DANR Recognizes City of Deadwood for Drinking Water Compliance

On July 22, 2022, the South Dakota Department of Agriculture and Natural Resources (DANR) announced the City of Deadwood public water system and the system’s operations specialists have been awarded a Secretary’s Award for Drinking Water Excellence.

“Consistent success is a true measure of excellence,” said DANR Secretary Hunter Roberts. “With more than 21 years of consecutive compliance, the City of Deadwood has demonstrated its commitment to providing its customers with safe and reliable drinking water.” The system’s operations specialists are Cory Percy, Randy Pfarr, Scott Reif and Steven Henderson.

To qualify for the Secretary’s Award for Drinking Water Excellence, public water systems and their system operations specialists had to meet all of the compliance monitoring and reporting requirements, drinking water standards, and certification requirements for ten consecutive years or more.

Four Points Archaeological Update

In August of 2022, city archival staff began organizing the 40,000 objects unearthed during the 2019-2020 archaeological exploration at the Four Points Hotel along lower Main Street. Interesting to note, this assemblage is the last undisturbed archaeological assemblage in what was Deadwood’s Chinatown District.



In the ensuing fall and winter months, city staff will systematically arrange, identify and cull out significant and diagnostic objects and if needed, provide simple conservation treatments to specific artifacts. Based on a preliminary assessment of this collection, objects will be classified into twelve different groups including smoking paraphernalia, coins/currency, ammunition, ceramics, horse/tack and bone. At the completion of this project, the Historic Preservation Office will be able to conduct additional, in-depth research on specific objects and repackage fragile, one-of-a-kind items within the collection.





September 1: Preservation Thursday: *Picturing Sacred Ground: Lakota Maps of the Black Hills, 1874 to 1946* – Beginning with the 1874 Black Hills expedition, Lakota people began producing maps on paper which included the Black Hills. Known maps include those of Red Horse, Big Turkey, Amos Bad Heart Bull, and an unknown cartographer referred to as Dragonfly. These maps name places important to the Lakota people and reflect Lakota history and beliefs. The Dragonfly map, housed at the Homestake Adams Research and Cultural Center, details many Lakota connections to the Black Hills, including origin narratives and historic events. The lecture will be presented by Linea Sundstrom, owner of Day Star Research in Milwaukee, Wisconsin. RUBBLE SITE RULES

- Prior to entering the rubble site, all loads must be checked by site attendant and the proper fee paid.
- Items must be separated by plain wood, buryables, rubble, metal.
- Buryables are furniture, shingles, mattresses, carpets, treated and/or painted lumber/wood.
- Tires, household garbage, plastics and older cathode ray tube (CRTs) televisions will be charged a fee.
- Tires **must** be removed from rims.
- Metal, electronics (other than CRTs) are free year round.
- **Only** pickup loads of trees/branches/bushes are free year round, no contractor loads are free at any time.
- **NO SALVAGE WILL BE ALLOWED.**
- All vehicles will be required to stop at the attendant’s building prior to leaving the site.

Feeding the Deer

The City finds that the baiting of deer by placing unnatural food sources upon any real property within the city for the purpose of attracting deer to eat such unnatural food source has the effect of enticing deer from their natural habitat into an unnatural urban environment, thereby endangering the deer, resulting in an unnatural growth of the deer population, resulting in an unnatural loss of the deer's instinctive avoidance of humans, resulting in reliance by deer upon such unnatural food source, and also endangering persons and domestic animals, and resulting in damage to property. (Reference *Deer Baiting Ordinance 6.12*)



Broadway Parking Ramp

The City of Deadwood continues to receive complaints due to drivers speeding excessively through the Broadway Parking Ramp. As a reminder for our residents and visitors alike, the speed limit in the ramp is 5 MPH.



Chief Mertens would like to remind everyone that, if necessary, speeding tickets will be issued which could result in the permanent loss of your parking permit.

Time to Sign Up for CodeRED

The City of Deadwood uses CodeRED, a high-speed mass notification system, to keep residents informed. The notification system delivers general and emergency messages to residents via phone, text message and email.

General messages are used to communicate non-life safety matters such as community events, planned road closures, power service interruptions, and water main repairs. Emergency messages notify residents of emergencies such as an evacuation notice, utility outages, fire, floods, severe weather or other emergency situations.

The Public Works Department uses CodeRED during the winter to notify residents of upcoming snow clearing to make sure all vehicles are removed from the road.
