Deadwood Police Department forms Honor Guard

On Thursday, July 27, 2023, the newly formed Deadwood Honor Guard made its inaugural public appearance presenting the nation's colors during the National Anthem at the Days of '76 rodeo. The formation of the Honor Guard was developed by Sgt. Erik Jandt and created in 2022. With the support of Northern Hills Fraternal Order of Police, Deadwood V.F.W. and additional donors, it became a reality.

The Deadwood Honor Guard is an auxiliary unit within the Deadwood Police Department. Jandt stated the reason for creating the Honor Guard is to exhibit professionalism and honor both current military personnel & Veterans who reside in the community, as well as those who are currently employed by the DPD. Ultimately, the Honor Guard not only recognizes the department & its current officers, but also all those who have made sacrifices for the community and the country.

Though the formation of an Honor Guard has been discussed through the years, it took Jandt approximately 13 months to create the Honor Guard from the ground up. This included choosing the right uniform with a custom-made braid and colors. "It's something I'm deeply proud of", Sgt. Jandt said. Members of Deadwood Police Department's first Honor Guard include Sergeant Erik Jandt, Sergeant Sally Sprigler, Officer Devon Schumacher, Officer Jenny Rea, and Reserve Officer Wylie Walno.

Busy Summer for City Archives

The City Archives had a productive summer this year through the help of student interns, a Deadwood Police Department officer, and its volunteers. Under the guidance of the Deadwood Historic Preservation office, these individuals assisted in the organization, classification, and digitization of several City's historic and municipal collections.

In April & May, two students from the Box Elder Job Corp and one returning college student helped re-inventory portions of the FourPoints archaeological collection, scanned historic oversized maps and architectural plans, digitized survey notebooks from Deadwood surveyor Frank S. MONDAY thru SATURDAY 8:00 AM - 4:00 PM

FREE DUMP WEEKENDS & SPRING CLEAN-UP WEEK ARE FOR RESIDENTIAL USE ONLY. CONTRACTORS & COMMERCIAL PLATES WILL BE CHARGED STANDARD RATES RUBBLE SITE RULES

- All loads must be checked by site attendant and fee paid before entering the rubble site.
- Items must be separated by plain wood, buryables, rubble, and metal.
- Buryables are furniture, shingles, mattresses, carpets, treated and/or painted lumber/wood.
- No household garbage, paper or liquids
- Tires, plastics and older cathode ray tube (CRTs) televisions will be charged a fee.
- Tires **must** be removed from rims.
- Metal and electronics (other than CRTs) are free year-round (separate dumpster).
- NO SALVAGE WILL BE ALLOWED.
- All vehicles will be required to stop at the attendant's building prior to leaving the site.

Archives (Cont. pg 1) City Archives also received help from a city staff member assigned to light duty who digitized multiple volumes of specification books in the Archives library and organized a collection from the Black Hills Mercantile. Two volunteers assisted City Staff every Tuesday & Thursday with the FourPoints collection.

One highlight of the summer was the donation of 11,000 objects unearthed during the 2004 Mineral Palace expansion. These objects, including a relic condition revolver (pg. 1) are associated with Al Swearengin's Gem Theater, one of Deadwood's infamous dancehalls.
