State Historic Preservation Office to Conduct Architectural Survey in Deadwood

The State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO) in conjunction with the City of Deadwood Historic Preservation Office will be updating the 1993 Deadwood Architectural and Historical Survey of Structures within the Deadwood National Historic Landmark District. This survey is used quite often in determining the history of a structure focusing on contributing and non-contributing status. In 2008, the Commission conducted a photographic update of these resources. With an updated inventory, we would see some of the projects we've supported, through our grant and loan programs, change from a non-contributing to a contributing structure.

SHPO has contracted with Kadermas, Lee and Jackson (KLJ) to conduct this survey. They plan to start the surveys sometime in June of 2022. During this survey process you will see staff members of KLJ taking pictures and reviewing your properties. The surveyors will stay in the right-of-way and will only go on private property if invited by the owner. This process will take a couple months. June 10: History on the Lawn: John S. McClintock: From Pioneer Days to Deadwood Historian – Like so many, John S. McClintock arrived in Deadwood in 1876, ready to strike it rich. Unlike many who struck it rich or struck out, McClintock stayed in Deadwood, going on to become a well-known citizen of the new town, starting businesses, a family, a stagecoach line, and more. In 1939, he published *Pioneer Days in the Black Hills: Accurate History and Facts Related by One of the Early Day Pioneers*.
