August 19: History on the Lawn: *Sitting Bull and the Events Leading to the Battle of the Little Big Horn* – In 1874 Lieutenant Colonel George Armstrong Custer led an expedition into the Black Hills where his prospectors discovered gold in French Creek, setting off a stampede to the Black Hills and leading to violent confrontations with the Lakota and other tribes. But before that happened there had been constant warfare with those tribes which had not signed the 1868 Fort Laramie Treaty. Sitting Bull was one of those leaders. When railroad survey teams passed through their hunting grounds in Dakota and Montana Territories, Sitting Bull and others fought to expel them. One of the military leaders assigned to protect the railroad surveyors was Custer. What happened during those clashes? What was Sitting Bull doing as prospectors invaded the Black Hills? What were Sitting Bull's actions leading up to and during the Battle of the Little Big Horn? Join Bill Markley, South Dakota Humanities Council Speakers' Bureau Scholar, author, and historian, as he discusses these questions and similar topics. Bring a lunch and enjoy the Historic Adams House lawn; 12:00 p.m.; free event. In case of inclement weather, the lecture will be moved to the Homestake Adams Research and Cultural Center (HARCC).

Hwy 14A Road Construction

On July 5, 2022, a contractor for the SD Department of Transportation began performing bridge deck repairs on Hwy 14A from Pine Street to the north. The work started on the east side driving lane headed to the north and will continue across the bridge as each lane is completed.

Work will be performed Monday-Friday from 7:00am to 6:00pm. Traffic control will be removed from the roadway by 5:00pm on Fridays so the highway is open on the weekends. The contractor is planning to not work on this project from July 23, 2022 to August 15, 2022 and also August 24th-28th, 2022. Completion date is November 4, 2022.

Deadwood Outdoor Warning System

The intent of the outdoor warning system is to warn the public of a life threatening danger that is imminent. It is not meant to be used as a sole warning device but to alert the public to seek more information through the National Weather Service (NWS), your local radio and television reports, or weather radios.

Deadwood warning sirens are located in the Event Complex and on top of McGovern Hill with the objective of warning citizens and visitors of life threatening emergencies while they are outside. If the sirens sound, you should turn to the local tv or radio for weather service or life threatening announcements.

Siren tests will be conducted on Wednesdays between 11:30 a.m. and 12:30 p.m. with an activation consisting of less than two (2) minutes.
