections management. Prospective students receive a unique opportunity to work beside the Historic Preservation staff on a wide variety of projects as related to the preservation, protection, and interpretation of Deadwood's history.



As part of Shyne's internship, she has been digitizing the City's large collection of architectural plans spanning nearly four decades. These new digital born files help both city staff and business owners better manage the historical resources with the Deadwood city limits.

## **City Adopts 2021 International Property Maintenance Code**

In 2022, the City of Deadwood adopted the 2021 International Property Maintenance Code (IPMC) which establishes minimum requirements for the maintenance of existing buildings through model code regulations that contain clear and specific property maintenance and property improvement provisions.

Well, what does this mean?

To summarize, this code and its intent is to ensure public health, safety, and welfare for our property owners. Nuisances can be a big problem for communities that do not regulate these issues. They can be anything from tall grass and weeds, rodent harborage, and private property dead storage issues, just to name a few.

Speaking of dead storage, there has always been a misconception in Deadwood that dead storage vehicles could not be addressed on private property. Not so fast my friend. According to the IPMC Section 302 "Exterior Property Areas", 302.8 Motor Vehicles: Except as provided for in other regulations, inoperative or unlicensed motor vehicles shall not be parked, kept or stored on any premises, and vehicles shall not at any time be in a state of major disassembly, disrepair, or in the process of being stripped or dismantled. Painting of vehicles is prohibited unless conducted inside an approved spray booth. Exception: A vehicle of any type is permitted to undergo major overhaul, including body work, provided that such works is performed inside a structure or similarly enclosed area designed and approved for such purposes.
