Donation of Vince Coyle/Bill Walsh Collection

The images shown below are from the Vince Coyle/Bill Walsh Collection. Vince Coyle was connected to the newspaper and promoting gaming in Deadwood. There are over 400 color prints, taken during the years 1990 to 2005, capturing numerous Deadwood events; Chinese New year, Mardi Gras, St. Patrick's Celebrations, and more. He was the spokesman for the Deadwood Chamber of Commerce and Four Aces Gaming.

The first image is of the Singing Nuns that preformed at Bill Walsh's Callahan's Bar in the Franklin Hotel. Next is the Scottish Bag Pipe and Drums Corps performing during the St. Patrick's Day parade on Main Street. This has been a long standing tradition with Deadwood's St. Patrick's Day celebration. Lastly is Vince Coyle and Bill Walsh, posing in Front of Bill's house, on the corner of Lincoln and Jackson Streets. Both men lived less than a block away and were great friends. Bill Walsh donated this amazing collection after the passing of Vince in June of 2014.

As a whole, this collection is a wonderful addition which chronicles via photographs many of Deadwood's events.
