Small Postcard with a Big History

In March of 2022, the Deadwood Historic Preservation Commission acquired a 4 x 6 inch photographic postcard titled, "Greetings from Deadwood, S. Dak." published by Fishel & Co. once located at 663 Main Street in the Syndicate Block (today's location of the Holiday Inn Express). Jewish brothers Adolph and Louis Fishel, the proprietors of Fishel's Bazar, operated a stationary shop for over twenty years from this location. The image, taken after 1906 from McGovern Hill, captures Deadwood's upper downtown district. What made this postcard unique are the Chinese characters written along the right-side margin.

Upon receiving the postcard, city staff enlisted the help of the Genesee Valley Daoist Hermitage in Genesee Valley, Idaho to translate the characters. On several occasions, the Hermitage helped the Historic Preservation Office with other translation projects including the personal letters from Deadwood Chinese merchant Fee Lee Wong, and the opium pipe bowls and opium metal lids unearthed during the Chinatown archaeological investigation in the early 2000s.

Based on the transcription, Historic Preservation staff learned that the mailer was a man who lived in small village near Guangzhou (Canton) in the Quandong Province in China. The salutations in English are much more informal than the meaning conveyed by the Chinese characters. The mailer used a very formal choice of words that would be used if he was addressing someone with a much higher position. And true to form, he wrote his Chinese place name on the card before signing it. Unfortunately his handwriting did not allow to translate his personal name. This postcard is one of a few items within our historic collections that contain Chinese characters.

He fought Demon Rum, vice, and the official corruption that allowed them to rule as the crusading editor of the *Deadwood Daily Telegram*. Senn made many enemies, but also passionate supporters. His fight against legal and illegal alcohol in Deadwood led to his appointment as the federal Director of Prohibition in South Dakota. The question of the time was whether Demon Rum or E.L. Senn would win. Presented by Dr. Charles Vollan, South Dakota State University associate professor of history. The Planning and Zoning Department would like to remind Deadwood residents on the City's current ordinance in regards Short Term Rentals. 17.53 TRANSIENT COMMERCIAL USE OF RESIDENTIAL PROPERTY—PROHIBITED prohibits the operation of short term rentals in residential zoning districts.

The City of Deadwood is aggressively taking measures to gain compliance. If you are operating a short term rental, please follow up with the Planning & Zoning Department to ensure that you are operating within the ordinance.
