Spring Cleanup Week

Deadwood's residential spring cleanup week is **May 9-14, 2022**. The Tri-City Rubble Site will have free dumping during this time.

If you are elderly or disabled and have large objects you are physically unable to move, please contact Deadwood Public Works at (605) 578-3082 to schedule removal.

Some items will not be accepted. Please call the Tri City Rubble Site at (605) 920-8957 for a complete list of accepted or not accepted items.

Rubble Site Hours of Operation:

Monday - Saturday 8:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m.

Rubble Site Rules:

- Prior to entering the rubble site, all loads must be checked by site attendant and the proper fee paid.
- Items must be separated by plain wood, buryables, rubble, metal.
- Buryables are furniture, shingles, mattresses, carpets, treated and/or painted lumber/wood.
- Tires, household garbage, plastics and older cathode ray tube (CRTs) televisions will be charged a fee.
- Tires MUST be removed from rims.
- Metal and electronics (other than CRTs) are free year round.
- **ONLY** pickup loads of trees/branches/bushes are free year round, <u>contractor loads are **NOT** free at any time</u>.
- NO SALVAGE WILL BE ALLOWED.
- All vehicles will be required to stop at the attendant's building prior to leaving the site.

Protecting Your Home From Wildfires

Take the time to perform some simple tasks to protect your home from the threat of a wildfire.

- Start by raking and removing dry leaves and pine needles from within three to five feet of your homes foundation.
- Make sure your roof and gutters are free from pine needles and leaves.
- Wood piles should be at least thirty feet away from your home and other outbuildings.
- Clear pine needles and leaves from your deck and porches.
- Move items stored under your porches and decks to a storage shed, basement or garage.
- Portable propane tanks and gas cans should be located away from your home. Never store these items indoors.
- Keep your yard mowed to a height of no more than four inches.

Yard Waste Dumpster

The yard waste dumpster is now available at Deadwood Public Works located at 67 Dunlop Avenue. Yard waste consists of grass clippings, hedge trimmings, leaves, and twigs. Branches and household garbage are not allowed in the dumpster.

Branches and larger pieces of wood need to be dropped off



in the designated area. Signs are posted to direct you to the proper drop off location.
