City Archives Moment

Last month, the Historic Preservation staff, student interns, and volunteers continued sorting/classifying the FourPoints archaeological assemblage unearthed in 2019-2020. Between 200 to 250 centimeters (8.2 feet) beneath Deadwood's Main Street, archaeologists unearthed a rich cultural layer consisting of numerous Chinese ceramics and porcelain deposited before the May 1883 flood.

Within this layer, came this porcelain (bamboo pattern) soup/rice bowl and porcelain box (possible Double Happiness pattern). After reviewing the field notes and consulting with the historic fire insurance maps, these items were associated with a series of four one story wood structures that were labeled "Chinese dwelling and gambling houses".

Grass and Weeds

The City of Deadwood Parks Department would like to make residents aware that failure to keep weeds and grass cut will cause the city to cut the weeds and grass resulting in the assessment of the costs against the property.

Below are the applicable ordinances for your review.

8.20.020 Duty Of Owner, Occupant Or Person In Charge

It is the duty of the owner, occupant, or person in charge of any lot in the city to keep such lot free from weeds as defined herein or to cut such weeds at such times as may be necessary to prevent their growth. Weeds and grass left uncut cause an unsightly appearance, create a fire hazard, and offer an environment conducive to rodents and small animals.

8.20.030 Notice To Cut Weeds

- A. The parks supervisor may, at the beginning of or during the growing season, by public notice, require all weeds and tall grass on such lot to be cut and removed within five days after the giving of such notice. Such notice need not be given personally, but may be given generally by one publication in the official newspaper.
- **B.** Such notice shall provide that each owner, occupant or person in charge of any lot within the city shall cut and remove all noxious weeds, and keep grass and other weeds cut as to prevent aforementioned problems from occurring. Failure to keep such weeds and grass cut will cause the same to be cut and assess the costs thereof against the property benefitted. One such notice shall be sufficient for each growing season.

Deadwood History Inc. Events

June 6, 13, 20, and 27: Family Fun Tuesdays – Deadwood History, Inc. (DHI) hosts a family friendly event on Tuesday afternoons during the summer. On June 6 and 13, we explore Deadwood's history – everything from the legends of Deadwood to a 90 million year-old plesiosaur from the Adams Museum. DHI will feature Hidden in the Midden on June 20 and 27. Learn what an archaeologist does and dig through a midden (an old garbage pile) to unearth a variety of artifacts that will help solve puzzling questions. Deadwood Outlaw Square; 3:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m.; these events are free.

June 7: The Summer of 1876: Outlaws, Lawmen, and Legends in the Season That Defined the American West – The summer of 1876 was a key time period in the development of the mythology of the Old West. Many individuals who were considered legends by modern readers were involved in events that began their notoriety or turned out to be the most famous – or infamous - moments of their lives. Chris Wimmer, creator of Legends of the Old West podcast, weaves together the timelines of the events that made men legends. The Summer of 1876 is his first book. Para Transit System for Deadwood Residents

The City of Deadwood offers the para transit system to Deadwood residents for medical appointments as well as other transportation services for those who need assistance within the community. The service is available Monday thru Friday from 7:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. There is no fee for residents 60 and older for trips around Deadwood and to Lead. Residents under 60 will be charged a fee per trip.

To schedule a pickup or for more information, please call the Trolley Manager at (605) 578-2622. All rides need to be scheduled 24 hours in advance. We do offer medical related rides to Spearfish, Sturgis, and Fort Meade. We also offer medical rides to Rapid City; these appointments are preferred between 10:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. All residents will be charged a fee per trip for this service.
