# Water Billing to be Adjusted in January 2023

The City of Deadwood's Finance Department, along with the Water Department, are adjusting the billing cycle at the beginning of the new year to assist with better tracking and reporting of water usage.

Customers will be billed on the  $7^{th}$  of each month, covering usage from the  $1^{st}-31^{st}$  of the previous month. Please note, future bills will arrive in your mailbox one week later than normal. The new due date for your water bill will be the  $27^{th}$  of each month. If you are set up on automatic bank draft, your payment will still process on the  $15^{th}$  of each month. No action is needed by you.

This change will take effect in January 2023. Residents will have one-month base rate in this billing cycle but will see water usage for the 45 days. Most residents will not see a drastic change in the bill for this month, while some will see a one-time increase due to the additional 15 days of water usage.

This coordinated effort will assist in monitoring the water consumption within the city

and assist the water department in identifying patterns that can quickly indicate leaks or water loss. The change in the water meter reading billing to the end of the month will allow the department to more efficiently examine all aspects of the water — wastewater system in the community.

## **Snow Removal Policies & Ordinance Reminders**

In light of the recent snowstorm, we are writing today to remind businesses and residents of the snow removal policies and ordinances in the City of Deadwood.

Per the Deadwood City Ordinance 12.20, residents and businesses must remove snow and ice from their sidewalks within 24 hours after snow has fallen or ice has formed. If the sidewalks have not been cleared in that time, then the city may pose a fine to remove the snow and ice. Additionally, snow that is pushed onto city streets in such a way that would block any traffic is classified as a misdemeanor. Also, per SDCL: 31-32-3.1, it is illegal to deposit large amounts of snow on the highway right -of-way (including driving surfaces, shoulders, and ditches).

Knowing all of this, the City of Deadwood asks you are prepared with private contractors for snow removal to ensure the safety of employees, residents, and our numerous visitors. Please do not push snow onto the street. We ask that you do not block right of ways, trolley stops, sidewalks, crosswalks, or fire hydrants. For the safety of all who are using your business, please make sure to clear the snow as soon as possible, including during snowfall, to prevent any accidents. The City of Deadwood charges \$71.50 per hour, per city employee to remove snow from your sidewalks and snow moved onto a public street after we have begun our snow removal efforts. If you need assistance in finding a contractor to perform your snow removal, reach out to the City of Deadwood. We are developing a list of these companies who conduct snow removal.

Again, we ask for your cooperation and please plan accordingly for your snow removal. Thank you very much for your cooperation, and if you have any questions about these policies and ordinances, please contact City of Deadwood Parking & Transportation Department at 605-578-2082.



## **Change in Meeting Times**




Effective January 1, 2023, the Planning and Zoning Commission and Historic Preservation Commission meetings will meet at 4:00 p.m.




