McClintock Collection Acquired By City Archives

In 2011, Karen Wickstrom-Blunk of Chapel Hill, North Carolina donated a wonderful collection of archival materials to the Deadwood Historic Preservation office. This assemblage chronicled the life of the Johnson family who once lived at the intersection of Maitland Road and US Highway 14A.

Consisting of 256 items, this assemblage provides a glimpse into the fraternal, scholastic, athletic, and civil organizations that the Johnson family participated in during the first half of the 20th century. Highlights of the assemblage include a 1908-1909 Gold Belt Cities directory, 1925 Deadwood High School yearbook, 1928 Deadwood High School newsletter, "The Comment", 1939-1940 Deadwood High School State Basketball "Class "B" Champion program, a large assortment of Deadwood advertisement pencils, circa 1920s-1940s, and 122 photographs, cabinet cards, stereoviews, and photographic postcards of Deadwood and the belt cities. On several occasions, the photographs in this assemblage were used in the annual Neighborhood Block Club Community Calendars.

A Sad Mistake.



Utility Rate Changes

The following utility rate changes became effective January 1, 2025.

Water: Residential (City Limits) minimum demand charge\$28.40 Monthly **Residential** (Non-City Limits) minimum demand charge\$48.40 Monthly for all accounts, whether on or off regardless of water usage; water usage charged as follows:

0 - 4,999 gallons	\$2.10/1,000 gallons

Oak Mountain Country Estates minimum demand charge (non-potable) \$28.40 Monthly for all accounts, whether on or off: regardless of water usage; water usage charge as follows:

Wastewater:

Garbage/Recycling Service:

Residential and small commercial accounts (defined as in-home apartments on the same site as the primary residential account): will be charged at the current contract rate that the city must pay to a private contractor, which excludes service and applicable tax per month for all accounts, whether on or off \$25.00 Commercial accounts: Responsible for own garbage removal.
